Commonwealth of Pennsylvania south 36 degrees 23 minutes west 150 feet to an iron pin offset northwesterly 120 feet along the northerly line of a 15 foot alley; thence by the northerly line of said 15 foot alley from intersection of 14th Street and northerly line of said 15 foot alley north 53 degrees 37 minutes west 60 feet to an iron pin a corner of Lot No. 7 now of the Grange Trust Company; thence by Lot No. 7 north 36 degrees 23 minutes east 150 feet to an iron pin offset northwestwardly 180 feet along the southerly line of the William Penn Highway from the intersection of the southerly line of the William Penn Highway and the westerly line of 14th Street; thence by the southerly line of the said William Penn Highway 53 degrees 37 minutes east 60 feet to an iron pin the place of beginning.

Being the same tract No. 3 which was acquired by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania from Marshall Hammer by deed dated October 17, 1933, and recorded in Huntingdon County Deed Book Vol. L-7 at page 575.

Section 2. The conveyance shall be made under and subject to all easements, servitudes and rights of others, existing at the time of conveyance, whether or not appearing of record for any portion of the said property.

Section 3. The deed of conveyance shall be approved by the Department of Justice and shall be executed by the Secretary of Property and Supplies in the name of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

Amending the act of May 4, 1927 (P. L. 519), entitled "An act concerning boroughs, and revising, amending, and consolidating the law relating to boroughs," authorizing each civil service commission to designate the time when applicants for positions and promotions in the police force and as paid operators of fire apparatus shall take physical examinations.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Sections 1175 and 1183, act of May 4, 1927 (P. L. 519), known as "The Borough Code," reenacted and amended July 10, 1947 (P. L. 1621), are amended to read:

Section 1175. General Provisions Relating to Examinations.—The commission shall make rules and regula-

tions, to be approved as provided in section 1170 hereof. providing for the examination of applicants for positions in the police force and as paid operators of fire apparatus and for promotions, which rules and regulations shall prescribe the minimum qualifications of all applicants to be examined and the passing grades. All examinations for positions or promotions shall be practical in character and shall relate to such matters and include such inquiries as will fairly test the merit and fitness of the persons examined to discharge the duties of the employment sought by them. All examinations shall be open to all applicants who have the minimum qualifications required by the rules and regulations. Each applicant [for examination] shall be subject to the regulations adopted by the commission, and shall be required to submit to a physical examination [before being admitted to the regular examination held by the commission].

Public notice of the time and place of every examination, together with the information as to the kind of position or place to be filled, shall be given by publication once in a newspaper of general circulation in the borough, or in a newspaper circulating generally in the borough, at least two weeks prior to each examination, and a copy of the notice shall be prominently posted in the office of the commission or other public place.

The commission shall post in its office the eligible list, containing the names and grades of those who have passed the examination. Persons, male or female, who served in the military or naval service of the United States during any war in which the United States has been, is now, or shall hereafter be, engaged and who have honorable discharges from such service, who have successfully passed the examination, shall be given the additional credits and preference in appointment and promotion provided for by law.

Section 1183. Physical *Examinations.—All applicants for examination shall undergo a physical examination which shall be conducted under the supervision of a [doctor of medicine] *physician* appointed by the commission. No person shall be eligible [to take an examination] for appointment until said doctor certifies that the applicant is free from any bodily or mental defects, deformity or disease that might incapacitate him from the discharge of the duties of the position desired.
