shall adopt plans for the improvement, preservation, beautification, and maintenance thereof, and shall have power and it shall be their duty to carry the same into execution, including the maintenance of the wild flower preserve on the land known as Bowman's Hill in the said park as well as the Bird Banding Station and Nature Study Center, and all moneys expended shall be under their supervision; but no contracts shall be made for said improvement unless an appropriation therefor shall have been first made by the Legislature.

The commissioners are further authorized to establish and maintain a museum or museums in said park for the preservation and display of relics and reproductions commemorative of Washington's Crossing the Delaware, and the commissioners are specifically authorized to perform all duties necessary and appropriate for this purpose, including the acquisition by purchase or gift of relics and reproductions suitable for inclusion in such museum and the employment of consultants to advise as to the authenticity of such relics and the accuracy of such reproductions. Expenses incidental to the establishment and maintenance of such museum or museums shall be paid out of the general appropriations made to the commission.

## AN ACT

Designating State highway route number 15 as the "Blue and Gray Highway," and imposing duties on the Department of Highways in relation thereto.

Blue and Gray Highway. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

State highway route number 15 designated "Blue and Gray Highway." Section 1. State highway route number 15, extending from the Maryland state line in Adams County to Harrisburg, is designated as the "Blue and Gray Highway."

Section 2. The Department of Highways shall erect along said highway suitable tablets or markers to perpetuate this act, but it shall not replace or change the officially designated route number of the highway.
