urer to Thaddeus Stevens Trade School and deposited to the credit of an account known as the "Thaddeus Trade School Grounds and Improvement Fund," said fund to be used and administered by the Trustees of Thaddeus Stevens Trade School subject to the approval of all expenditures therefrom by the Superintendent of Public Instruction of the Commonwealth for rehabilitation of the present grounds, together with the buildings and structures thereon, comprising the Thaddeus Stevens Trade School.

Section 5. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

Authorizing cities of the first class to provide for payment of retirement benefits to retired employes without reduction on account of social security benefits.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Penn. First class cities. sylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Any city of the first class may, by ordinance, provide for the payment of retirement benefits to employes who were separated from city employment on or before January 1, 1963, and who become eligible to receive social security benefits, without reduction by reason of any social security benefit earned in covered municipal employment, and may provide that such emploves shall be entitled to receive the full amount of the retirement benefits earned by them in municipal employment.

Social security be benefits may be provided in addi-tion to retire-ment benefits.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

(x) To exercise the powers and perform the duties heretofore by law vested in and imposed upon the Bushy Run Battlefield Commission or upon the Department of Forests and Waters in relation to Bushy Run Battlefield Park.

Section 439. Sanitary Water Board.—The Sanitary Water Board shall consist of the Secretary of Health, who shall be chairman thereof, the Secretary of Forests and Waters, the Secretary of Mines, the Executive Director of the Pennsylvania Fish Commission, the Secretary of Commerce, and three other members.

[Four] Five members of the board shall constitute a quorum.
