AN ACT

Fixing the salary of the clerk of the court of over and terminer, quarter sessions of the peace, and of the municipal court, and the first and second deputies in Philadelphia, and repealing certain legislation.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Annual salary of court of over and terminer, and quarter sessions of the peace, and of the municipal court.

Annual salary of first deputy.

Annual salary of second deputy.

Repeal.

Section 1. The annual salary of the clerk of the court of oyer and terminer, and quarter sessions of the peace, and of the municipal court, shall be at the rate of fifteen (\$15,000) thousand dollars.

The annual salary of the first deputy shall be at the rate of eleven thousand dollars (\$11,000). The annual salary of the second deputy shall be at the rate of nine thousand dollars (\$9,000).

Section 2. The following acts are repealed in so far as they relate to the annual salary to be paid to the clerk of the court of over and terminer, and quarter sessions of the peace, and of the municipal court, and the first and second deputies in Philadelphia:

The act of May thirteen, one thousand nine hundred twenty-seven (Pamphlet Laws 982), entitled "An act relating to the clerk of the court of oyer and terminer, and quarter sessions of the peace, and municipal court, of any county of this Commonwealth, having a population of one million five hundred thousand or over; providing for the salaries and compensation of the clerk of the court of oyer and terminer, and quarter sessions of the peace, and municipal court, deputies, clerks, and employes thereof." The act of June twenty-one, one thousand nine hundred forty-seven (Pamphlet Laws 849), entitled "An act increasing the salaries of certain elected officers whose salaries are payable out of the treasury of cities of the first class."

Act effective January 2, 1956.

Section 3. This act shall take effect January two, one thousand nine hundred fifty-six.
