No. 200 AN ACT

Amending the act of May twenty-eight, one thousand nine hundred thirteen (Pamphlet Laws 367), entitled "An act authorizing the council of cities of the second class to fix the salary of the heads of departments of said cities, and providing the maximum thereof," removing the limitation on the maximum salary which may be paid to directors or heads of departments in cities of the second class.

Cities of the second class.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1, act of May 28, 1913, P. L. 367, amended April 1, 1931, P. L. 13, further amended. Section 1. Section one, act of May twenty-eight, one thousand nine hundred thirteen (Pamphlet Laws 367), entitled "An act authorizing the council of cities of the second class to fix the salary of the heads of departments of said cities, and providing the maximum thereof," amended April one, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one (Pamphlet Laws 13), is amended to read:

Council to fix salaries.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the salaries of the director or head of each department of cities of the second class of this Commonwealth shall be fixed by the council of said cities [, in a sum not to exceed twelve thousand (\$12,000) dollars per annum].

No. 201 AN ACT

Authorizing the Department of Property and Supplies, with the approval of the Governor, to accept a tract of land and buildings thereon erected in the Borough of California, Washington County, Pennsylvania, containing 25.609 acres, for the use of the California State Teachers' College.

Real Property.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Department of Property and Supplies authorized to accept a gift of certain land with the approval of the Governor. Section 1. The Department of Property and Supplies, with the approval of the Governor, is hereby authorized to accept from the Students Activities Association Inc., as a gift in the name of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for use of the California State Teachers' College, a tract of land with buildings thereon in the Borough of California, Washington County, Pennsylvania, bounded and described as follows:

Description.

Beginning at an iron pin at the eastern side of a public road; thence along land now or formerly of the Ruth Jane Elliott Estate south 62 degrees 32 minutes
