AN ACT
Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P. L. 30), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," further providing for the administration of allocation of unencumbered funds.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 2508, act of March 10, 1949 (P. L. 30), known as the "Public School Code of 1949," amended July 13, 1957 (P. L. 899), is amended to read:

Section 2508. Distribution of Unencumbered Funds for Vocational Education.-The State Board for Vocational Education shall administer the allocation of Federal and State vocational education funds which are otherwise unencumbered [after all other payments mandated by law have been made]. Allocations shall be made for the furtherance of the provisions of the State and Federal vocational education acts with emphasis on the improvement of facilities, reimbursement of teachers' salaries, research and projects which will contribute to the economic welfare of youth and adults.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
