

The following improvements are included in the appropriation requested and now approved by Governor Scranton for 1965-66.

In addition, the Food Stamp Program has been extended to 5 additional counties.

Furthermore, actual average grants to needy are being increased at a rate even more rapid than the total appropriations.

This is because while the appropriations are going up, the caseload is going down. Thus, Pennsylvania's new prosperity and special programs (e.g. Project Independence) are helping the needy substantially.

Total increase which will actually be received this year by welfare recipients will be up 14.2% since the Scranton Administration took office:

Section 1. The sum of three hundred forty-three thousand five hundred forty-one dollars (\$343,541), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of two million two hundred ninety-seven thousand three hundred thirty-seven dollars (\$2,297,337), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Public Instruction for capital improvement projects for the State colleges and institutions including movable equipment for new projects and various types of general improvements and alterations and construction and for construction projects and equipment under the Higher Education Facilities Act.

In addition to this amount all moneys received from the Federal government for this program shall be paid into the General Fund and credited to this appropriation.

Section 2. Whatsoever of the amount herein appropriated is unexpended and unencumbered as of June 30, 1967, shall lapse.

The sum of one hundred thirteen thousand eight hundred ninety dollars (\$113,890), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission for capital improvement projects for the Museums program, including movable equipment for new projects and various types of general improvements and alterations and construction at the State museums.

Section 2. Making an appropriation to the Department of Mines and Mineral Industries for the purpose of extinguishing, curtailing and preventing the spread of mine refuse bank fires and for the establishing of a pilot plant in a program to eliminate mine refuse bank fires and return the land to useful purposes.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Mines and Mineral Industries for the purpose of extinguishing, curtailing and preventing the spread of mine refuse bank fires which may be starting or spreading or which may start in the future and to take whatever steps that may be necessary, including the establishing of a pilot plant to eliminate mine refuse banks and returning the land to useful purposes. In addition to this amount all moneys received from the Federal Government or from any other source as contributions for this program shall be paid into the General Fund and credited to this appropriation.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1965.

Section 1. The sum of one million three hundred twenty-three thousand one hundred thirty-seven dollars (\$1,323,137), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated out of the General Fund to the Water and Power Resources Board of the Department of Forests and Waters for transfer into the Flood Control Fund in the State Treasury for the purpose of making the same available for the purposes for which such Flood Control Fund is ¹ appropriated by law.

Section 2. In the event that the Flood Control Fund is abolished by legislation prior to the approval of this act, no appropriation shall be made to the Flood Control Fund but the following amounts are specifically appropriated:

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of nine million six hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$9,650,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Commerce to be expended by making grants for housing and redevelopment assistance as authorized by the act of April 12, 1956 (P. L. 1449), and its amendments, and by payment of the costs of administering such act up to but not exceeding an amount equaling two per centum of this appropriation. No more than twenty per centum of the amount herein appropriated shall be allocated or granted to any one political subdivision.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1965.

L. 20), and its amendments.

Making an appropriation to the Department of Health for payments to municipalities and municipality authorities under the provisions of the act of August 20, 1953 (P. L. 1217), entitled "An act providing for payments by the Commonwealth to municipalities which have expended money to acquire and construct sewage treatment plants in accordance with the Clean Streams Program and the act, approved the twenty-second day of June, one thousand nine hundred thirty-seven (Pamphlet Laws 1987), and making an appropriation," and its amendments and for the repair, improvements or additions of certain sewage treatment plants.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of seven million forty thousand eight hundred forty-seven dollars (\$7,040,847), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Health for payments to municipalities and municipality authorities toward the cost of maintaining, repairing, replacing and other expenses relating to, sewage treatment plants an amount not to exceed two per centum of the cost (1) for the acquisition and construction of the sewage treatment plants by the municipalities and municipality authorities to control stream pollution expended by the municipalities and municipality authorities from the effective date of the act of June 22, 1937 (P. L. 1987) up to and including the thirty-first day of December of the year preceding the year in which the payment is made, as ascertained by the Secretary of Health and approved by the Governor, as provided by the act of August 20, 1953 (P. L. 1217), entitled "An act providing for payments by the Commonwealth to municipalities which have expended money to acquire and construct sewage treatment plants in accordance with the Clean Streams ¹ Program and the act, approved the twenty-second day of June, one thousand nine hundred thirty-seven (Pamphlet Laws 1987), and making an appropriation," and its amendments and (2) for the repair, improvements or additions since 1937 of plants constructed prior to that date.

Section 2. Within the meaning of this act, the word "construction" shall include, in addition to the construction of new treatment works, pumping stations and intercepting sewers which are an integral part of the treatment facilities (including those intercepting sewers of municipalities which collect at least fifty per cent of the sewage of the municipality which enters a public sewage system in the municipality and discharge same into the collection system of the municipality which

has constructed the main sewage plant), the altering, improving or adding to of existing treatment works, pumping stations and intercepting sewers which are essential to the sewage treatment plant system.

Section 3. If any section, sentence, clause or part of this act is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, the decision of the court shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions of this act. It is hereby declared as the legislative intent that this act would have been adopted had such unconstitutional sentence, section, clause or part thereof not been included herein.

Section 1. The sum of twelve million four hundred twenty thousand dollars (\$12,420,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Commerce for the Pennsylvania Industrial Development Authority [, except as hereinafter provided] for the purposes set forth in the act of May 17, 1956 (P. L. 1609), the "Pennsylvania Industrial Development Authority Act." Such power shall include, but not be limited to, the power to enter into contracts and agreements for the housing and maintenance of those patients presently housed at Torrance State Hospital for whom adequate facilities do not exist, at other locations, either public or private, and to make

such other expenditures as may be necessary to properly accommodate and care for such patients, within the limits of the appropriation made by this act.

Section 3. In carrying out the activities to alleviate the overcrowded conditions at Torrance State Hospital, for which the funds herein appropriated are to be used, the department shall have the advice of a committee, three of whom shall be members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker thereof, and three of whom shall be members of the Senate, appointed by the President Pro Tempore thereof.

Section 4. The committee shall make a report of its activities to the Governor and to the General Assembly as soon as possible after carrying out the purposes for which it was created. The existence of the committees shall terminate upon the making of its report.

Section 5. The funds hereby appropriated which remain unexpended or unencumbered on June 30, 1966, shall lapse as of that date.

Section 6. This act shall take effect immediately.

HB 916

Making an appropriation to the Department of Public Welfare; authorizing the Secretary of Public Welfare to perform certain powers and duties in order to establish and maintain youth development centers in the Philadelphia area and creating a temporary legislative¹ advisory committee.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of six hundred thousand dollars (\$600,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Department of Public Welfare to be expended for the purposes hereinafter stated.

The sum appropriated shall be paid on warrant of the Auditor General in favor of the Secretary of Public Welfare on the presentation of his requisition for the same. The Secretary of Public Welfare shall, prior to final adjournment of the 1965 Session of the General Assembly, file

an account with the Auditor General of all of the expenditures from this appropriation.

Section 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law, the Secretary of Public Welfare shall have the power to immediately undertake whatever action may be necessary to establish and maintain youth development centers in the Philadelphia area in order to cope with the emergency which exists due to a rapid increase in juvenile delinquency and a resultant shortage of facilities for the care and retraining of juvenile delinquents. Such power shall include, but not be limited to, the power to enter into contracts and agreements for the use of either or both the Marine Barracks site at the Naval Ammunition Depot or the Fort Mifflin site in southwest Philadelphia, or any other site or sites determined by the Secretary of Public Welfare to be suitable for youth development centers, and to make such other expenditures as may be necessary to properly accommodate and care for committed juveniles at the centers so established within the limits of the appropriation made by this act.

Section 3. In the selection of sites and in other matters connected with the establishment of youth development centers, for which the funds herein appropriated are to be used, the Department shall have the advice of a committee, three of whom shall be members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker thereof, and three of whom shall be members of the Senate, appointed by the President Pro Tempore thereof.

Section 4. The committee shall make a report of its activities to the Governor and to the General Assembly as soon as possible after carrying out the purposes for which it was created. The existence of the committee shall terminate upon the making of its report.

Section 5. The funds hereby appropriated which remain unexpended or unencumbered on June 30, 1966, shall lapse as of that date.

Section 6. This act shall take effect immediately.

Making an appropriation to the Department of Public Instruction for the State colleges.

The sum of one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000) is appropriated to the Department of Public Instruction for the fiscal year July 1, 1965, to June 30, 1966 for distribution among the State colleges, in the amounts which were lapsed at each State college, under the provisions of section 9 of the "General Appropriation Act of 1964." Such funds shall be used for the purposes for which they were originally appropriated.

The sum of nine million four hundred twenty-eight thousand four hundred forty-two dollars (\$9,428,442), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal year July 1, 1965, to June 30, 1966, for the general maintenance of the University of Pittsburgh and for the purchase of such apparatus and equipment as the trustees may deem necessary for the best interest of the university.

Section 2. The sum of one million two hundred ninety-one thousand six hundred twenty dollars (\$1,291,620), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal year July 1, 1965, to June 30, 1966, for the general maintenance of the School of Medicine, including the purchase of such apparatus and equipment as the trustees may deem necessary and maintenance of teaching facilities in hospitals for students of the School of Medicine, including the Maternity Dispensary and other dispensaries.

Section 3. The sum of ninety-eight thousand dollars (\$98,000), or ¹"an" in original.

as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal year July 1, 1965, to June 30, 1966, for the general maintenance of the Library School and for the purchase of such equipment as the trustees may deem necessary for the best interest of the university.

Section 4. The sum of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal year July 1, 1965, to June 30, 1966, for a Professorship in Experimental Medicine in the School of Medicine of the University to be known as the Commonwealth Jonas E. Salk Professorship of Experimental Medicine and to be filled by that member of the medical profession who, in the opinion of the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh, has made an outstanding contribution in the field of experimental medicine.

Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 1965.

A SUPPLEMENT

HB 1549

To the act of April 1, 1863 (P. L. 213), entitled "An act to accept the grant of Public Lands, by the United States, to the several states, for the endowment of Agricultural Colleges," making an appropriation for carrying the same into effect, providing for a tuition supplement to all full-time Pennsylvania resident students, providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated, and requiring reports to the members of the General Assembly.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. In order to carry into effect the act of Congress approved July 2, 1862, granting public land to the several states for educational purposes and subsequent acts of Congress related thereto and the act of

the General Assembly of Pennsylvania accepting the provisions and conditions of said acts of Congress and pledging the faith of the State to carry the same into effect, the sum of thirty million one hundred forty-two thousand dollars (\$30,142,000) or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the trustees of The Pennsylvania State University for the fiscal year July 1, 1965, to June 30, 1966, for the following purposes and in the amounts as shown:

For the general maintenance of instruction, research and extension in the College of Agriculture, the College of Arts and Architecture, the College of Business Administration, the College of Engineering, the College of the Liberal Arts, the College of Home Economics, the College of Mineral Industries, the College of Science, the College of Education, the Graduate School, the College of Health and Physical Education, the Commonwealth Campuses, the Continuing Education Services and for the general maintenance of other schools, departments, offices and services, including repairs and improvements to the grounds and buildings, service of light, heat, power, water and sewage disposal, salaries and wages, materials, supplies, equipment, books and periodicals, insurance and interest and such other expenditures as the trustees may deem necessary and practicable; but the total sum of such expenditures shall not exceed twenty-eight million one hundred ninety-seven thousand seven hundred dollars (\$28,197,700).

(2) For the purpose of carrying on research and investigation to discover by-products of anthracite and bituminous coal and uses therefor; of developing new scientific, chemical, industrial, domestic and other uses and new and extended markets for anthracite coal and its products and for employing engineers, chemists, technical experts, assistants, clerks, stenographers and other employes and purchasing such machinery, supplies, equipment, apparatus and other things necessary in the furtherance of the aforesaid research and investigation, to be used by the College of Mineral Industries under the supervision of the State Department of Mines and Mineral Industries. Moneys shall be expended for this purpose only to the extent that a sum equal to fifty per centum of thirty-seven thousand eight hundred dollars (\$37,800), the amount to be expended by the Commonwealth, is contributed to The Pennsylvania State University by the members of the anthracite and bituminous coal industry. Affidavits evidencing such contributions shall be submitted by the university to the Auditor General.

(3) For the purpose of carrying on research and investigation of long range problems affecting the mineral industries. No more shall be expended for this purpose than may be required to match an equal sum

contributed to the university by one or more industries for such research and investigation. The total contribution by the Commonwealth shall not exceed thirty-one thousand fifty dollars (\$31,050). Affidavits evidencing such contribution shall be submitted by the university to the Auditor General.

(4) The support of research and investigation of basic problems affecting the slate and other nonmetallic mineral industries, eighteen thousand nine hundred dollars (\$18,900).

(5) For research in the diseases of maple trees, ten thousand dollars (\$10,000).

(6) For the general maintenance of instruction, research and extension in graduate centers, two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000).

(7) For the support of research and investigation of long range basic problems affecting the mineral industries, seventeen thousand five hundred fifty dollars (\$17,550).

(8) For the use of the College of Agriculture for expenditure by the Agricultural Experiment Station for the support of research and investigation directed toward the development and production of superior strains of crops and livestock and to develop more efficient methods of producing and marketing such products, eighty-one thousand dollars (\$81,000).

(9) For the maintenance and the support of research and experimental investigation or problems relating to the petroleum industry of the State, seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000).

(10) For the use of the College of Agriculture for expenditure by the Agricultural Experiment Station for research in the communicable diseases of mushrooms, marketing, engineering and other phases of the mushroom industry, fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000).

(11) For the use of the College of Agriculture for expenditure by the Agricultural Experiment Station for research and investigation of mastitis in the dairy cattle, twenty-seven thousand dollars (\$27,000).

(12) For a tuition supplement the sum of eight hundred sixty thousand dollars (\$860,000). The moneys so appropriated by this clause shall be applied by The Pennsylvania State University starting January 1, 1966, solely for the purpose of reducing the tuition and fee rate charged during the fiscal year July 1, 1964, to June 30, 1965, to full-time Pennsylvania resident students in all schools and divisions of the university at its main campus, by such amounts as are necessary to establish for three quarter terms of the fiscal year July 1, 1965 to June 30, 1966, starting January 1, 1966, a uniform quarter term tuition and fee rate of one hundred fifty dollars (\$150). The funds appropriated under this

clause may be used by The Pennsylvania State University for the same purposes as tuition and fees received from students.

(13) For a tuition supplement the sum of five hundred forty-one thousand dollars (\$541,000). The moneys so appropriated by this clause shall be applied by The Pennsylvania State University starting January 1, 1966, solely for the purpose of reducing the tuition and fee rate charged during the fiscal year July 1, 1964, to June 30, 1965, to full-time Pennsylvania resident students in all schools and divisions of the university at its Commonwealth campuses, by such amounts as are necessary to establish for three quarter terms of the fiscal year July 1, 1965, to June 30, 1966, a uniform quarter term tuition and fee rate of one hundred thirty dollars (\$130). The funds appropriated under this clause may be used by The Pennsylvania State University for the same purposes as tuition and fees received from students.

Section 3. It shall be a condition of this appropriation that the quarter term tuition and fee rate charged to residents of Pennsylvania in all schools and divisions of the university shall not exceed one-third of the rate charged to nonresidents of Pennsylvania.

Section 4. For the purpose of assuring the proper accountability on the part of Pennsylvania State University for the expenditure of the amounts appropriated by this act, The Pennsylvania State University shall establish a Commonwealth Appropriation Account into which only the amounts appropriated by this act shall be credited when received. The Pennsylvania State University shall apply the moneys in the Commonwealth Appropriation Account only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than ninety days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, The Pennsylvania State University shall file with the General Assembly and with the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from both the Commonwealth Appropriation Account and other university accounts during said fiscal year. Such statement of expenditures shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the Commonwealth Appropriation Account, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by The Pennsylvania State University to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth. In respect to expenditures made by the university from accounts other than the Commonwealth Appropriation Account, the Auditor General shall have the right of review only and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning said expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require. As to the moneys appropriated for the purposes specified in section 1, clauses (12) and (13), the Auditor General shall determine that the required number of full-time Pennsylvania resident students have been charged the specified tuition rate, that the ratio of resident rates to non-resident rates prescribed by section 3 hereof have been maintained, and the bona fides of the residence of those claiming to be Pennsylvania residents.

Section 5. The colleges carrying out the research projects hereby authorized shall submit a progress report on each project to each mem-

ber of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania six months after the effective date of this act and a complete report by June 30, 1966.

Section 6. It is the intent of the legislature to provide funds to The Pennsylvania State University to have the normal annual tuition and fee rate for three terms to be four hundred and fifty dollars (\$450) at University Park for full-time Pennsylvania resident students at University Park, and three hundred ninety dollars (\$390) for full-time Pennsylvania resident students at the Commonwealth Campuses.

Section 7. This act shall take effect July 1, 1965.

The sum of one million dollars (\$1,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Public Welfare for the fiscal year July 1, 1965, to June 30, 1966, to be paid to the hospitals hereinafter designated in the amounts hereinafter specified for the purpose of the maintenance of such hospitals in accordance with the rules and regulations issued by the Department of Public Welfare and the Department of the Auditor General as prescribed by law, at the rate of twelve dollars (\$12) per diem but not to exceed the regularly established ward rate, nursery rate, pediatric rate or any lesser rate contracted between the hospital and the patient for the medical and surgical services rendered to and maintenance of persons treated in the hospital who are entitled to free service, such rates to include only room, board and general bed care but not to exceed rates charged other classes of patients or the actual cost to the hospital of such services and maintenance whichever is the least, and all moneys received on account of the care of the patient shall be reported as a credit against the gross earnings of free and part-pay service chargeable against this appropriation: Provided, That no payment shall be made from this appropriation for services rendered by any hospital hereinafter designated that is qualified to receive payments for medical assistance for the aged or purchased hospital care under the Public Assistance Law.

Making appropriations to the Trustees of Temple University at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, for the general maintenance and operation of the university, for a tuition supplement to all full-time Pennsylvania resident students of the university, for the general maintenance of the School of Medicine of Temple University at Philadelphia, and for a tuition supplement to all full-time Pennsylvania resident students of the School of Medicine of Temple University; and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of eleven million five hundred forty-seven thousand two hundred sixty-six dollars (\$11,547,266), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the trustees of Temple University at Philadelphia for the fiscal year of July 1, 1965, to June 30, 1966, for the following purposes and in the amounts as shown:

(1) For the general maintenance of all schools, departments, divisions, offices, and services of the university, with the exception of the School of Medicine, including repairs and improvements to the grounds and buildings, service of light, heat, power, water and sewage disposal, salaries and wages, materials, supplies, equipment, books and periodicals, insurance and interest, and such other expenditures as may be necessary and practicable, but the total sum of such expenditures shall not exceed six million five hundred seventy-seven thousand four hundred sixty dollars (\$6,577,460).

(2) For a tuition supplement the sum of two million nine hundred fifty thousand one hundred eighteen dollars (\$2,950,118). The moneys so appropriated by this clause shall be applied by Temple University solely for the purpose of reducing the tuition and fee rate charged during the second semester of the academic year July 1, 1964, to June 30, 1965, to full-time Pennsylvania resident students in all schools and divisions of the university, with the exception of the School of Medicine, by such amounts as are necessary to establish for the second semester of the academic year July 1, 1965, to June 30, 1966, a uniform tuition and fee rate of two hundred twenty-five dollars (\$225). The funds appropriated under this clause may be used by Temple University for the same purposes as tuition and fees received from students.

(3) For the general maintenance of the School of Medicine, including repairs and improvements to the grounds and buildings, service of light, heat, power, water and sewage disposal, salaries and wages, materials,

supplies, equipment, books and periodicals, insurance and interest, and such other expenditures as may be necessary and practicable, but the total sum of such expenditures shall not exceed one million seven hundred eighty-six thousand seven hundred seventy dollars (\$1,786,770).

(4) For a tuition supplement the sum of two hundred thirty-two thousand nine hundred eighteen dollars (\$232,918). The moneys so appropriated by this clause shall be applied by Temple University solely for the purpose of reducing the tuition and fee rate charged to full-time Pennsylvania resident students in the School of Medicine during the second semester of the academic year July 1, 1964, to June 30, 1965, by an amount necessary to establish a tuition and fee rate of two hundred twenty-five dollars (\$225) for the second semester of the academic year July 1, 1965, to June 30, 1966. The moneys appropriated under this clause may be used by Temple University for the same purposes as tuition and fees received from students.

Section 2. It shall be a condition of this appropriation act that the tuition and fee rate charged to nonresidents of Pennsylvania for the second semester of the academic year July 1, 1965, to June 30, 1966, in all schools and divisions of the university shall be at least three times the rate charged to residents of Pennsylvania, and that provided, tuition supplement sums are made available by the act making appropriations for the next fiscal year the annual tuition and fee rate for full-time Pennsylvania resident students shall be four hundred fifty dollars (\$450) for the academic year July 1, 1966, to June 30, 1967.

Section 3. For the purpose of assuring the proper accountability on the part of Temple University for the expenditure of the amounts appropriated by this act, Temple University shall establish a Commonwealth Appropriation Account into which only the amounts appropriated by this act shall be credited when received. Temple University shall apply the moneys in the Commonwealth Appropriation Account only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than sixty days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, Temple University shall file with the General Assembly and with the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from both the Commonwealth Appropriation Account and other university accounts during said fiscal year. Such statement of expenditures shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the Commonwealth Appropriation Account, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and

to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by Temple University to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth. In respect to expenditures made by the university from accounts other than the Commonwealth Appropriation Account, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning said expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require. As to the moneys appropriated for the purposes specified in section 1, clauses (2) and (4), the Auditor General shall determine that the required number of full-time Pennsylvania resident students have been charged the specified tuition rate, that the ratio of resident rates to non-resident rates prescribed by section 2 hereof have been maintained, and the bona fides of the residence of those claiming to be Pennsylvania residents.

Section 4. In accordance with the provisions of section 8 of the act known as the "Temple University—Commonwealth Act," Act No. 355 of November 30, 1965 (P. L. 843), the Treasurer of the Commonwealth shall make payments of the sums appropriated under this act.

Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 1965.

The sum of one million one hundred thirty-eight thousand one hundred nineteen dollars (\$1,138,119), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pennsylvania for the fiscal year July 1, 1965, to June 30, 1966, for the general maintenance of and for research in the School of Veterinary Medicine of the University and the purchase of such apparatus and equipment as the trustees may deem necessary for the best interests of the School of Veterinary Medicine.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 1965.

Such research shall include (1) an experimental community geriatric clinic for the multidisciplinary evaluation of the aging individual in health and disease with emphasis on preventive health maintenance, early diagnosis of disease, assessment of total performance, capacity fitness for work and retirement, which will be available for all patients who may benefit from the service within the capacity of this clinic, (2) a research ward with beds devoted to controlled nutritional balance studies for specific projects related to chronic diseases of the older individual such as osteoporosis, cardiovascular ¹ disorders, aging, connective tissue disorders and disturbances in the skeletal-muscular system, (3) studies on the physiology of aging with particular reference to the development of criteria and practical tests for the assessment of functional capacity and biological aging, and (4) basic biological research

with particular reference to such aspects as genetic factors in aging, the role of physical activity in age changes and longitudinal studies covering the entire life span and cellular changes accompanying the aging process.

(b) To implement the provisions of this act the hospital may establish a center for aging research and may for that purpose use the moneys hereby appropriated.

Section 3. The Department of Health shall ascertain that the funds appropriated by this act are used by the Lankenau Hospital for the purposes set forth in the act.

Section 3. All payments and expenditures hereunder shall be made on the basis of a contract or contracts entered into between the Pennsylvania Aeronautics Commission and the Pennsylvania Wing Civil Air Patrol, for furnishing of rescue and other aviation services.

expenditures shall not exceed twenty-four million one hundred ninety-seven thousand seven hundred dollars (\$24,197,700).

Section 3. The sum of twelve thousand nine hundred dollars (\$12,-

900), or as much ¹ thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Forests and Waters for capital improvement projects for the Valley Forge Park Commission.

Section 4. The sum of four thousand dollars (\$4,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Forests and Waters for capital improvement projects for the Pennsylvania State Park and Harbor Commission at Presque Isle.

Section 5. The sum of one hundred ten thousand dollars (\$110,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Forests and Waters for the design and construction of a flood wall at the Jordan Creek at Allentown.

Section 6. The sum of two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Department of Forests and Waters to be used for stream clearance and channel rectification consistent with the preliminary engineering work performed by the United States Corps of Engineers and shall consist of the widening, deepening and removal of vegetation and boulders along the channel of Chartiers Creek, approximately from Station 210 + 00 to Station 225 + 00.

Section 7. Whatsoever of the amounts herein appropriated are unexpended or unencumbered as of June 30, 1968, shall lapse.

Section 8. This act shall take effect January 1, 1966.
