charge and receive, from the person paying the tax, voluntarily, within thirty days, as hereinafter provided, the sum of two per centum upon the amount of taxes paid, and charge and receive from the person paying the tax, or of whom he shall collect it, after the period of thirty days, as hereinafter provided, the sum of ten per centum upon the amount of taxes paid, or collected: which said sum shall be in full for all services rendered. or performed, as collector, except his fees for levving upon, advertising and selling property for taxes, for which services he shall have, receive and charge the same fees, as constables are entitled to charge for like services, upon an execution; and he is hereby given all the power and privileges, and required to perform all the duties, except as herein otherwise required, that are Duties. now, or may hereafter be, given to, or required of, collectors of state, county, township and borough, school and poor taxes, and shall be liable to the same punishments and penalties, for neglect of duties, misbehavior, or embezzlement.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

Amending the act of May 4, 1927 (P. L. 519), entitled "An act concerning boroughs, and revising, amending, and consolidating the law relating to boroughs," authorizing the purchase of public liability insurance.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Clause XXX. of section 1202, act of May 4, 1927 (P. L. 519), known as "The Borough Code," reenacted and amended July 10, 1947 (P. L. 1621) and amended July 19, 1951 (P. L. 1026), is amended to read:

Section 1202. Specific Powers.—The powers of the borough shall be vested in the corporate officers. They shall have power:

.

XXX. Other Insurance. — To appropriate such amount as may be necessary to secure insurance or compensation for volunteer firemen of companies duly recognized by the borough, by motion or resolution, killed or injured while going to, returning from, or attending fires, or while performing their duties as special fire

Act effective immediately. police. To make contracts of insurance with any insurance company, association or exchange, authorized to transact business in this Commonwealth, insuring borough employes, or any class, or classes thereof, under a policy or policies of insurance covering life, health or accident insurance, and to contract with any such company, granting annuities or pensions, for the pensioning of such employes, and to agree to pay part or all of the premiums or charges for carrying such contracts, and to appropriate moneys from the borough treasury for such purposes. To make contracts with any insurance company, association or exchange, authorized to transact business in this Commonwealth, insuring any public liability of the borough, and to appropriate moneys from the borough treasury for such purpose.
