AN ACT

Authorizing the Department of Property and Supplies, with the approval of the Governor, to acquire sixty-two acres, more or less, of land in the City of Lock Haven for the use of the Lock Haven State Teachers College, and making an appropriation.

Real property.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Department of Property and Supplies, with approval of the Governor, authorized to purchase certain land in Lock Haven, Clinton County.

Section 1. The Department of Property and Supplies, with the approval of the Governor, is hereby authorized to purchase in the name of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, for use of the Lock Haven State Teachers College, a tract of land in the city of Lock Haven, County of Clinton, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, bounded and described as follows:

Description.

Bounded on the north by the Old Lusk Road, the new Lusk Run Road and St. Marys Catholic Cemetery; on the east by lands of St. Marys Catholic Cemetery, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the Beth Yuda Cemetery, on the south by lands now or formerly of the E. Carlson Estate and a public road; and on the west by lands now or formerly of the Adam Gardner Warrant, containing sixty-two acres, more or less.

Being the first parcel of land conveyed to David W. Thomas by Horace F. Hanna and M. Loretta Hanna, by deed, dated May 31, 1933, and recorded in Clinton County, Pennsylvania, in Deed Book 120, at page 716.

Title to be approved by Department of Justice.

Section 2. The land shall not be acquired until its title has been approved by the Department of Justice.

Appropriation.

Section 3. The sum of eight thousand six hundred dollars (\$8,600), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Department of Property and Supplies for the payment of the purchase price of said tract of land and the expenses incidental thereto, including the completion of an abstract of title.

Act effective immediately.

Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
