repair equipment for the lighting of existing or new highways, or any part thereof, and may contract for the lighting of such equipment at the expense of the Commonwealth.

AN ACT

Amending the act of December 5, 1936 (1937 P. L. 2897), entitled "An act establishing a system of unemployment compensation to be administered by the Department of Labor and Industry and its existing and newly created agencies with personnel (with certain exceptions) selected on a civil service basis; requiring employers to keep records and make reports, and certain employers to pay contributions based on payrolls to provide moneys for the payment of compensation to certain unemployed persons; providing procedure and administrative details for the determination, payment and collection of such contributions and the payment of such compensation; providing for cooperation with the Federal Government and its agencies: creating certain special funds in the custody of the State Treasurer; and prescribing penalties," requiring the Auditor General to audit the Unemployment Compensation Fund, the Administration Fund, and the Special Administration Fund.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

The act of December 5, 1936 (1937 P. L. Section 1. 2897), known as the "Unemployment Compensation Law," is amended by adding, after section 602, a new section to read:

Section 602-A. Audit of Funds. The accounts and books of the Unemployment Compensation Fund, the Special Administration Fund, and the Administration Fund, including their receipts, disbursements and other items referring to their financial standing, shall, from time to time, be examined by the Auditor General who shall report the results of his examination to the Governor.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately. APPROVED—The 31st day of May, A. D. 1957.
