property which may now or hereafter be taxable by such city for general revenue purposes, except that no such ordinance shall authorize the imposition of a tax on the wages, salary or net income of any person not a resident of such school district.

Section 2. The ordinance authorizing the tax shall fix the rate thereof, and provide for the levy, assessment and collection of the same. Such taxes shall be levied, assessed and collected in accordance with all provisions, restrictions, limitations, rights of notice and appeal as are applicable to like taxes imposed for city purposes.

Section 3. Nothing in this act shall be deemed to ^{Conditions.} diminish, limit or qualify any power now or hereafter existing to impose, assess, levy or collect any tax or taxes in the manner or by the agency provided by law.

Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P. L. 30), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," by redefining "school nurse."

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Clause (8) of section 1401 of the act of March 10, 1949 (P. L. 30), known as the "Public School Code of 1949," added July 15, 1957 (P. L. 937), is amended to read:

Section 1401. Definitions.—As used in this article—

(8) "School nurse" means [a licensed registered nurse who is assigned to a school district or joint school board, or] a licensed registered nurse properly certificated by the Superintendent of Public Instruction as a school nurse who is employed by a school district or joint school board as a school nurse, or is employed in providing school nurse services to children of school age by a county health unit or a department or board of health of any municipality with which a school district

Act effective immediately.

Ordinance to fix rate and provide for levy, assessment and collection. or joint school board has contracted for school health services pursuant to the provisions of section 1411 of this act. The employment of any nurse employed by a school district or joint school board as a school nurse prior to the effective date of this act shall not be affected by a contract for school health services that may be entered into by any school district or joint school board under the provisions of this act.

Act effective immediately.

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P. L. 30), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," changing the requirements for certain health services.

Public School Code of 1949.

Subsection (a), section 1402, act of March 10, 1949, P. L. 30, added July 15, 1957, P. L. 987, amended. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Subsection (a) of section 1402, act of March 10, 1949 (P. L. 30), known as the "Public School Code of 1949," added July 15, 1957 (P. L. 937), is amended to read:

Section 1402. Health Services.—(a) Each child of school age shall be given by methods established by the Advisory Health Board, (1) a vision test [annually] by a school nurse, medical technician or teacher, (2) a hearing test [employing an audiometer at least once every year in the elementary grades and once every two years in secondary grades] by a school nurse or medical technician, (3) a measurement of height and weight [at least once annually] by a school nurse or teacher, [and] (4) [a chest X-ray by a medical technician when the child is in high school] tests for tuberculosis under medical supervision, and (5) such other tests as the Advisory Health Board may deem *advisable to protect the health of the child. Vision tests shall be given at least annually and other tests at intervals established by the Advisory Health Board.
