AN ACT

To amend the act approved the nineteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred fifty-one (1951-1952 Pamphlet Laws 28), entitled "An act relating to the civil defense of this State and its coordination with national defense; providing for the establishment of a State Council of Civil Defense, local and district councils of civil defense, Mobile Support Units; prescribing the powers, duties and immunities thereof and of their personnel; authorizing mutual aid compacts, and providing penalties," by authorizing the State Council of Civil Defense to make rules and regulations.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

State Council of Civil Defense Act of 1951.

Section 1. Section four of the act, approved the nineteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred fifty-one (1951-1952 Pamphlet Laws 28), entitled "An act relating to the civil defense of this State and its coordination with national defense; providing for the establishment of a State Council of Civil Defense, local and district councils of civil defense, Mobile Support Units; prescribing the powers, duties and immunities thereof and of their personnel; authorizing mutual aid compacts, and providing penalties," as last amended by the act approved the third day of September, one thousand nine hundred fifty-five (Pamphlet Laws 553) (Act No. 135), is hereby amended by adding, at the end thereof, a new subsection to read as follows:

Section 4. act of March 19, 1951, P. L. 28, last amended by act of September 3, 1955, P. L. 553, Act No. 135, further amended by adding a new subsection (n).

Section 4. Powers and Duties.—The Council shall have the following powers and duties:

* * * * *

(n) To promulgate, adopt and enforce such rules, regulations and orders relating to the protection of life and property and to the maintenance of health and safety as may be deemed necessary to carry out the provisions of this act. The State Council of Civil Defense shall cause such rules, regulations and orders to be published and disseminated in the Commonwealth in such manner and to such extent as it shall deem necessary and advisable.
