

APPROPRIATION ACTS

No. 1-A.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the House of Representatives and to the Senate for payment of expenses of members and senators.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. In addition to any sums heretofore appropriated to the House of Representatives for the purpose, the sum of three hundred fifteen thousand dollars (\$315,000), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the House of Representatives for payment of expenses of members of the House of Representatives beginning December 1, 1956, to the close of the fiscal biennium ending May 31, 1957.

Section 2. In addition to any sums heretofore appropriated to the Senate for the purpose, the sum of one hundred eighty-nine thousand seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$189,750), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Senate for payment of expenses of senators beginning July 1, 1956, to the close of the fiscal biennium ending May 31, 1957.

Section 3. The provisions of this act shall become effective immediately upon final enactment.

No. 2-A.

AN ACT

Making a deficiency appropriation to the Department of Public Assistance and providing for certain allocations therefrom for the purpose of carrying out the Public Assistance Law, for the two fiscal years beginning June first, one thousand nine hundred fifty-five, and for the payment of assistance and expenses accrued or incurred prior to and remaining unpaid on May thirty-first, one thousand nine hundred fifty-seven.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of seven million seven hundred sixty-seven thousand seven hundred ninety-eight dollars (\$7,767,798), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the

Department of Public Assistance, for the payment of the deficiency in the appropriation for the payment of assistance and administrative expenses as provided by the Public Assistance Law and for the payment of attorneys' fees and court costs necessary for the proper conduct of the work of the Department of Public Assistance, for the two fiscal years beginning June first, one thousand nine hundred fifty-five, and for the payment of assistance and administrative expenses, attorneys' fees and court costs, accrued or incurred prior to and remaining unpaid on May thirty-first, one thousand nine hundred fifty-seven.

Section 2. Out of the moneys appropriated by section one of this act, the Department of Public Assistance shall allocate funds from time to time for the several assistance programs (old age assistance, aid to dependent children, pensions for the blind, general assistance, and other programs provided by the Public Assistance Law), for administrative expenses of the several county boards of assistance, for such administrative expenses incurred by the department which are chargeable to such boards, and for the payment of attorneys' fees and court costs necessary for the proper conduct of the work of the department.

Section 3. Out of the moneys appropriated by section one of this act, quarterly allocations shall be made to the Department of the Auditor General and the Treasury Department, respectively, in such amounts as may be deemed necessary to pay the administrative expenses of such departments in auditing and disbursing appropriations for or relating to public assistance, including any Federal sums supplementing such appropriations. In the case of the Department of the Auditor General, said allocation shall be made by the Governor, President pro tempore of the Senate, Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Auditor General, or a majority thereof, and in the case of allocations made to the Treasury Department, such allocations shall be made by the Governor, President pro tempore of the Senate, Speaker of the House of Representatives and the State Treasurer, or a majority thereof.

Section 4. This act shall become effective immediately upon final enactment.

No. 3-A.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the joint committee appointed by the Senate and the House of Representatives to investigate actions of the Board of Pardons.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated

to the joint committee appointed by the Senate and the House of Representatives to investigate actions of the Board of Pardons in connection with the pardon, parole or commutation of sentence of persons convicted of crimes. The money shall be used for the payment of expenses of the committee and the members thereof in performance of the functions and duties for which the committee was created.

Section 2. The sum appropriated shall be paid on warrant of the Auditor General in favor of the chairman of the committee on the presentation of his requisition for the same.

Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

No. 4-A.

AN ACT

Making a deficiency appropriation to the Department of Labor and Industry for payments to claimants for certain occupational diseases.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of one million one hundred thousand dollars (\$1,100,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for the payment of the deficiency in the appropriation to the Department of Labor and Industry for the two fiscal years beginning June first, one thousand nine hundred fifty-five, for the payment by the Commonwealth of its share of the compensation payable to claimants for certain occupational diseases.

Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately upon final enactment.

No. 5-A.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the committee appointed by the Senate to investigate activities of the Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), or as much thereof as is necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the committee appointed by the Senate of the 1955 Session of the General Assembly to investigate the activities of the Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission. The money shall be used for the payment of expenses of the committee and the members thereof in the performance of its functions and duties.

APPROPRIATION ACTS,

Section 2. The sum appropriated shall be paid on warrant of the Auditor General in favor of the chairman of the committee on the presentation of his requisition. The chairman of the committee appointed by the Senate to investigate the Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission shall, not later than thirty days after the termination of his term of office or until his successor is appointed and also within thirty days after the adjournment of any regular or special session, file an account with the Auditor General of the committee's expenses since the filing of the prior account.

Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

No. 6-A.

AN ACT

Transferring money from the Special Disaster Relief Fund to the General Fund and disposing of certain tax collections.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. All money in the Special Disaster Relief Fund created by the act of September 3, 1955 (P. L. 561), except the twelve million dollars (\$12,000,000) appropriated to the Council of Civil Defense by the act of September 3, 1955 (Appropriation Acts, page 17, Act No. 17-A), is transferred to the General Fund.

Section 2. From and after the effective date of this act, the proceeds of the additional tax imposed, collected and payable into the Special Disaster Relief Fund by virtue of the act of September 3, 1955 (P. L. 561), shall be paid into the General Fund.

Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

No. 7-A.

AN ACT

Amending the act of September 3, 1955 (Appropriation Act No. 17-A), entitled "An act making an appropriation to the Council of Civil Defense for disaster relief in connection with the hurricane and flood damage of August, one thousand nine hundred fifty-five," making the moneys appropriated available to the Department of Forests and Waters and the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission before completion of projects.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 1, act of September 3, 1955 (Appropriation Act No. 17-A), entitled "An act making an appropriation to the

Council of Civil Defense for disaster relief in connection with the hurricane and flood damage of August, one thousand nine hundred fifty-five," amended May 31, 1956 (Appropriation Act No. 70-A), is amended to read:

Section 1. The sum of twelve million dollars (\$12,000,000) is hereby appropriated, out of the Special Disaster Relief Fund, to the Council of Civil Defense for disaster relief in connection with the hurricane and flood damage of August and October, one thousand nine hundred fifty-five, and any flood damage during the year of one thousand nine hundred and fifty-six, and for [the] *payment or reimbursement* to the various departments and agencies of the Commonwealth for their participation in disaster relief activities, including but not limited to materials, supplies, services, food, clothing, equipment, drugs and medicines, channel enlargement, rectification and *realignment, side slope paving, transportation and the acquisition, by amicable means up to the amount of five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000), of lands and any improvements thereon in flood areas, and repairs to the flood and hurricane damaged historical properties of Pennsbury Manor, in the County of Bucks, Governor Printz Park and John Morton Homestead, in the County of Delaware, and Warrior Run Church, in the county of Northumberland.

No payment, *except payments as herein provided to the Department of Forests and Waters and the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission*, shall be made from the appropriation herein until the various departments and agencies of the Commonwealth shall have first filed with the Council of Civil Defense sworn proofs of loss expenditures, losses and damages in detailed statements. *Payments may be made to the Department of Forests and Waters and the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission from the appropriation herein provided on account of any disaster relief project in which **they are participating after the plans, specification and costs of said project have been reviewed by the Department of Property and Supplies, and such other State agencies as the Governor may designate, and have been recommended to the Governor by such agencies and filed with the Council of Civil Defense with such recommendations.*

The Department of Property and Supplies, and such other State agencies as the Governor may designate, shall review the same and recommend to the Governor the amounts which, in their opinion, represent the value of the expenditures, losses and damages by reason of the hurricane and floods of August and October, one thousand nine hundred fifty-five, and any flood damage during the year one thousand nine hundred and fifty-six. Payment from said appropriation shall be made by requisition of the Council of Civil Defense in the manner provided by law.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

APPROPRIATION ACTS,

No. 8-A.

AN ACT

Transferring money from the Banking Department Fund to the General Fund.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) is transferred from the Banking Department Fund to the General Fund.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

Making a deficiency appropriation to the Department of Justice for the payment of salaries and general expenses.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of fifty-two thousand one hundred ten dollars (\$52,110), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Department of Justice, for the payment of the deficiency in the appropriation for salaries and general expenses for the two fiscal years beginning June first, one thousand nine hundred fifty-five.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

No. 10-A.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the Department of Public Assistance and providing for certain allocations therefrom for the purpose of carrying out the Public Assistance Law, for the two fiscal years beginning June first, one thousand nine hundred fifty-seven.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of fifteen million dollars (\$15,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Public Assistance, for the payment of assistance and for the proper conduct of the work of the Department of Public Assistance, for the two fiscal years beginning June first, one thousand

nine hundred fifty-seven, and for the payment of assistance and administrative expenses, attorneys' fees and court costs, accrued or incurred prior to and remaining unpaid on May thirty-first, one thousand nine hundred fifty-seven.

Section 2. Out of the moneys appropriated by section one of this act, there is hereby allocated to the Treasury Department the sum of one hundred five thousand dollars (\$105,000) and to the Department of the Auditor General the sum of fifty-six thousand dollars (\$56,000), to pay the administrative expenses of said departments in auditing and disbursing the appropriation made by this act.

Section 3. This act shall become effective immediately upon its final enactment.

No. 11-A.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the State Treasurer, for the purpose of paying salaries and wages of State officers and employes and other ordinary and general expenses in the interim between the thirty-first day of May, one thousand nine hundred fifty-seven, and such time as the funds provided by the General Appropriation Act and other appropriation acts become available; and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending May thirty-first, one thousand nine hundred fifty-seven.

Whereas, Under the Constitution and the laws of this Commonwealth the State Treasurer may not pay out any moneys unless they be specifically appropriated by act of the General Assembly; therefore,

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of fifty million dollars (\$50,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the State Treasurer of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, for the purpose of paying the salaries and wages of the officers and employes and other ordinary and general expenses of the State government in the interim between the thirty-first day of May, one thousand nine hundred fifty-seven, and such time as moneys appropriated by the General Appropriation Act and other appropriation acts of one thousand nine hundred fifty-seven may become available for such purposes; and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending May thirty-first, one thousand nine hundred fifty-seven.

Section 2. Payments out of the appropriation of this act shall be made by the State Treasurer upon requisitions by the several departments, boards, commissions or officers, in the same manner as payments are ordinarily made.

Section 3. All amounts paid by the State Treasurer in accordance with this act shall be charged against the appropriations made for the salaries and wages of the officers and employes and other ordinary and general expenses of the State government in the General Appropriation Act and other appropriation acts of one thousand nine hundred fifty-seven.

Section 4. This act shall become effective immediately upon its final enactment.

AN ACT

Making a deficiency appropriation for the payment of the salaries of the Orphans' Court Judges.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of twenty-eight thousand nine hundred eighty-seven dollars (\$28,987), or as much thereof as is necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated for the payment of the deficiency in the appropriation for the two fiscal years beginning the first day of June, one thousand nine hundred fifty-five, for the salaries of the Orphans' Court Judges in the several Judicial districts in which Orphans' Courts have been established by law.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

Amending the act of September 3, 1955 (Appropriation Acts, page 18), entitled "An act providing for reconstruction and repair of roads, streets, highways and bridges, damaged or destroyed, by the hurricane, flood or high water of August, 1955; making appropriations out of the Motor License Fund to the Department of Highways for allocation to political subdivisions, subject to approval of the State Council of Civil Defense, and for the reconstruction and repair of State highways and bridges thereon, and free bridges under the jurisdiction of the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission, and for allocation to cities, boroughs, towns and townships for general highway purposes," extending the time that appropriations to political subdivisions are available.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: .

Section 1. Section 3, act of September 3, 1955 (Appropriation Acts, page 18), entitled "An act providing for reconstruction and repair of roads, streets, highways and bridges, damaged or destroyed, by the hurricane, flood or high water of August, 1955; making appropriations out of the Motor License Fund to the Department of Highways for allocation to political subdivisions, subject to approval of the State Council of Civil Defense, and for the reconstruction and repair of State highways and bridges thereon, and free bridges under the jurisdiction of the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission, and for allocation to cities, boroughs, towns and townships for general highway purposes," amended June 1, 1956 (Appropriation Acts, page 114), is amended to read:

Section 3. Upon consideration of the applications, including applications made because of damages caused by disasters happening after August, 1955, and after such investigation as he deems necessary the Secretary of Highways, with the approval of the State Council of Civil Defense, shall allocate to each applicant as much of the fund hereby appropriated as the application shall justify and reasonably warrant. No application or amendment thereof shall be received or permitted after [July 15, 1956] *September 30, 1957*. Payments of the amounts allocated shall be made to the treasurers of the several political subdivisions by requisition of the Department of Highways in the manner provided by law. The department may make rules and regulations for carrying out the provisions of this act. All funds not allocated shall lapse and revert to the Motor License Fund.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation out of the Motor License Fund to the Department of Public Instruction to promote highway safety education.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of the Motor License Fund to the Department of Public Instruction, for the two fiscal years commencing June first, one thousand nine hundred fifty-seven, for the purpose of promoting highway safety education through the schools in this Commonwealth.

APPROPRIATION ACTS,

No. 15-A.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation from the World War II Veterans' Compensation Fund to the Department of Military Affairs for certain administration expenses necessary for the payment of compensation to veterans, as provided by the "World War II Veterans' Compensation Act of 1947."

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of twenty-six thousand two hundred fifteen dollars (\$26,215), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated from the World War II Veterans' Compensation Fund to the Department of Military Affairs for the two fiscal years beginning June first, one thousand nine hundred fifty-seven, for the purpose of paying salaries, wages, postage, printing and other necessary expenses incurred in payment of compensation to veterans, as provided by the "World War II Veterans' Compensation Act of 1947."

No. 16-A.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation from the Motor License Fund to the Department of Property and Supplies, for the payment of costs incurred by that department in acting as purchasing agent for the Department of Highways.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of two hundred seven thousand nine hundred twenty-two dollars (\$207,922), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated from the Motor License Fund to the Department of Property and Supplies for the two fiscal years commencing the first day of June, one thousand nine hundred fifty-seven, for the payment of salaries, wages or other compensation of such bureau or division chiefs, experts, engineers, accountants, secretaries, auditors, inspectors, examiners, statisticians, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and other assistants and employes; for the payment of postage, traveling expenses, telephone toll charges, telegrams, newspaper advertising and notices; for the payment of the costs of advertising schedules of supplies, proposals for executing any contract work, readvertising any schedules or proposals, when necessary; for the purchase of office supplies and equipment, stationery, printing, printing supplies and printing processes; for the purchase of all other materials, supplies and equipment; and for the payment

of such other expenses as may be necessary for the proper conduct of the work of the department in acting as purchasing agent for the Department of Highways.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the Treasury Department out of various funds to pay replacement checks issued in lieu of outstanding checks when presented, and to adjust errors.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums of moneys are hereby appropriated to the Treasury Department for the payment of replacement checks issued by that department in accordance with the provisions of the act, approved the twelfth day of July, one thousand nine hundred thirty-five (Pamphlet Laws 996):

AN ACT

To amend the preamble and section one of the act, approved the thirty-first day of May, one thousand nine hundred fifty-six (Appropriation Act No. 123-A), entitled "An act making an appropriation to the Department of Property and Supplies for the construction of armory facilities under certain conditions," by providing that the Federal government pay a portion of the cost of each facility.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The preamble and section one of the act, approved the thirty-first day of May, one thousand nine hundred fifty-six (Appropriation Act No. 123-A), entitled "An act making an appropriation to the Department of Property and Supplies for the construction of armory facilities under certain conditions," are hereby amended to read:

Whereas, the Federal government has apportioned more than one and one-half million dollars to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for the construction of armory facilities in accordance with the provisions of the National Defense Act and the National Defense Facilities Act of 1950; and

Whereas, the Department of Military Affairs has determined that regimental armories and other buildings are necessary for the use of the National Guard; and

Whereas, the Federal government has agreed to pay [seventy-five per centum] *a portion* of the cost of each such facility [and the Commonwealth will pay twenty-five per centum of the cost of each facility,] and the Commonwealth has the necessary sites or land available for such construction without the necessity of appropriations for the purchase of such sites;

Section 1. The sum of five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Property and Supplies to be used by the Department of Military Affairs for the construction, expansion, rehabilitation or conversion of armory facilities upon the condition that the Federal government pays [seventy-five per centum] *a portion* of the cost of each facility. None of the money herein appropriated shall be used for the purchase of land.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation for moneys in the Toll Bridge Fund to the Board of Finance and Revenue for the payment of the Loan and Transfer Agent of the Commonwealth.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of one thousand six hundred seventy dollars (\$1,670), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated out of the Toll Bridge Fund to the Board of Finance and Revenue for the two fiscal years beginning June first, one thousand nine hundred fifty-seven, for the payment of the compensation to the Commonwealth's Loan and Transfer Agent for services rendered in connection with the registration, transfer and payment of interest on Toll Bridge bonds and for other services required to be

performed by the said Loan and Transfer Agent. Payments from such appropriation shall be made at such times and in such amounts and upon such basis as may be provided by law or agreed upon between the Board of Finance and Revenue and the said Loan and Transfer Agent.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation from the Toll Bridge Fund to the Board of Finance and Revenue to meet interest and sinking fund requirements on Toll Bridge Bonds.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of one million five hundred twelve thousand four hundred twenty-five dollars (\$1,512,425) is hereby specifically appropriated from the Toll Bridge Fund to the Board of Finance and Revenue for payment into the Toll Bridge Sinking Fund to meet interest and sinking fund requirements on Toll Bridge Bonds for the two fiscal years beginning June first, one thousand nine hundred fifty-seven. The amount hereinbefore appropriated shall be transferred by the Auditor General and the State Treasurer upon requisition of the Board of Finance and Revenue from the Toll Bridge Fund to the Toll Bridge Sinking Fund on or before the dates and in the manner set forth in the following schedule:

AN ACT

Section 2. Expenditures of the funds appropriated in section 1 shall be made by the Department of Forests and Waters for the general purposes [identified as stage 1 in the engineering study made for the City of Erie and titled "Port of Erie Study, November, 1955," and consisting of dredging in the port of Erie and excavation and fill of lands adjacent thereto, to be used for a marine terminal and industrial development area] *of improvement of the Harbor of Erie in accordance with plans approved by the Port Commission of the City of Erie, the City Council of the City of Erie and the Secretary of Forests and Waters, for dredging, excavation and fill and other construction in the Harbor of Erie and the lands adjacent thereto, in the construction of marine terminal facilities.*

The sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the two fiscal years beginning June first, one thousand nine hundred fifty-seven, for the establishment of a Professorship in Preventive Medicine in the School of Medicine of the University to be known as the Commonwealth Jonas E. Salk professorship of preventive medicine, and to be filled by that member of the medical profession who, in the opinion of the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh, has made an outstanding contribution in the field of Preventive Medicine.

Section 1. The sum of twenty-six thousand dollars (\$26,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Department of Agriculture for the two fiscal years beginning the first day of June, one thousand nine hundred fifty-seven, for the control of stem rust of wheat, oats, barley and rye, by the eradication of rust spreading barberry bushes. The moneys hereby appropriated shall be apportioned among and paid to the several counties appropriating and expending from the county treasury a sum equal to that received from the Commonwealth for such purpose.

Section 2. The funds appropriated under this act shall be available for payment of salaries and wages, purchase of supplies and other necessary and pertinent items, in accordance with regulations promulgated by the Department of Agriculture, under the provisions of the act approved the twenty-first day of April, one thousand nine hundred thirty-seven (Pamphlet Laws 318), known as "The Pennsylvania Plant Pest Act of 1937."

Section 1. The sum of one hundred twenty-nine million six hundred thousand dollars (\$129,600,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Public Assistance, for the payment of assistance and administrative expenses as provided by the Public Assistance Law and for the payment of attorney's fees and court costs necessary for the proper conduct of the work of the Department of Public Assistance, for the two fiscal years beginning June first, one thousand nine hundred fifty-seven, and for the payment of assistance and administrative expenses, attorneys' fees and court costs, accrued or incurred prior to and remaining unpaid on May thirty-first, one thousand nine hundred fifty-seven.

Section 2. Out of the moneys appropriated by this act, the Department of Public Assistance shall allocate funds from time to time for the several assistance programs (old age assistance, aid to dependent children, pensions for the blind, aid to the disabled, general assistance and other programs provided by the Public Assistance Law), for administrative expenses of the several county boards of assistance, for such administrative expenses incurred by the department which are chargeable to such boards, and for the payment of attorneys' fees and court costs necessary for the proper conduct of the work of the department.

Section 3. Out of the moneys appropriated by this act, quarterly allocations shall be made to the Department of the Auditor General and the Treasury Department, respectively, in such amounts as may be deemed necessary to pay the administrative expenses of such departments in auditing and disbursing appropriations for or relating to public assistance, including any Federal sums supplementing such appropriations. In the case of the Department of the Auditor General, said allocation shall be made by the Governor, President pro tempore of the Senate, Speaker of the House of Representatives, Secretary of Public Assistance and the Auditor General, or a majority thereof, and in the case of allocations made to the Treasury Department, such allocations shall be made by the Governor, President pro tempore of the Senate, Speaker of the House of Representatives, Secretary of Public Assistance and the State Treasurer, or a majority thereof.

Section 4. Out of the moneys appropriated by this act, the Department of Public Assistance shall allocate funds from time to time

to provide necessary medical, dental and surgical care for children as provided in the act of July five, one thousand nine hundred forty-seven (P. L. 1301): Provided, however, That during the biennium beginning the first day of June, one thousand nine hundred fifty-seven, not more than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) shall be spent by the Department of Public Assistance to provide such necessary medical, dental or surgical care.

Section 5. Out of moneys appropriated by section one of this act, not over one-half of one per centum thereof may be used under the direction of the Governor for surveys, investigations and studies relative to the more efficient enforcement of the public assistance law.

The sum of twenty-four thousand three hundred ninety-nine dollars and nine cents (\$24,399.09), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to Dauphin County for defraying the expenses incurred by said county in the investigation of certain officials of the Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission by the Special Investigating Grand Jury which convened October 22, 1956.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the Department of Health for payments to municipalities and municipality authorities under the provisions of the act of August 20, 1953 (Pamphlet Laws 1217), entitled "An act providing for payments by the Commonwealth to municipalities which have expended money to acquire and construct sewage treatment plants in accordance with the Clean Streams Program and the act, approved the twenty-second day of June, one thousand nine hundred thirty-seven (Pamphlet Laws 1987), and making an appropriation," and for the repair, improvements or additions of certain sewage treatment plants.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of three million two hundred thousand dollars (\$3,200,000), or as much thereof as is necessary, is appropriated to the Department of Health for payments to municipalities and municipality authorities toward the cost of maintaining, repairing, replacing, and other expenses relating to sewage treatment plants an amount not to exceed two per centum of the costs (1) for the acquisition and construction of the sewage treatment plants by the municipalities and municipality authorities to control stream pollution expended by the municipalities and municipality authorities from the effective date of the act of June 22, 1937 (Pamphlet Laws 1987), up to and including the thirty-first day of December of the year preceding the year in which the payment is made as ascertained by the Secretary of Health and approved by the Governor as provided by the act of August 20, 1953 (Pamphlet Laws 1217), entitled "An act providing for payments by the Commonwealth to municipalities which have expended money to acquire and construct sewage treatment plants in accordance with the Clean Streams Program and the act,

approved the twenty-second day of June, one thousand nine hundred thirty-seven (Pamphlet Laws 1937), and making an appropriation," and (2) for the repair, improvements or additions since 1937 of plants constructed prior to that date.

Section 2. Within the meaning of this act, the word "construction" shall include, in addition to the construction of new treatment works, pumping stations and intercepting sewers which are an integral part of the treatment facilities (including those intercepting sewers of municipalities which collect at least fifty per cent of the sewage of the municipality which enters a public sewage system in the municipality and discharge same into the collection system of the municipality which has constructed the main sewage plant), the altering, improving or adding to of existing treatment works, pumping stations and intercepting sewers which are essential to the sewage treatment plant system.

Section 3. If any section, sentence, clause or part of this act is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, the decision of the court shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions of this act. It is hereby declared as the legislative intent that this act would have been adopted had such unconstitutional sentence, section, clause or part thereof not been included herein.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the Department of Welfare to reimburse State-aided hospitals and the Philadelphia General Hospital for part of the cost of training student nurses in approved schools of nursing.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of two million one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$2,150,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Welfare for the two fiscal years commencing the first day of June, one thousand nine hundred fifty-seven, to be paid to State-aided medical and surgical hospitals and the Philadelphia General Hospital, for the purpose of reimbursing such hospitals for part of the cost of training student nurses in approved schools of nursing. Payments from the appropriation herein made shall be made to such hospitals, from time to time, at the rate of one hundred fifty dollars (\$150) annually for each student nurse being trained in a hospital.

Section 2. The provisions of this act shall be administered under regulations established or to be established by the Department of Welfare and the Auditor General.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the several fire companies of the City of Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, and the Borough of Cresson, Pennsylvania.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated for the several fire companies of the City of Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, as compensation for protection from and extinguishment of any fire or fires that may occur in or on the Capitol buildings or grounds for the two fiscal years beginning June first, one thousand nine hundred fifty-seven. Said sum to be distributed among said companies in equal amounts.

Section 2. The sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the fire company of the Borough of Cresson, Pennsylvania, for the two fiscal years beginning June first, one thousand nine hundred fifty-seven.

APPROVED—The 15th day of July, A. D. 1957, except as to the following item in Section 2:

“The sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Fire Company of the Borough of Cresson, Pennsylvania, for the two fiscal years beginning June first, one thousand nine hundred fifty-seven.”

AN ACT

Making an appropriation from various funds of the Commonwealth to the Department of Labor and Industry for the payment of the Commonwealth's share of Social Security taxes.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The total sum of twenty-six million four hundred seven thousand dollars (\$26,407,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, from the various funds of the Commonwealth and in the amounts hereinafter listed, is hereby appropriated to the Department of Labor and Industry for payment into the Social Security Contribution Fund created under the provisions of the act of January 5, 1952 (P. L. 1833), as amended by the act of June 1, 1956 (P. L. 1973), to be expended in paying the Commonwealth's share of Social Security taxes

to the Federal government with respect to compensation for the period January 1, 1956, to May 31, 1959, of employes of the Commonwealth whose compensation is paid from such funds, and compensation for the period January 1, 1956, to May 31, 1959, with certain exceptions of employes in the Public School System of the Commonwealth in accordance with the State-wide coverage agreement or agreements entered into between the State Agency and the U. S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare for the extension of Social Security coverage to such employes.

Section 2. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated to the Department of Labor and Industry to be expended as provided in this act in paying the Commonwealth's share of Social Security taxes to the Federal government:

- (a) The sum of two million two hundred sixty-eight thousand dollars (\$2,268,000) out of the Motor License Fund.
- (b) The sum of seventy-eight thousand dollars (\$78,000) out of the Fish Fund.
- (c) The sum of one hundred thirty-three thousand dollars (\$133,000) out of the Game Fund.
- (d) The sum of forty-six thousand dollars (\$46,000) out of the Banking Department Fund.
- (e) The sum of one million one hundred thirty-seven thousand dollars (\$1,137,000) out of the State Stores Fund.
- (f) The sum of thirty-one thousand dollars (\$31,000) out of the Manufacturing Fund.
- (g) The sum of eighty-nine thousand dollars (\$89,000) out of the State Workmen's Insurance Fund.
- (h) The sum of twenty-two million six hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$22,625,000) out of the General Fund.

Section 3. The Commonwealth shall share the Social Security tax with respect to compensation of school employes previously covered under local plans and agreements only from and after the beginning of the calendar month immediately following the execution of the State-wide agreement or agreements.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the Department of Welfare for the maintenance of certain hospitals.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of twenty-four million dollars (\$24,000,000), or as much thereof as is necessary, is appropriated to the Department of Welfare for the two fiscal years beginning June one, one thousand nine hundred fifty-seven, to be by it paid to the hospitals hereinafter designated, in the amounts hereinafter specified, for the purpose of the maintenance of such hospitals, in the manner prescribed by law, at the rate of nine dollars (\$9) per diem, but not to exceed the regularly established ward rate, nursery rate, pediatric rate or any reduced rate, for the medical and surgical services rendered to and maintenance of persons treated in the hospital who are entitled to free service, such rates to include only room, board and general bed care but not to exceed rates charged other classes of patients or the actual cost to the hospital of such services and maintenance, whichever is the least, and for each day of part pay service, the proportion of nine dollars (\$9) per diem rate above which the person treated is not able to pay bears to the regular ward rate, nursery rate, pediatric rate or reduced rate for free service:

Section 2. Any unexpended balance of the appropriation, as determined by the Department of the Auditor General, shall be allocated by the Department of Welfare, with the approval of the Department of the Auditor General, among the hospitals the amounts for which herein specified have not been sufficient to pay for the services rendered by them to persons entitled to free service in the proportion which the total amount to which each hospital is entitled under the formulae set forth in section one hereof and for which it has not been paid bears to the total of such amounts of all the hospitals that have not been paid in full. The amount allocated to any hospital shall not be greater than the amount to which the hospital is entitled under the formulae set forth in section one. All amounts so allocated shall be paid by the department to the hospitals entitled thereto in the manner prescribed by law.

Section 3. All participating hospitals shall file their reports with the Department of the Auditor General within ninety days of the last day of each quarter in order to qualify for payments under this act.

Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, for deficiencies in certain appropriations made to the Department of Public Instruction by the act to which this is a supplement are hereby specifically appropriated as follows:

For the cost of transportation, investigation and necessary expenses involved in the education of blind children, as required by law, for the education of children placed in homes by the courts or other agencies, as required by law, for the award of scholarships to graduates of secondary schools to aid them in obtaining higher education, as required by law, for Cornplanter Indians to be paid to the superintendent of schools of Warren County to be expended and disbursed by him in maintaining and conducting the school on the Cornplanter Indian Reservation, for the expenses of blind students in attendance at institutions of higher learning, as provided by law, and for the payment to school districts of annual fixed charges in lieu of taxes on State lands, as required by law, the sum of four hundred eighty-seven thousand one hundred seven dollars (\$487,107).

For the payment into the School Employes' Retirement Fund to the credit of the contingent reserve account of the School Employes' Retirement Fund as required by law, the sum of one million eight hundred eleven thousand eight hundred five dollars (\$1,811,805).

For the payment into the School Employes' Retirement Fund to the credit of the State Annuity Reserve Account, number two, of the School Employes' Retirement Fund as required by law, the sum of twenty-one million eight hundred sixty-four thousand three hundred fifty-one dollars (\$21,864,351).

Making an appropriation to the Trustees of the University of Pennsylvania for the School of Veterinary Medicine.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of nine hundred eighteen thousand five hundred dollars (\$918,500), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pennsylvania for the two fiscal years beginning June 1, 1957, for the general maintenance of and for research in the School of Veterinary Medicine of the university and the purchase of such apparatus and equipment as the trustees may deem necessary for the best interests of the School of Veterinary Medicine.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the Trustees of the George Jr. Republic Association, Grove City, Pennsylvania, for construction of new buildings and repairs to and remodeling of existing buildings at the George Jr. Republic School in Mercer County, Pennsylvania.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the George Jr. Republic Association, Grove City, Pennsylvania, for construction of new buildings and repairs to and remodeling of existing buildings at the George Jr. Republic School in Mercer County, Pennsylvania.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the Trustees of the Pennsylvania State University for the use of the School of Agriculture for the erection of experimental mushroom houses and research in the communicable diseases of mushrooms and other phases of the mushroom industry.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Trustees of the Pennsylvania State University for the two fiscal years beginning June 1, 1957, for the use of the School of Agriculture for expenditure by the Agriculture Experiment Station for the erection of experimental mushroom houses and research in the communicable diseases of mushrooms and other phases of the mushroom industry.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act of April 1, 1863 (P. L. 213), entitled "An act to accept the grant of Public Lands, by the United States, to the several states for the endowment of Agricultural Colleges," making an appropriation for carrying the same into effect.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. In order to carry into effect the act of Congress, approved July 2, 1862, granting public land to the several states for educational purposes and subsequent acts of Congress related thereto, and the act of the Legislature of Pennsylvania, approved April 1, 1863, and subsequent acts of the Legislature of Pennsylvania accepting the provisions and conditions of said acts of Congress and pledging the faith of the State to carry the same into effect, the sum of twenty-nine million seven hundred thirteen thousand four hundred dollars (\$29,713,400) is hereby specifically appropriated for the two fiscal years beginning June 1, 1957, to the trustees of the Pennsylvania State University for the following purposes:

(1) For the general maintenance of instruction, research and extension in the College of Agriculture, the Mont Alto State Forest School, the College of Business Administration, the College of Engineering and Architecture, the College of Liberal Arts, the College of Home Economics, the College of Mineral Industries, the College of Chemistry and Physics, the College of Education, the Graduate School, the College of Physical Education and Athletics, the General Extension Services, and for the general maintenance of other schools, departments, offices and services, including repairs and improvements to the grounds and buildings, service of light, heat, power, water and sewage disposal, salaries and wages, materials, supplies, equipment, books and periodicals, insurance and interest, and such other expenditures as the trustees may deem necessary and practicable, the sum of twenty-nine million two hundred sixty-eight thousand four hundred dollars (\$29,268,400).

(2) For the use of the College of Agriculture for expenditure by the Agricultural Experiment Station for the support of research and investigation directed toward the development and production of superior strains of crops and livestock, and to develop more efficient methods of producing and marketing such products, the sum of one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000).

(3) For the maintenance and the support of research and experimental investigation on problems relating to the petroleum industry of the State, the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000).

(4) For the purpose of carrying on research and investigation to discover by-products of anthracite and bituminous coal and uses therefor, of developing new scientific, chemical, industrial, domestic and other uses, and new and extended markets for anthracite coal and its products, and for employing engineers, chemists, technical experts, assistants, clerks, stenographers and other employes, and purchasing such machinery, supplies, equipment, apparatus and other things necessary in the furtherance of the aforesaid research and investigation, to be used by the College of Mineral Industries under the supervision

of the State Department of Mines, the sum of seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000). The moneys appropriated by this clause shall be available and expended only to the extent that a sum equal to fifty per centum of the amount to be expended by the Commonwealth is contributed to the Pennsylvania State University by the members of the anthracite and bituminous coal industry. Affidavits evidencing such contributions shall be submitted by the University to the Auditor General.

(5) For the support of research and investigation of basic problems affecting the slate and other non-metallic mineral industries, the sum of thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000).

(6) For the support of research and investigation of long-range basic problems affecting the mineral industries, the sum of thirty-two thousand five hundred dollars (\$32,500).

(7) For the purpose of matching money contributed by industry to the College of Mineral Industries for research and investigation of long-range problems affecting the mineral industries, the sum of fifty-seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$57,500). No more shall be expended from this item than may be required to match an equal sum contributed to the University by one or more industries for such research and investigation. Affidavits evidencing such contributions shall be submitted by the University to the Auditor General.

Making an appropriation to the Department of Agriculture for expenses incurred in a geological survey to be made in conjunction with the Federal government.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of nineteen thousand dollars (\$19,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of Agriculture for the payment of necessary expenses incurred in making a geological survey in conjunction with the Federal government in order to collect data regarding runoff and suspended sediment movement of certain streams in Pennsylvania to determine what effect soil conservation practices within the watershed have on the flood flows and suspended sediment load passing from the watershed, providing Federal matching funds are available.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the Department of Military Affairs to be used by the Pennsylvania Aeronautics Commission for the encouragement and development of aeronautics.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated out of moneys in the General Fund to the Department of Military Affairs for the two fiscal years beginning the first day of June, one thousand nine hundred fifty-seven, to be used by the Pennsylvania Aeronautics Commission for the encouragement and development of aeronautics, for the development and maintenance of State airports, for assistance to political subdivisions and municipal authorities of the Commonwealth in the construction and improvement of airports and other aeronautical facilities, including the making of surveys and plans and the necessary construction work and equipment: Provided, however, That no more shall be expended from this item for such purposes or any of them than may be required to match an equal sum contributed by any political subdivision or municipal authority of the Commonwealth or by the Federal government, or by a political subdivision or municipal authority and the Federal government.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission for the construction of Old Fort Bedford as a permanent historic shrine.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission in cooperation with the Bedford Park Commission is empowered and directed to construct and erect a replica of Old Fort Bedford in Bedford County as a permanent historic shrine. The construction and erection of Old Fort Bedford shall be completed during the year 1958.

Section 2. The sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission for the payment of expenses incidental to carrying out the provisions of this act.

Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the Moore Institute of Art, Science and Industry, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of seventy-one thousand five hundred dollars (\$71,500) is hereby specifically appropriated to the Moore Institute of Art, Science and Industry, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, for the two fiscal years beginning June first, one thousand nine hundred fifty-seven: Provided, That in such school there shall be maintained a free one-year scholarship, annually, for one pupil of each senatorial district in the State to be filled by appointment of the senator of each such district.

AN ACT

To provide for the ordinary expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth interest on the public debt and for public schools for two years beginning June 1, 1957, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending May 31, 1957.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "General Appropriation Act of 1957."

Section 2. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the General Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of the salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expense of the duly elected or appointed officers and employes of the Commonwealth, for payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods, services, printing, equipment, land and buildings, and for payment of any other expenses as provided by law or by this act necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the two years beginning June 1, 1957, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending May 31, 1957.
