less than thirty days nor more than sixty days. Each azy such a violation continues shall constitute a separate offense.

Specific repeal.

Section 9. The act of July 7, 1947 (P. L. 1401), entitled "An act prohibiting discrimination in rate of pay because of sex; conferring powers and imposing duties on the Department of Labor and Industry; and prescribing penalties," is repealed.

General repeal.

All other acts and parts of acts are repealed in so far as they are inconsistent herewith.

Effective date.

Section 10. Effective Date.—This act shall become effective ninety days after the date of its final enactment.

AN ACT

Relating to the legitimacy of children born of void or voidable marriages.

Children.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Children born of void or voidable marriages deemed to be legitimate. Section 1. In all cases where a supposed or alleged marriage is contracted, which is absolutely void by reason of one of the parties thereto having a spouse living at the time of the supposed or alleged marriage, or if for any other lawful reason, the said marriage was void or voidable when contracted, all children born to such parties shall be deemed the legitimate children of both parties for all purposes.

Vested rights unaffected.

Section 2. The provisions of this act shall not affect any property rights that have vested prior to the effective date of this act.
