AN ACT

Amending the act of June 25, 1947 (P. L. 938), entitled^{*} "An act relating to the annual salaries and compensation of certain county officers of counties of the seventh class," increasing the salaries of certain employes and officers.

Seventh class counties.

Section 1, act of June 25, 1947, P. L. 938, amended October 11, 1951, P. L. 1707, further amended.

Salaries of county officers.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 1, act of June 25, 1947 (P. L. 938), entitled "An act relating to the annual salaries and compensation of certain county officers of counties of the seventh class," amended October 11, 1951 (P. L. 1707), is amended to read:

Section 1. That in counties of the seventh class the annual salary of the sheriff shall be [four thousand dollars (\$4,000)] five thousand two hundred dollars (\$5,200).

The district attorney shall receive an annual salary depending upon the population of the county, as follows: (a) twenty thousand (*20,000) and more, but less than thirty thousand (*30,000) [two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500)] three thousand seven hundred dollars (\$3,700); (b) thirty thousand (30,000) and more, but less than forty thousand (40,000), [three thousand dollars (\$3,000)] four thousand two hundred dollars (\$4,200); (c) forty thousand (40,000) and more, but less than fifty thousand (50,000), [three thousand five hundred dollars (\$3,500)] four thousand seven hundred dollars (\$4,700).

The annual salary of each county commissioner shall be [two thousand two hundred dollars (\$2,200)] three thousand four hundred dollars (\$3,400).

The jury commissioners shall each receive [seven dollars and fifty cents (\$7.50)] twelve dollars and fifty cents (\$12.50) for each day necessarily employed in the discharge of their duties. The said compensation shall be paid from the county *treasury in the same manner as the salary or compensation of other county officers and employes.

The county auditors shall receive twelve dollars and fifty cents (\$12.50) for each day necessarily employed in the discharge of their duties, together with six cents (6ϕ) per mile circular from and to their homes, once, each and every day so employed.

Section 2. The act of May 12, 1887 (P. L. 95), en-Specific repeals titled "An act regulating the compensation of county counties." auditors within this Commonwealth," amended June 21, 1947 (P. L. 851), is repealed in so far as it applies to counties of the seventh class.

The act of June 28, 1955 (P. L. 206), entitled "An act fixing the compensation and mileage of county auditors in counties of the sixth, seventh and eighth classes," is repealed in so far as it applies to counties of the seventh class.
