to setting forth the table of contents, specify that the ordinance is only a consolidation or codification of existing ordinances or ordinances on a particular subject, and shall indicate a place within the township where a copy

thereof may be examined.

The procedure set forth in this clause for the consolidation or codification of township ordinances as a single ordinance may also be followed in enacting a complete group or body of ordinances, repealing or amending existing ordinances as may be necessary in the course of preparing a consolidation or codification of the township ordinances, except that in such case the publication shall list, in lieu of a table of contents, the titles only of each of the ordinances in such complete group or body of ordinances.

AN ACT

Providing leaves of absence with pay for certain employes of the Commonwealth for the purpose of attending conventions.

Commonwealth employes.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Elected representatives of policemen or firemen entitled to leave of absence with pay to attend certain conventions.

Section 1. Any employe of the Commonwealth who is a duly elected representative of any National or State lodge or organization of policemen or firemen, or of any local lodge or group being a part of any National or State organization of policemen or firemen, shall be entitled to leave of absence, with pay, for the time necessary to attend for a period not to exceed four days any annual National or State convention, or conference of such organization, including necessary time for travel to and from the same.

Certificate of

Section 2. Any employe receiving time off with pay under the authority of this act shall, upon his return, submit to his immediate superior a certificate testifying to his attendance at the convention, signed by at least two responsible officers of the convention.

Privilege limited to three representatives per lodge. Section 3. No more than three elected representatives shall attend any such convention or conference on behalf of any such lodge, organization or group under the provisions of this act.

Act effective immediately.

Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
