annually during the calendar years 1956 or 1957, 1958 or 1959, 1960, 1961, 1962, [or] 1963, 1964 or 1965, there is appropriated for each of said years out of the Motor License Fund an amount equal to the difference between thirty million dollars (\$30,000,000) and the lesser amount provided by section three, which sum shall be paid to the municipalities in accordance with the provisions of section four.

# AN ACT

Amending the act of November 21, 1959 (P. L. 1590), entitled "An act to provide temporary supplemental retirement benefits for certain annuitants of the State Employes' Retirement System, creating a special fund in the custody of the State Treasurer, imposing duties on the State Employes' Retirement Board, and making an appropriation," changing the temporary supple-mental retirement allowance fund for State employes to the temporary supplemental retirement allowance account for State employes and eliminating the requirement of holding moneys therein separate and apart from any other funds or moneys of the Commonwealth.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The title and section 3, act of November 21, 1959 (P. L. 1590), entitled "An act to provide temporary supplemental retirement benefits for certain annuitants of the State Employes' Retirement System, creating a special fund in the custody of the State Treasurer, imposing duties on the State Employes' Retirement Board, and making an appropriation," are amended to read:

### AN ACT

New title.

To provide temporary supplemental retirement benefits for certain annuitants of the State Employes' Retirement System; creating a special [fund] account in the custody of the State Treasurer; imposing duties on the State Employes' Retirement Board; and making an appropriation.

Section 3. (a) There is hereby created as a special [fund] account in the State Treasury, the Temporary Supplemental Retirement Allowance [Fund] Account for State Employes. Such [fund] account shall consist of all moneys appropriated thereto under this act.

(d) The cost of administration of this act shall be borne by the State Employes' Retirement Board.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

### AN ACT

Creating a Legislative Service Agency Committee; defining its powers and duties, and making an appropriation.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsvlvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint four members of the House and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint four senators who, together with the Speaker and the President Pro Tempore as members ex officio, shall constitute a joint committee (1) to make a thorough study of the legislative service agencies of the Commonwealth, their functions and activities, (2) to devise means by which to coordinate and make more effective the several legislative services, and (3) to report its findings and recommendations, together with drafts of legislation to put its recommendations into effect, to the General Assembly not later than the first day of February, 1965. Vacancies in the membership of the committee shall be filled in the manner provided for original appointments.

Section 2. The chairman of the committee shall be appointed by the Speaker and the President Pro Tempore, acting jointly, from among the appointed members. The committee may employ and fix the compensation of an executive director and such counsel, experts, clerks and assistants as may be deemed necessary for the proper conduct of the work of the committee.
