AN ACT

Amending the act of April 29, 1959 (P. L. 58), entitled "An act consolidating and revising the Vehicle Code, the Tractor Code, the Motor Vehicle Financial Responsibility Act and other acts relating to the ownership, possession and use of vehicles and tractors," providing for the transfer of registration from a decedent to a surviving spouse without letters and notwithstanding the fact that there are minor children surviving the decedent.

The Vehicle Code. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Act of April 29, 1959, P. L. 58, amended by adding a new section 507.2.

Section 1. The act of April 29, 1959 (P. L. 58), known as "The Vehicle Code," is amended by adding, after section 507.1, a new section to read:

Section 507.2. Transfer of Registration to Surviving Spouse upon the Death of an Owner of a Motor Vehicle, Tractor Trailer or Semi-trailer.—Transfer of registration to a surviving spouse, or any person designated by said spouse, may be made without the necessity of letters notwithstanding the fact that there are minor children surviving the decedent: Provided, That the surviving spouse files an affidavit that all the debts of the decedent have been paid and the family allowance exceeds the value of the vehicle.

AN ACT

Enabling and authorizing the Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs or any of the administrative boards, commissions or officers within the Department of State or otherwise under his supervision to proceed by injunction or any other process in the court of common pleas in any county where the alleged unauthorized practice was committed to prohibit and restrain any unlicensed person, association, copartnership or corporation from engaging in an activity for which a license is required to be issued by the Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs, and to set out the method and procedure therefor.

Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs.

Commissioner authorized upon advice of Attorney General, to enjoin unauthorized practice of any profession requiring a license.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs or any of the administrative boards, commissions or officers within the Department of State or otherwise under his supervision, upon the advice of the Attorney General, may maintain as hereinafter provided an action in the name of the Commonwealth for
