AN ACT

Amending the act of June twenty-three, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one (Pamphlet Laws 932), entitled "An act relating to cities of the third class; and amending, revising, and consolidating the law relating thereto," further fixing qualifications of members of the board of health.

The Third Class City Code.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section two thousand three hundred two, act of June twenty-three, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one (Pamphlet Laws 932), known as "The Third Class City Code," reenacted and amended June twentyeight, one thousand nine hundred fifty-one (Pamphlet Laws 662), is amended to read:

Section 2302. Qualifications; Term; Removal.-The members of the board of health shall be residents of the city, [and at] except in the case of physicians who shall have their main office in the city. At least two shall be reputable physicians of not less than two years' experience in the practice of their profession. Upon the creation of the board, council shall designate for one appointee a term of one year, for another a term of two years, and so on up to five; thereafter, one member of the board shall be appointed annually to serve for a term of five years from the first Monday of April succeeding his appointment. Council may remove members of the board for official misconduct or neglect of duty. All vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term.
