

others, including but not confined to streets, roadways and rights of any telephone, telegraph, water, electric, gas or pipe line companies as well as under and subject, nevertheless, to any estates or tenancies vested in third persons, whether or not appearing of record, for any portion of the said land or improvements erected thereon.

Approval and execution.

Section 2. The deed of conveyance shall be approved by the Department of Justice and shall be executed by the Secretary of Property and Supplies in the name of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Disposition of proceeds.

Section 3. All moneys received from the sale of the land herein authorized to be conveyed shall be deposited in the General Fund.

Act effective immediately.

Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

Authorizing an incoming Governor to arrange for temporary staffing to expedite the transition of government, and providing for an appropriation in certain years.

Governor elect.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Personnel authorized; procedures and limitations of employment.

Section 1. In order that there may be an orderly, efficient and economical transition of government following the election of a new Governor, the Auditor General, in the fiscal year during which a new Governor is elected, is hereby authorized to employ such consultants, accountants and experts as shall have been selected in writing by the new Governor who is hereby authorized to fix the compensation to be paid such personnel. Such notice to the Auditor General shall be given at any time after the Secretary of the Commonwealth and the Auditor General have determined the person receiving the highest number of votes for the office of Governor and have informed the new Governor-elect of such determination. Since this personnel is to be engaged for a limited period of time, they shall not be eligible for membership in any of the retirement systems of the Commonwealth, nor shall they be bound by or subject to the provisions of "The Administrative Code of 1929" pertaining to State employes. Such personnel shall be paid from an appropriation not to exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) made to the Auditor

General during the fiscal year when the new Governor is elected. Within thirty days after his inauguration the new Governor shall dispense with the services of the temporary personnel or place such members thereof as he sees fit on the payroll of the Commonwealth in the manner provided by "The Administrative Code of 1929."

Section 2. This act shall take effect November 1, 1963. Effective date.

AN ACT

Amending the act of April 29, 1959 (P. L. 58), entitled "An act consolidating and revising the Vehicle Code, the Tractor Code, the Motor Vehicle Financial Responsibility Act and other acts relating to the ownership, possession and use of vehicles and tractors," further regulating the suspension of operators' licenses or operating privileges.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

The Vehicle Code

Section 1. Subsection (e) of section 618, act of April 29, 1959 (P. L. 58), known as "The Vehicle Code," amended April 28, 1961 (P. L. 108), is amended to read:

Section 618. Suspension of Licenses or Operating Privileges.—

* * * * *

(e) The secretary is hereby authorized after a hearing before the secretary or his representative, or upon failure of the said person to appear at such hearing, to suspend the operator's license or learner's permit of any person licensed in this Commonwealth, upon receiving notice of the conviction of such person in another state of an offense therein for which *he was (i) arrested by a member of the State police and which, if committed in this Commonwealth, would be grounds for the suspension or revocation of the license of an operator [but if]; or (ii) arrested by someone other than a member of the State police for an offense which, if committed in this Commonwealth, would be adjudicated in a court of record and would be grounds for the suspension or revocation of the license of an operator.
