

this act, or fails to maintain records, or that the children therein have been subjected to mistreatment or abuse, it shall revoke the license of such family day care home or day care center, and shall note such upon the face of the record thereof, and shall give written notice of such revocation to the licensee or licensees by delivering the notice to him or them in person or by registered mail or by leaving it with an adult person residing on the licensed premises. Whenever any license is revoked by the department, the written notice of revocation shall specify the reason for such revocation.

Section 11. Department to Adopt Regulations.—The department is hereby authorized and empowered to adopt regulations not inconsistent with the provisions of this act for the issuance and renewal of such licenses, and for the proper maintenance, operation and conduct of such family day care homes or day care centers for children, and for the effective enforcement thereof. Such regulations shall be designed to insure safe and wholesome care for all children receiving day care.

Section 12. Penalties.—Any person who operates a family day care home or day care center for children without having obtained a license within thirty days after being notified by the department so to do, or who operates a family day care home or day care center for children after his license has been revoked, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than five hundred dollars (\$500) or more than one thousand dollars (\$1000), or undergo imprisonment not exceeding six months, or both.

Section 13. Effective Date.—This act shall take effect in six months.

AN ACT

Amending the act of June 11, 1879 (P. L. 147), entitled "An act fixing the compensation of persons called to serve as coroner's jurors in this commonwealth," increasing the compensation of certain coroner's jurors.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: Coroner's jurors.

Section 1, act of June 11, 1879, P. L. 147, amended May 29, 1951, P. L. 510, further amended.

Section 1. Section 1, act of June 11, 1879 (P. L. 147), entitled "An act fixing the compensation of persons called to serve as coroner's jurors in this commonwealth," amended May 29, 1951 (P. L. 510), is amended to read:

**Compensation.**

Section 1. (a) Be it enacted, &c., That all persons [hereafter], *except as hereinafter provided*, summoned or notified to serve as coroner's jurors, in this commonwealth, shall be entitled to receive as compensation the sum of [four \*dollars (\$4)] *seven dollars (\$7.)* per day, and no mileage; these fees to be paid in the same manner that the fees of coroner's jurors are now paid.

Act effective immediately.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

Amending the title and the act of June 24, 1919 (P. L. 579), entitled "An act to fix the salary and mileage of the members of the General Assembly, and to provide for the furnishing of such postage, stationery, and supplies, as may be necessary for the conduct of their offices, and repealing all acts or parts of acts inconsistent therewith," providing for the purchase or rental of electric roll call and public address systems and other equipment for the respective Houses of the Legislature.

General Assembly.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Title, act of June 24, 1919, P. L. 579, amended.

Section 1. The title, act of June 24, 1919 (P. L. 579), entitled "An act to fix the salary and mileage of the members of the General Assembly, and to provide for the furnishing of such postage, stationery, and supplies, as may be necessary for the conduct of their offices, and repealing all acts or parts of acts inconsistent therewith," is amended to read:

AN ACT

To fix the salary and mileage of the members of the General Assembly and to provide for the furnishing of such postage, stationery, *equipment*, and supplies, as may be necessary for the conduct of their offices, *and electric roll call and public address systems and other equipment for the respective Houses*, and repealing all acts or parts of acts inconsistent therewith.
