

APPROPRIATION ACTS

No. 1-A.

AN ACT

Making appropriations to the Department of Public Welfare for the maintenance of certain hospitals for payment of purchased hospital and post-hospital care.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of nine million five hundred thirty-three thousand twenty dollars (\$9,533,020), or as much thereof as is necessary, is appropriated to the Department of Public Welfare for the period July 1, 1963, to February 29, 1964, to be by it paid to the hospitals hereinafter designated in the amounts hereinafter specified for the purpose of the maintenance of such hospitals in accordance with the rules and regulations issued by the Department of Public Welfare and the Department of the Auditor General as prescribed by law at the rate of ten dollars (\$10) per diem but not to exceed the regularly established ward rate, nursery rate, pediatric rate or any lesser rate contracted between the hospital and patient for the medical and surgical services rendered to, and maintenance of, persons treated in the hospital, who are entitled to free service, such rates to include only room, board and general bed care but not to exceed rates charged other classes of patients or the actual cost to the hospital of such services and maintenance, whichever is the least, and all moneys received on account of the care of the patient, shall be reported as a credit against the gross earnings of free and part-pay service chargeable against this appropriation: Provided, That no payment shall be made from this appropriation for services rendered to persons aged sixty-five or over by any hospital hereinafter designated that is qualified to receive payments for medical assistance for the aged under the Public Assistance Law:

Section 2. The sum of eight hundred forty-nine thousand six hundred ten dollars (\$849,610) or as much thereof as is necessary, is appropriated to the Department of Public Welfare for the period July 1, 1963, to June 30, 1964, to be by it paid to the hospitals hereinafter designated in the amounts hereinafter specified for the purpose of the maintenance of such hospitals in accordance with the rules and regulations issued by the Department of Public Welfare and the Department of the Auditor General as prescribed by law at the rate of ten dollars (\$10) per diem but not to exceed the regularly established ward rate, nursery rate, pediatric rate or any lesser rate contracted between the hospital and the patient for the medical and surgical services rendered to, and maintenance of, persons treated in the hospital, who are entitled to free service, such rates to include only room, board and general bed care but not to exceed rates charged other classes of patients or the actual cost to the hospital of such services and maintenance, whichever is the least, and all moneys received on account of the care of the patient shall be reported as a credit against the gross earnings of free and part-pay service chargeable against this appropriation: Provided, That no payments shall be made from this appropriation for services rendered by any hospital hereinafter desig-

Section 3. The amounts specified in section 1 which are not necessary to pay the hospitals named therein for free service rendered before March 1, 1964, shall lapse. The total amount so lapsed or so much thereof as is necessary is hereby reappropriated to the Department of Public Welfare for the payment of purchased hospital and post-hospital care as authorized by the act of June 24, 1937 (P. L. 2051), as amended.

Section 4. Except in cases of accident or emergency, only bona fide residents of Pennsylvania shall be entitled to the free service provided for in this act.

Section 5. All hospitals named in sections 1 and 2 shall file a report with the Department of the Auditor General within ninety days of the last day of each quarter. Failure to file the report timely as required hereunder shall disqualify the institution from receiving an appropriation for the quarter covered by the untimely filed report.

Section 6. The sum of four million seven hundred sixty-six thousand two hundred ninety dollars (\$4,766,290), or so much thereof as is necessary, is appropriated to the Department of Public Welfare for the period March 1, 1964, to June 30, 1964, for the payment of purchased hospital and post-hospital care as authorized by the act of June 24, 1937 (P. L. 2051), as amended.

Section 7. This act shall take effect immediately.

APPROVED—The 19th day of December, A. D. 1963, except as to the following items:

Section 2 which provides as follows:

To the Department of Public Welfare

“The total sum approved in Section 2 is seven hundred ninety-four thousand six hundred ten dollars (\$794,610). I withhold my approval from the item which provided fifty-five thousand dollars (\$55,000) for the Hahnemann Medical College and Hospital for the reason that funds are provided in Section 1 for this hospital and this additional appropriation is therefore a vain thing.”

Section 6 which provides as follows:

“The total sum approved in Section 6 is four million six hundred sixty-two thousand two hundred ninety dollars (\$4,662,290). I withhold my approval from the sum of one hundred four thousand dollars (\$104,000) for the reason that Section 2 was increased by that amount and, since only the total sum of fourteen million nine hundred eighty-nine thousand nine hundred twenty dollars (\$14,989,920) is available for the several purposes of this Act, it is necessary that Section 6 be reduced by a corresponding amount.”

No. 2-A.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the Moore College of Art, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Moore College of Art, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, for the fiscal year July 1, 1963, to June 30, 1964: Provided, That in such school there shall be maintained a free one-year scholarship, annually, for one pupil of each senatorial district in the State to be filled by appointment of the Senator of each such district.

No. 3-A.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act of April 1, 1863 (P. L. 213), entitled “An act to accept the grant of Public Lands, by the United States, to the several states, for the endowment of Agricultural Colleges,” making an appropriation for carrying the same into effect.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. In order to carry into effect the act of Congress, approved July 2, 1862, granting public land to the several states for educational purposes and subsequent acts of Congress related thereto, and the act of the Legislature of Pennsylvania accepting the provisions and conditions of said acts of Congress and pledging the faith of the State to carry the same into effect, the sum of twenty-five million ninety thousand dollars (\$25,090,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the trustees of the

Pennsylvania State University for the fiscal year July 1, 1963, to June 30, 1964, for the following purposes and in the amounts as shown:

(1) For the general maintenance of instruction, research and extension in the College of Agriculture, the Mont Alto State Forest School, the College of Business Administration, the College of Engineering and Architecture, the College of Liberal Arts, the College of Home Economics, the College of Mineral Industries, the College of Chemistry and Physics, the College of Education, the Graduate School, the College of Physical Education and Athletics, the General Extension Services, and for the general maintenance of other schools, departments, offices and services, including repairs and improvements to the grounds and buildings, service of light, heat, power, water and sewage disposal, salaries and wages, materials, supplies, equipment, books and periodicals, insurance and interest, and such other expenditures as the trustees may deem necessary and practicable but the total sum of such expenditures shall not exceed twenty-two million seven hundred seven thousand seven hundred dollars (\$22,707,700).

(2) For payment into the Social Security Contribution Fund the following sum, or as much thereof as may be necessary, in paying the University's share of Social Security taxes with respect to compensation of employes of the Pennsylvania State University, nine hundred thousand dollars (\$900,000).

(3) For purchase of movable equipment for new buildings constructed by the General State Authority, one million one hundred seventy-four thousand dollars (\$1,174,000).

(4) For the purpose of carrying on research and investigation to discover by-products of anthracite and bituminous coal and uses therefor, of developing new scientific, chemical, industrial, domestic and other uses and new and extended markets for anthracite coal and its products, and for employing engineers, chemists, technical experts, assistants, clerks, stenographers and other employes, and purchasing such machinery, supplies, equipment, apparatus and other things necessary in the furtherance of the aforesaid research and investigation, to be used by the College of Mineral Industries under the supervision of the State Department of Mines and Mineral Industries. Monies shall be expended for this purpose only to the extent that a sum equal to fifty per centum of thirty-seven thousand eight hundred dollars (\$37,800), the amount to be expended by the Commonwealth, is contributed to the Pennsylvania State University by the members of the anthracite and bituminous coal industry. Affidavits evidencing such contributions shall be submitted by the University to the Auditor General.

(5) For the purpose of carrying on research and investigation of long-range problems affecting the mineral industries. No more shall be expended for this purpose *than may be required to match an equal sum contributed to the University by one or more industries for such research and investigation. The total contribution by the Commonwealth shall not exceed thirty-one thousand fifty dollars (\$31,050).

Affidavits evidencing such contributions shall be submitted by the University to the Auditor General.

(6) The support of research and investigation of basic problems affecting the slate and other nonmetallic mineral industries, eighteen thousand nine hundred dollars (\$18,900).

(7) For the support of research and investigation of long-range basic problems affecting the mineral industries, seventeen thousand five hundred fifty dollars (\$17,550).

(8) For the use of the College of Agriculture for expenditure by the Agricultural Experiment Station for the support of research and investigation directed toward the development and production of superior strains of crops and livestock and to develop more efficient methods of producing and marketing such products, eighty-one thousand dollars (\$81,000).

(9) For the maintenance and the support of research and experimental investigation on problems relating to the petroleum industry of the State, seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000).

(10) For the use of the School of Agriculture, for expenditure by the *Agricultural Experiment Station for the erection of experimental mushroom houses and research in the communicable diseases of mushrooms and other phases of the mushroom industry, twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000).

(11) For the use of the School of Agriculture, for expenditures by the Agricultural Experiment Station for research and investigation of mastitis in the dairy cattle, twenty-seven thousand dollars (\$27,000).

AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the City of Harrisburg, Pennsylvania.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the City of Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, as compensation for protection from and extinguishment of any fire or fires that may occur in or on the Capitol buildings or grounds for the fiscal year July 1, 1963, to June 30, 1964.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation to Sleighton Farm School for Girls in Delaware County, Pennsylvania.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of five hundred fifty-eight thousand dollars (\$558,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to Sleighton Farm School for Girls in Delaware County, Pennsylvania, for the fiscal year July 1, 1963, to June 30, 1964, for maintenance.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the Carnegie Museum for maintenance and the purchase of apparatus, supplies and equipment.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of thirty-seven thousand two hundred sixty dollars (\$37,260), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Carnegie Museum at Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, for the fiscal year July 1, 1963, to June 30, 1964, for maintenance and the purchase of apparatus, supplies and equipment.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the Delaware Valley College of Science and Agriculture at Doylestown, Pennsylvania.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of eighty thousand dollars (\$80,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Delaware Valley College of Science and Agriculture at Doyles-

town, Pennsylvania, for the fiscal year July 1, 1963, to June 30, 1964, for maintenance to be paid according to law.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the Berean Manual Training School at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of fifty-eight thousand five hundred forty-seven dollars (\$58,547), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Berean Manual Training School at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, for the fiscal year July 1, 1963, to June 30, 1964, for the maintenance of said school and the purchase of such apparatus and equipment as the trustees may deem necessary for the best interests of the school.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the Trustees of the Mary Bailey Foundation for Heart and Great Vessel Research.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of seventeen thousand five hundred dollars (\$17,500), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Health for the Trustees of the Mary Bailey Foundation for Heart and Great Vessel Research at the Hahnemann Hospital, Philadelphia, for research on the prevention, diagnosis and treatment of diseases of the heart and blood vessels with special emphasis on the development of certain heart operations and the care of cardiac patients, the work of the foundation being fully set forth in Appropriation Act No. 140A, approved June 1, 1956.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1963.

No. 10-A.

AN ACT

Making appropriations to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the general maintenance and operation of the University, for the School of Medicine and for the Library School.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of three million five hundred seventeen thousand eighty-five dollars (\$3,517,085), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal year July 1, 1963, to June 30, 1964, for the general maintenance of the University of Pittsburgh and for the purchase of such apparatus and equipment as the trustees may deem necessary for the best interest of the University.

Section 2. The sum of one million one hundred eighty-eight thousand one hundred eighty dollars (\$1,188,180), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal year July 1, 1963, to June 30, 1964, for the general maintenance of the School of Medicine, including the purchase of such apparatus and equipment as the trustees may deem necessary and maintenance of teaching facilities in hospitals for students of the School of Medicine, including the Maternity Dispensary and other dispensaries.

Section 3. The sum of sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal year July 1, 1963, to June 30, 1964, for the general maintenance of the Library School and for the purchase of such equipment as the trustees may deem necessary for the best interest of the University.

Section 4. The sum of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal year July 1, 1963, to June 30, 1964, for a Professorship in Experimental Medicine in the School of Medicine of the University to be known as the Commonwealth Jonas E. Making an appropriation to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the general maintenance and operation of the Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of two million one hundred thirty thousand forty-eight dollars (\$2,130,048), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal year July 1, 1963, to June 30, 1964, for the general maintenance and operation of the Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic by the University of Pittsburgh and the purchase of such apparatus and equipment as the trustees may deem necessary for the best interests of the purposes of the institute and clinic, which purposes shall include the teaching of personnel for the staffs of the various mental institutions of the Commonwealth and the conduct of research in the treatment, prevention and cause of the various types of nervous disorders and mental diseases in compliance with the act of May 20, 1949 (P.
