added compensation of two hundred dollars (\$200) for each of said school years as a cost of living increase in compensation.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

## AN ACT

Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P. L. 90), entitled "An act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession, consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores, for the payment of certain license fees to the respective municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures; providing for local option, and repealing existing laws," prohibiting the refilling of any liquor bottle or other liquor container.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Penn- Liquor Code. sylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Clause (10) of section 491, act of April Clause 10, section 491, act 12, 1951 (P. L. 90), known as the "Liquor Code," is of April 12, amended to read:

1951, P. L. 90, amended.

Section 491. Unlawful Acts Relative to Liquor, Alcohol and Liquor Licensees.-

It shall be unlawful-

(10) Fortifying, Adulterating or Contaminating Liquor. For any licensee or any employe or agent of a licensee or of the board, to fortify, adulterate or contaminate any liquor, except as permitted by the regulations of the board, or to refill wholly or in part, with any liquid or substance whatsoever, any liquor bottle or other liquor container [bearing the official seal of the board].
