

AN ACT

Amending the act of March 30, 1937 (P. L. 115), entitled "An act to provide for the permanent personal registration of electors in cities of the first class as a condition of their right to vote at elections and primaries, and their enrollment as members of political parties as a further condition of their right to vote at primaries; prescribing certain procedure for the conduct of elections and primaries and the challenge and proof of qualifications of electors; and prescribing the powers and duties of citizens, parties, bodies of electors, registration commissions, commissioners, registrars, inspectors of registration and other appointees of registration commission, election officers, municipal officers, departments and bureaus, police officers, courts, judges, prothonotaries, sheriffs, county commissioners, peace officers, county treasurers, county controllers, registrars of vital statistics, real estate brokers, rental agents, certain public service companies, persons, firms, and corporations operating vehicles for moving furniture and household goods, and boards of school directors; and imposing penalties," eliminating requirements that registrars of vital statistics make death reports and requiring the cancellation of registration of persons reported dead.

The First Class
City Permanent

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Subsections (a)
and (b), section
31, act of March
30, 1937, P. L.

Section 1. Subsections (a) and (b) of section 31, act of March 30, 1937 (P. L. 115), known as "The First Class City Permanent Registration Act," are amended to read:

Section 31. Report of Deaths from [Registrars of Vital Statistics] *Department of Health*; Cancelling Registration; Correction if Person is Falsely Reported Deceased; Reports of Removals from Certain Public Service Companies, Real Estate Brokers, Rental Agents, Persons, Firms, and Corporations Operating Vehicles for Moving Furniture and Household Goods.—

(a) [The registrar of vital statistics of every registration district, containing, constituted by, or contained within any city, shall report, in writing, at least weekly, to the registration commission the deaths of residents of the city except residents less than twenty years of age. Said written report shall contain the full name of the decedent, his residence address, the date of his birth, if available, and the date of his death. The commission shall forthwith cancel the registration of each registered elector so reported.] *The commission shall cancel the registration of each registered elector reported dead by the Department of Health.*

(b) Any person falsely reported deceased by [any registrar of vital statistics] *the Department of Health* may appear in person before a registrar, clerk or com-

missioner, at the office of the commission, and prove his identity, and the commission thereupon shall correct its records accordingly.

L. 1314), entitled "An act to regulate and establish the fees to be received by the clerk of oyer and terminer and quarter sessions of the peace, and the municipal court of Philadelphia, in counties of the first class," further regulating the fees to be received by the clerk of oyer and terminer and quarter sessions of the peace, and the municipal court of Philadelphia, in counties of the first class.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Counties of the first class.

Section 1. Section 1, act of October 14, 1959 (P. L. 1314), entitled "An act to regulate and establish the fees to be received by the clerk of oyer and terminer and quarter sessions of the peace, and the municipal court of Philadelphia, in counties of the first class," is amended to read:

Section 1, act of October 14, 1959, P. L. 1314, amended.

Section 1. The fees to be received by the clerk of the court of oyer and terminer and quarter sessions of the peace, and of the municipal court of Philadelphia, in counties of the first class, shall be as follows:

Fees: court of oyer and terminer and quarter sessions of the peace and municipal court of Philadelphia.
