They may make contracts and expenditures for the cleansing, maintaining, regulation, improvement and control of such waters and drainage systems and for the prevention and control of floods by storage or retaining reservoirs, or otherwise. in parts of such waters beyond the limits of the county or of the Commonwealth, when, in their judgment, such expenditures may be necessary and for the benefit of the county.

AN ACT

Amending the act of July twenty-eight, one thousand nine hundred fifty-three (Pamphlet Laws 723), entitled "An act relating to counties of the second class; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," giving the board of commissioners additional powers with respect to the acquisition of real property and water drainage systems.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Subsection (a) of section two thousand Subsection (a), one hundred forty-seven, act of July twenty-eight, one thousand nine hundred fifty-three (Pamphlet Laws 723). known as the "Second Class County Code," is amended to read:

Section 2147. Prevention and Control of Floods.— (a) The board of commissioners may borrow, appropriate and expend money, and may acquire by purchase or dedication real property, or any interest therein, for the purpose of cleansing, regulating, improving and controlling rivers, streams and other bodies of water

AN ACT

Amending the act of October twenty-seven, one thousand nine hundred fifty-five (Pamphlet Laws 744, Act No. 222), entitled "An act prohibiting certain practices of discrimination because of race, color, religious creed, ancestry, age or national origin by employers, employment agencies, labor organizations and others as herein defined; creating the Pennsylvania Fair Employment Practice Commission in the Department of Labor and Industry; defining its functions, powers and duties; providing for procedure and enforcement; providing for formulation of an educational program to prevent prejudice; providing for judicial review and enforcement; and imposing penalties," providing that termination of employment or the operation of provisions having the effect of a minimum service requirement under a bona fide retirement insurance or pension plan shall not constitute an unfair employment practice, changing certain restrictions relative to age, and requiring that attorneys appointed by the commission be approved by the Attorney General.
