Amending the act of December 15, 1959 (P. L. 1779), entitled "An act relating to fish; and amending, revising, consolidating and changing the law relating to fish in the inland waters and the boundary lakes and boundary rivers of the Commonwealth," requiring the fishing license to be displayed on an outer garment while fishing.

The Fish Law of 1959.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

First paragraph, section 226, act of December 15, 1959, P. L. 1779, amended. Section 1. The first paragraph of section 226, act of December 15, 1959 (P. L. 1779), known as "The Fish Law of 1959," is amended to read:

Section 226. Unlawful to Fish without License.—No person shall angle or fish in any of the waters within or bounding on or adjacent to this Commonwealth unless the license hereinbefore provided be at such time continually [kept about the person] displayed on an outer garment of the licensee and exhibited upon the request of any fish warden, sheriff, constable or other officer of the Commonwealth.

AN ACT

Amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P. L. 1225), entitled "An act concerning game and other wild birds and wild animals; and amending, revising, consolidating and changing the law relating thereto," changing the expiration date of permits issued by the commission.

The Game Law.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

First paragraph, section 401, act of June 3, 1937, P. L. 1225, amended.

Section 1. The first paragraph of section 401, act of June 3, 1937 (P. L. 1225), known as "The Game Law," is amended to read:

Special permits.

Section 401. Commission Empowered to Grant Permits.—Under the conditions and limitations hereinafter prescribed, the commission may grant permits at its discretion to citizens of the United States who, unless otherwise specified, shall be residents of the Commonwealth and twenty-one years old or over, which permits shall be in such form as the commission may determine

and shall expire on [May thirty-first] June thirtieth of Expiration. each year, and which may be revoked or suspended at any time at the discretion of the commission. Such permits shall not be transferable. Such permits may be issued:

This act shall take effect June 1, 1961, Effective date. except that permits issued between June 1, 1961, and June 30, 1961, both dates inclusive, shall not expire until June 30, 1962, unless sooner revoked or suspended by the commission.

AN ACT

Amending the act of June 24, 1931 (P. L. 1206), entitled "An act concerning townships of the first class; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the law relating thereto," increasing the expense allowance for delegates to meetings of the State associations of township officers.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 622, act of June 24, 1931 (P. L. 1206), known as "The First Class Township Code," reenacted and amended May 27, 1949 (P. L. 1955) and amended June 30, 1959 (P. L. 489), is amended to read:

Section 622. Expenses of Delegates Paid by Townships.—Each delegate and other officer attending the annual meeting of the State association shall be allowed for his expenses incurred in attending the meeting, [twenty] twenty-five dollars per day for not more than four days including the time employed in traveling thereto and therefrom, together with ten cents per mile in going to and returning from the meeting. These expenses shall be paid by the respective townships.

Section 2. This act shall take effect the first Monday Effective date. of January, 1962.
