Route 66210. Beginning at the intersection of Township Route 498 with Legislative Route 66051; thence along Township Route 498 in a northeasterly direction to Legislative Route 66094, a distance of about 2.4 miles, in North Codorus and West Manchester Townships, York County.

Section 3. The highways established as State highways under the provisions of this act may be taken over for construction and maintenance at any time subsequent to the final enactment of this act, when the same shall become effective, and shall be taken over not later than January 1, 1958.

AN ACT

Amending the act of January 21, 1947 (P. L. 3), entitled "An act relating to officers and employes of the General Assembly; fixing the number, qualifications, compensation, mileage and duties of the officers and employes of the Senate and of the House of Representatives; providing for their election or appointment, term of office, or of service, removal, and manner of filling vacancies; and making appropriations to the Senate, House of Representatives and Legislative Reference Bureau," changing the compensation of certain officers and employes.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

General Assembly.

Section 1. Section 1 and clauses (1) and (2) of section 21, act of January 21, 1947 (P. L. 3), entitled "An act relating to officers and employes of the General Assembly; fixing the number, qualifications, compensation, mileage and duties of the officers and employes of the Senate and of the House of Representatives; providing for their election or appointment, term of office, or of service, removal, and manner of filling vacancies; and making appropriations to the Senate, House of Representatives and Legislative Reference Bureau," amended August 21, 1953 (P. L. 1262), are amended to read:

Section 1, and clauses (1) and (2), section 21, act of January 21, 1947, P. L. 3, amended August 21, 1953, P. L. 1262, further amended.

Section 1. The Senate shall, immediately upon the final enactment of this act, and in each odd-numbered year thereafter, at the beginning of each regular bi-

ennial session of the General Assembly, elect, in addition to the President and President pro tempore as provided for by the Constitution, the following officers who shall serve for two years or until their successors are elected and have qualified, unless sooner removed by a majority vote of all of the members of the Senate during any regular biennial, special or extraordinary session of the General Assembly, and who shall receive the compensation and perform the duties herein specified:

(1) One Secretary at an annual salary of [nine thousand nine hundred dollars (\$9900)] *eleven thousand dollars (\$11,000)*;

(2) One Chief Clerk at an annual salary of [eight thousand two hundred fifty dollars (\$8250)] *ten thousand five hundred dollars (\$10,500)*;

(3) One Senate Librarian at an annual salary of [seven thousand one hundred fifty dollars (\$7150)] *ten thousand dollars (\$10,000)*.

House of Representatives:
biennial election
of officers.

Section 21. The House of Representatives shall, immediately upon the final enactment of this act, and in each odd-numbered year thereafter, at the beginning of each regular biennial session of the General Assembly elect, in addition to the Speaker as provided for by the Constitution, the following officers and employes, who shall serve for two years or until their successors are elected and have qualified, unless sooner removed by a majority vote of all of the members of the House of Representatives during any regular biennial, special or extraordinary session of the General Assembly, and who shall receive the compensation and perform the duties herein specified:

(1) One Chief clerk at an annual salary of [nine thousand nine hundred dollars (\$9900)] *eleven thousand dollars (\$11,000)*;

(2) One Secretary at an annual salary of [eight thousand two hundred fifty dollars (\$8250)] *ten thousand five hundred dollars (\$10,500)* who shall perform the duties formerly performed by the resident clerk and assistant resident clerk of the House of Representatives.

Section 2. Clause (1) of section 22 of the act, amended April 20, 1956 (P. L. 1492), is amended to read:

Section 22. The following officers and employes of the House of Representatives shall be appointed by the Speaker to serve at his pleasure and receive the compensation and perform the duties herein specified:

(1) One parliamentarian at an annual salary of [eight thousand dollars (\$8,000)] *ten thousand dollars (\$10,000)*;

AN ACT

Amending the act of July 28, 1953 (P. L. 723), entitled "An act relating to counties of the second class; amending, *revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," authorizing the board of county commissioners to formulate and adopt certain ordinances, resolutions, rules and regulations in order to preserve county property and to promote and preserve the public health, safety and welfare and fixing penalties.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Second Class County Code.

Section 1. Section 508, act of July 28, 1953 (P. L. 723), known as the "Second Class County Code," is amended to read:

Section 508, act of July 28, 1953, P. L. 723, amended.

Section 508. Ordinances and Resolutions.—(a) The board of commissioners may adopt resolutions and ordinances prescribing the manner in which powers of the county shall be carried out and generally regulating the affairs of the county.

(b) *The board of county commissioners may formulate and adopt ordinances, resolutions, rules and regulations, pertaining to the use of any property owned or used by the county and the conduct of persons in, on or about such county property, in order to preserve such property and to promote and preserve the public health, safety and welfare. The rules and regulations shall be published, promulgated and become effective in the same manner as other resolutions and ordinances of the county.*

[(b)] (c) All such ordinances, resolutions, rules and regulations unless otherwise provided by law, shall be published at least once in one newspaper of general cir-
