police. To make contracts of insurance with any insurance company, association or exchange, authorized to transact business in this Commonwealth, insuring borough employes, or any class, or classes thereof, under a policy or policies of insurance covering life, health or accident insurance, and to contract with any such company, granting annuities or pensions, for the pensioning of such employes, and to agree to pay part or all of the premiums or charges for carrying such contracts, and to appropriate moneys from the borough treasury for such purposes. To make contracts with any insurance company, association or exchange, authorized to transact business in this Commonwealth, insuring any public liability of the borough, and to appropriate moneys from the borough treasury for such purpose.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 1, act of June 25, 1947 (P. L. 973), entitled "An act relating to the annual salaries of certain county officers of counties of the third class," amended October 11, 1951 (P. L. 1699), is amended to read:

Section 1. The annual salaries of the following county officers of counties of the third class shall be as follows:

The recorder of deeds, [seven thousand six hundred dollars (\$7,600)] nine thousand six hundred dollars (\$9,600).

The county treasurer, [six thousand four hundred dollars (\$6,400)] eight thousand four hundred dollars (\$8,400).

The county controller, [eight thousand five hundred dollars (\$8,500)] ten thousand five hundred dollars (\$10,500).

The county surveyor, where such office exists, one hundred ten dollars (\$110).

The county commissioners, [nine thousand two hundred fifty dollars (\$9,250)] eleven thousand two hundred fifty dollars (\$11,250), each.

The jury commissioners, [one thousand two hundred dollars (\$1,200)] one thousand four hundred dollars (\$1,400), each.

The district attorney, [nine thousand two hundred fifty dollars (\$9,250)] eleven thousand two hundred fifty dollars (\$11,250).

Section 2. This act shall become effective and applicable to all of the pertinent county officers who shall begin a term of office on or after the first Monday of January, 1960.
