AN ACT

Amending the act of May 22, 1935 (P. L. 233), entitled "An act creating and establishing a fund for the care, maintenance, and relief of aged, retired and disabled employees of the Bureau of Police in cities of the second class; providing a pension fund for said employees; and providing for the payment of certain dues, fees, assessments, fines, and appropriations thereto; regulating membership therein; creating a board for the management thereof; providing the amount, mode, and manner of payment to beneficiaries thereof, and for the care and disposition of said fund; providing for the payment into this fund by cities of the second class of all monies heretofore payable into any other funds, organizations, corporations, or associations having the same or similar purposes, and of such additional monies as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this act," changing the amount of payments to certain beneficiaries.

Cities of the second class.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 13.1, act of May 22, 1935, P. L. 233, added February 1, 1956, P. L. 979, further amended.

Section 13.1, act of May 22, 1935 (P. L. Section 13.1. Beneficiaries under the fund retired prior to January one, one thousand nine hundred fiftysix, shall be entitled to receive from the fund per month the amounts indicated in the following table:

The pensions for members retired prior to January one, one thousand nine hundred fifty-six, who held positions not included in the above table, shall be rated, classified, and determined by the board of managers, in amounts proportionate to the pensions listed in the above table.

No pension shall be granted or paid to any member, pursuant to this section, based on the rank or position which he holds at the time of making application for pension, unless he has held such rank or position for a period of one (1) year prior to the date of making such application.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
