Section 10. No part of the appropriations made by this act shall be used to pay for hospital or institutional care or training at rates in excess of those charged to the general public for the same care and services: Provided, however, That a hospital can be paid at a rate per day for in-patient care and a rate per visit for out-patient care not greater than the hospital's average cost for each class of care as determined annually by the Auditor General on the basis of certified fiscal reports submitted by hospitals and approved by the Auditor General.

Section 7. This act shall take effect immediately.

APPROVED—The 4th day of February, A. D. 1960, except as to the following item:

#### No. 2-A.

#### AN ACT

Amending the act of November 21, 1959 (Act No. 98-A) entitled "An act making an appropriation to the Department of Public Welfare for the maintenance of certain hospitals," deleting the appropriation for Mercer County Crippled Children's Society.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 1, act of November 21, 1959 (Act No. 98-A) entitled "An act making an appropriation to the Department of Public Welfare for the maintenance of certain hospitals," is amended to read:

Section 1. The sum of [twenty-eight million dollars (\$28,000,-000)] twenty-seven million nine hundred ninety-five thousand dollars (\$27,995,000), or as much thereof as is necessary, is appropriated to the Department of Public Welfare for the two fiscal years beginning June 1, 1959, to be, by it, paid to the hospitals hereinafter designated, in the amounts hereinafter specified, for the purpose of the maintenance of such hospitals in accordance with the rules and regulations issued by the Department of Public Welfare and the Department of the Auditor General, as prescribed by law, at the rate of ten dollars (\$10) per diem, but not to exceed the regularly established ward rate, nursery rate, pediatric rate or any lesser rate contracted between the hospital and patient, for the medical and surgical services rendered to and maintenance of persons treated in the hospital who are entitled to free service, such rates to include only room, board and general bed eare, but not to exceed rates charged other classes of patients or the actual cost to the hospital of such services and maintenance, whichever is the least, and all moneys received on account of the eare of the patient shall be reported as a credit against the gross earnings of free and part pay service chargeable against this appropriation:
