AN ACT

HB 93

Making a deficiency appropriation to the Joint State Government Commission.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Joint State Government Commission for payment of the deficiency in the appropriation to the Joint State Government Commission for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1966 for the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the work of the commission as provided in the act of July 1, 1937 (P. L. 2460), to be paid on warrants of the Auditor General in favor of the chairman of the commission on the presentation of his requisition for the same. The chairman shall file an accounting of said expenses with the Auditor General.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

SB 16

Amending the act of July 9, 1965 (Appropriation Act 19-A), entitled "An act to provide for the ordinary expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, interest on the public debt and for public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 1965 to June 30, 1966, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1965," making an appropriation to the Department of Military Affairs for the Pennsylvania Aeronautics Commission, increasing the appropriation to the Pennsylvania Board of Parole and adding an appropriation for the Potomac River Basin Advisory Committee.

APPROPRIATION ACTS,

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 2, in so far as it relates to the Department of Military Affairs and the Pennsylvania Board of Parole, of the act of July 9, 1965 (Appropriation Act 19-A), known as "The General Appropriation Act of 1965," is amended and a paragraph is added thereto to read:

Section 2. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the General Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of the salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expense of the duly elected or appointed officers and employes of the Commonwealth, for payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods, services, printing, equipment, land and buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1965, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1965.

SB 21

Making an appropriation to the Trustees of the Pennsylvania State University, University Park, Pennsylvania.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the Pennsylvania State University, University Park, Pennsylvania, for the establishment, maintenance and operation of a center, for graduate, upper class and associate degree studies, located on property made available by the Federal Government at Olmsted Air Force Base offering courses leading to graduate, undergraduate and associate degrees in the fields of agriculture, business administration, education, engineering, the natural, physical and social sciences, the liberal arts, and such other courses as may be appropriate.

Section 2. Whatsoever of the amount herein appropriated is unexpended or unencumbered as of December 31, 1966, shall lapse.

Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

SB 134

Making a deficiency appropriation to the Legislative Reference Bureau for salaries, wages and necessary expenses.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Legislative Reference Bureau for payment of the deficiency in the appropriation to the Legislative Reference Bureau for the fiscal year July 1, 1965, to June 30, 1966, for the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the work of the Legislative Reference Bureau as provided in the act of May 7, 1923 (P. L. 158), as amended.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

Making a supplemental appropriation to the Department of Commerce for the Pennsylvania Industrial Development Authority.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of five million dollars (\$5,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Commerce as a supplemental appropriation for the Pennsylvania Industrial Development Authority for the purposes set forth in the act of May 17, 1956 (P. L. 1609), known as the "Pennsylvania Industrial Development Authority Act."

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

SB 7

Making an appropriation to the Moore College of Art, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Moore College of Art, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1965, if in such school there is maintained at least one free one-year scholarship annually for at least one pupil of each senatorial district in the State, to be filled by appointment of the Senator of each such district.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

To the act of July 9, 1965 (Appropriation Act No. 19-A), entitled "An act to provide for the ordinary expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, interest on the public debt and for public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 1965, to June 30, 1966, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1965," providing for deficiencies in appropriations made by the act and making additional appropriations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1966.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to the Governor, the Department of Labor and Industry, the Senate and the House of Representatives as follows:

I. EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT

To the Governor

For administration and operation of the Office of Administration \$90,000

To the Department of Labor and Industry

Payments of benefits to partially disabled employes who through subsequent injury become totally disabled as provided in the act of June 21, 1939 (P. L. 520) \$15,000

II. LEGISLATIVE DEPARTMENT

To the Senate

Miscellaneous Expenses:

Incidental Expenses 40,000

For the payment of expenses properly related to the work of the General Assembly including but not limited to compensation and expenses for technical, professional and clerical assistance, expenses connected with transportation, research and studies, including expenses of persons attending meetings, as deemed necessary by a committee consisting of the President Pro Tempore, the Majority Leader, the Assistant Majority Leader and the Majority Caucus Chairman. The sum appropriated shall be paid on warrant of the Auditor General in favor of the Majority Leader of the Senate on the presentation of his requisition for the same. The Majority Leader of the Senate shall not later than thirty days after the termination of his term of office, or until his successor is elected and also within thirty days after the adjournment of any regular or special session, file an account with the Auditor General of such expenses since the filing of the prior account 30,000

For the payment of expenses properly related to the work of the General Assembly including but not limited to compensation and expenses for technical, professional and clerical assistance, expenses connected with transportation, research and studies, including expenses of persons attending meetings, as deemed necessary by a committee consisting of the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Majority Leader, the Assistant Majority Leader and the

Majority Caucus Chairman. The sum appropriated shall be paid on warrant of the Auditor General in favor of the Majority Leader of the House of Representatives on the presentation of his requisition for the same. The Majority Leader of the House of Representatives shall not later than thirty days after the termination of his term of office, or until his successor is elected and also within thirty days after the adjournment of any regular or special session, file an account with the Auditor General of such expenses since the filing of the prior account \$30,000

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

APPROVED—This 7th day of June, A. D. 1966, except for the appropriation to the Governor for the administration and operation of the Office of Administration, which I do not approve, and the appropriation to the Department of Labor and Industry for payments of benefits to the partially disabled employes who through subsequent injury become totally disabled which I approve in the amount of \$2,300. I withhold my approval of the entire amount for the Office of Administration because, due to delay by the General Assembly in acting on the deficiency request, the Governor's Office reduced expenditures and the funds are not necessary for operations for this year. The balance of the amount for Labor and Industry also is not necessary at this time. The total of the five appropriations approved will then be \$222,300.

Section 1. The sum of four hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$450,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary is hereby appropriated to the Department of Forests and Waters for channel excavation, channel clearing and other construction and improvements to Chartiers Creek and Chartiers Creek Valley in the vicinity of the Borough of Carnegie.

Section 2. Whatsoever of the amount herein appropriated is unexpended or unencumbered as of June 30, 1968, shall lapse.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

L. 1609), known as the "Pennsylvania Industrial Development Authority Act," and its amendments.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

Making an appropriation to the Department of Mines and Mineral Industries for the Coal Research Board for study and research.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Mines and Mineral Industries for the Coal Research Board for payment of grants and for study and research in the technology, the economics and the methods of mining, preparing and transporting and marketing of bituminous and anthracite coal and their by-products, and for such other purposes as provided in The Administrative Code of 1929.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

HB 127

Making an appropriation to the Department of Military Affairs for assistance to veterans and their dependents.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of six hundred sixty thousand dollars (\$660,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Military Affairs for the fiscal year July 1, 1966, to June 30, 1967, to provide assistance to veterans and their dependents as provided in the act of November 10, 1959 (P. L. 1468), and its amendments and The Administrative Code of 1929 and its amendments.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

HB 131

Making an appropriation to the Department of Health for payments to municipalities and municipality authorities under the provisions of the act of August 20, 1953 (P. L. 1217), entitled "An act providing for payments by the Commonwealth to municipalities which have expended money to acquire and construct sewage treatment plants in accordance with the Clean Streams Program and the act, approved the twenty-second day of June, one thousand nine hundred thirty-seven (Pamphlet Laws 1987), and making an appropriation," and its amendments and for the repair, improvements or additions of certain sewage treatment plants.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of seven million three hundred ninety-one thousand eight hundred dollars (\$7,391,800), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Health for payments to municipalities and municipality authorities toward the cost of maintaining, repairing, replacing and other expenses relating to, sewage treatment plants an amount not to exceed two percent of the cost (1) for the acquisition and construction of the sewage treatment plants by the municipalities and

municipality authorities to control ¹stream pollution expended by the municipalities and municipality authorities from the effective date of the act of June 22, 1937 (P. L. 1987), up to and including the thirty-first day of December of the year preceding the year in which the payment is made, as ascertained by the Secretary of Health and approved by the Governor, as provided by the act of August 20, 1953 (P. L. 1217), entitled "An act providing for payments by the Commonwealth to municipalities which have expended money to acquire and construct sewage treatment plants in accordance with the Clean Streams Program and the act, approved the twenty-second day of June, one thousand nine hundred thirty-seven (Pamphlet Laws 1987), and making an appropriation," and its amendments and (2) for the repair, improvements or additions since 1937 of plants constructed prior to that date.

Section 2. Within the meaning of this act, the word "construction" shall include, in addition to the construction of new treatment works, pumping stations and intercepting sewers which are an integral part of the treatment facilities (including those intercepting sewers of municipalities which collect at least fifty percent of the sewage of the municipality which enters a public sewage system in the municipality and discharge same into the collection system of the municipality which has constructed the main sewage plant), the altering, improving or adding to of existing treatment works, pumping stations and intercepting sewers which are essential to the sewage treatment plant system.

Section 3. If any section, sentence, clause or part of this act is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, the decision of the court shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions of this act. It is hereby declared as the legislative intent that this act would have been adopted had such unconstitutional sentence, section, clause or part thereof not been included herein.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

HB 146

Making an appropriation to the Department of Military Affairs for payment of pensions to certain blind veterans.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of eighty-one thousand dollars (\$81,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Military Affairs for the fiscal year July 1, 1966, to June 30, 1967, to provide for pensions for veterans blinded through service connected injuries or disease as provided in the act of April 23, 1963 (P. L. 20), and its amendments.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

Making an appropriation to the Treasury Department to pay replacement checks issued in lieu of outstanding checks when presented.

The sum of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Treasury Department for the fiscal year July 1, 1966, to June 30, 1967, for the payment of replacement checks issued by that department in accordance with the provisions of the act of July 31, 1963 (P. L. 426).

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

HB 141

Making an appropriation to the Department of Mines and Mineral Industries for the purpose of extinguishing, curtailing and preventing the spread of mine refuse bank fires and for the establishing of demonstration projects in a program to eliminate mine refuse banks and return the land to useful purposes.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Mines and Mineral Industries for the purpose of extinguishing, curtailing and preventing the spread of mine refuse bank fires which may be starting or spreading or which may start in the future and to take whatever steps that may be necessary including the establishing of demonstration projects to eliminate mine refuse banks and returning the land to useful purposes. In addition to this amount, all moneys received from the Federal Government or from any other source as contributions for this program shall be paid into the General Fund and credited to this appropriation.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

The sum of ninety thousand dollars (\$90,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Forests and Waters for the payment of the cost of manpower, equipment and materials used in the control and extinction of forest fires. In addition to this amount, all moneys received from the Federal Government as contributions for this program shall be paid into the General Fund and credited to this appropriation.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

Making an appropriation to the Department of Public Instruction for a school bonus.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of thirty-four million dollars (\$34,000,000), is hereby appropriated to the Department of Public Instruction to be paid over to the school districts of this Commonwealth as a bonus reimbursement as follows: Each school district may elect to take either its share of the bonus money to be allocated under the provisions of sections 2501, 2502, 2502.1, 2503, 2503.1, 2504, 2504.2, 2504.3 and 2505.1 of the Public School Code of 1949, or it may elect to take two dollars fifty cents (\$2.50) per capita based upon the number of citizens residing in the school district as of the 1960 Federal census. Those school districts which elect to take under the present formula will have their distribution based upon the minimum base of twenty-eight million dollars (\$28,000,000) and they are hereby granted the right to accept their fair share based upon the formula if the total allocation based on the State-wide formula did not exceed twenty-eight million dollars (\$28,000,000).

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

Making an appropriation to the State Treasurer for the purpose of paying salaries and wages of State officers and employes and other ordinary and general expenses in the interim between June 30, 1966 and August 31, 1966, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1966 and for a further temporary period.

Whereas, Under the Constitution and the laws of this Commonwealth the State Treasurer may not pay out any moneys unless they be specifically appropriated by act of the General Assembly; therefore

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of eighty-nine million dollars (\$89,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the State Treasurer of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for the purpose of paying the salaries and wages of the officers and employes and other ordinary and general expenses of the State government in the interim between June 30, 1966 and August 31, 1966, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1966 or on August 31, 1966.

Section 2. Payments out of the appropriation of this act shall be made by the State Treasurer upon requisitions by the several departments, boards, commissions or officers in the same manner as payments are ordinarily made.

Section 3. All amounts paid by the State Treasurer in accordance with this act shall be charged against the appropriations made for the salaries and wages of the officers and employes and other ordinary and general expenses of the State government in the General Appropriation Act and other appropriation acts of 1966.

Section 4. This act shall become effective immediately.

Making appropriations to the Department of Public Welfare and providing for certain allocations therefrom for the purpose of carrying out the Public Assistance Law for the year beginning July 1, 1966 and for the payment of assistance and expenses accrued or incurred prior to and remaining unpaid on June 30, 1966.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of thirty-five million two hundred fifty-two thousand eight hundred sixty-five dollars (\$35,252,865), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Public Welfare for the payment of assistance and administrative expenses for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1966 and for the payment of assistance and administrative expenses incurred prior to and remaining unpaid June 30, 1966, in the following amounts as shown:

(1) For county administration of the public assistance programs as provided in the acts of June 24, 1937 (P. L. 2017, 2045 and 2051), April 23, 1941 (P. L. 20), May 10, 1951 (P. L. 279), July 13, 1953 (P. L. 431), August 9, 1955 (P. L. 323), The Fiscal Code, The Penal Code and the Public School Code of 1949 \$ 4,850,000

In addition to this amount, all moneys received from the Federal Government, or from any other source as contributions for this program, shall be paid into the General Fund and credited to this appropriation. The Department of Public Welfare shall allocate funds from time to time for administrative expenses of the several county boards of assistance, for such administrative expenses incurred by the department which are chargeable to such boards and for the payment of attorney's fees and court costs necessary for the proper conduct of the public assistance programs.

(2) For assistance payments as provided in the acts of June 24, 1937 (P. L. 2017, 2045 and 2051), April 23, 1941 (P. L. 20), May 10, 1951 (P. L. 279), July 13, 1953 (P. L. 431), August 9, 1955 (P. L. 323), The Fiscal Code, The Penal Code and the Public School Code of 1949 30,000,000

In addition to this amount all moneys received from the Federal Government or from any other source as contributions for this program shall be paid into the

General Fund and credited to this appropriation. The Department of Public Welfare shall allocate funds from time to time for the several assistance programs, (Old Age Assistance, Aid to Dependent Children, Aid to Disabled, Blind Pension, General Assistance, Medical Assistance and other programs): Provided, That any rule or regulation adopted by the Secretary of Public Welfare during the fiscal year 1966-67 which adds to the cost of any public assistance program shall only be effective from and after the date upon which it is approved as to availability of funds by the Governor.

(3) For payment by quarterly allocation to the Treasury Department in such amounts as may be deemed necessary for the administrative expenses of such department in disbursing appropriations for or relating to public assistance, including any Federal sums supplementing such appropriations. Such allocations shall be made by the Governor, President Pro Tempore of the Senate, Speaker of the House of Representatives, Secretary of Public Welfare and the State Treasurer or a majority thereof \$ 226,980

(4) For payment by quarterly allocation to the Department of the Auditor General in such amounts as may be deemed necessary for the administrative expenses of such department in auditing appropriations for or relating to public assistance, including any Federal sums supplementing such appropriations. Such allocations shall be made by the Governor, President Pro Tempore of the Senate, Speaker of the House of Representatives, Secretary of Public Welfare and the Auditor General, or a majority thereof 175,885

The sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pennsylvania for the fiscal year July 1, 1966, to June 30, 1967, for the general maintenance of the University of Pennsylvania Museum and the purchase of such apparatus and equipment as the trustees may deem necessary for the best interest of the University of Pennsylvania Museum.

Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

AN ACT

HB 120

Making appropriations to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the general maintenance and operation of the University, for the School of Medicine, for the Library School, for the Jonas E. Salk Professorship, the Allegheny Observatory, and the Computing Center, for a tuition supplement to all Pennsylvania resident students of the University; and provide a method of accounting for the funds appropriated.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of nineteen million seven hundred fifty-seven thousand two hundred dollars (\$19,757,200), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal year July 1, 1966, to June 30, 1967, for the following purposes and in the amounts as shown:

(1) For the general maintenance of all schools, departments, divisions, offices, and services of the University, with the exception of the School of Medicine, the Library School, the Allegheny Observatory, and the Computing Center; including repairs and improvements to the grounds and buildings, service of light, heat, power, water, and sewage disposal, salaries and wages, materials, supplies, equipment, books and periodicals, insurance and interest, and such other expenditures as the trustees may deem necessary and practicable; but the total sum of such expenditures shall not exceed seven million one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$7,150,000).

(2) For a tuition supplement the sum of nine million two hundred sixty-three thousand seven hundred twenty-nine dollars (\$9,263,729). The moneys so appropriated by this clause shall be applied by the University of Pittsburgh solely for the purpose of establishing for full-time and part-time Pennsylvania resident students in all schools and divisions of the University, with the exception of the School of Medicine, a uniform tuition and fee rate of two hundred twenty-five dollars (\$225) per trimester for full-time Pennsylvania resident students and establishing an undergraduate credit-hour rate of fourteen dollars (\$14) and a graduate credit-hour rate of sixteen dollars (\$16) for part-time Pennsylvania resident students during the academic year effective September 1, 1966. The funds appropriated under this clause may be used by the University of Pittsburgh for the same purposes as tuition and fees received from students.

(3) For a tuition supplement the sum of seven hundred eighty-two thousand six hundred eighty-eight dollars (\$782,688). The moneys so appropriated by this clause shall be applied by the University of Pittsburgh solely for the purpose of establishing for full-time and part-time Pennsylvania resident students at the University of Pittsburgh regional campuses at Johnstown, Greensburg, Titusville, and Bradford a uniform tuition of one hundred ninety-five dollars (\$195) per trimester for full-time Pennsylvania resident students and establishing an undergraduate credit-hour rate of fourteen dollars (\$14) and a graduate credit-hour rate of sixteen dollars (\$16) for part-time Pennsylvania resident students during the academic year effective September 1, 1966. The funds appropriated under this clause may be used by the University of Pittsburgh for the same purposes as tuition and fees received from students.

(4) For the general maintenance of the School of Medicine, including repairs and improvements to the grounds and buildings, service of light, heat, power, water, and sewage disposal, salaries and wages, materials, supplies, equipment, books and periodicals, insurance and interest, and such other expenditures as the trustees may deem necessary and practicable, but the total sum of such expenditures shall not exceed one million three hundred forty-six thousand two hundred dollars (\$1,346,200).

(5) For a tuition supplement the sum of two hundred ninety-three thousand five hundred eighty-three dollars (\$293,583). The moneys so appropriated by this clause shall be applied by the University of Pittsburgh solely for the purpose of establishing for full-time and part-time Pennsylvania resident students a uniform tuition and fee rate in the School of Medicine of two hundred twenty-five dollars (\$225) per semester for full-time students and sixteen dollars (\$16) per credit hour for part-time students during the academic year effective September 1, 1966. The funds appropriated under this

clause may be used by the University of Pittsburgh for the same purposes as tuition and fees received from students.

(6) For the general maintenance of the Library School, including repairs and improvements to the grounds and buildings, service of light, heat, power, water, and sewage disposal, salaries and wages, materials, supplies, equipment, books and periodicals, insurance and interest, and such other expenditures as the trustees may deem necessary and practicable, but the total sum of such expenditures shall not exceed one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000).

(7) For the staffing of a baccalaureate professional program in nursing and for the planning, establishment and initial staffing of an associate degree technical program in nursing, the sum of one hundred ninety thousand dollars (\$190,000).

(8) For a Professorship in Experimental Medicine in the School of Medicine of the University to be known as the Commonwealth Jonas E. Salk Professorship of Experimental Medicine to be filled with that member of the medical profession who, in the opinion of the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh, has made an outstanding contribution in the field of experimental medicine, the sum of thirty-one thousand dollars (\$31,000).

(9) For the general maintenance of the Allegheny Observatory, including repairs and improvements to the grounds and buildings, service of light, heat, power, water, and sewage disposal, salaries and wages, materials, supplies, equipment, books and periodicals, insurance and interest, and such other expenditures as the trustees may deem necessary and practicable, but the total sum of such expenditures shall not exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000).

(10) For the general maintenance of the Computing Center, including repairs and improvements to the grounds and buildings, service of light, heat, power, water, and sewage disposal, salaries and wages, materials, supplies, equipment, books and periodicals, insurance and interest, and such other expenditures as the trustees may deem necessary and practicable, but the total sum of such expenditures shall not exceed five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000).

Section 2. For the purpose of assuring the proper accountability on the part of the University of Pittsburgh for the expenditure of the amounts appropriated by this act, the University of Pittsburgh shall establish a Commonwealth Appropriation Account into which only the amounts appropriated by this act shall be credited when received. The University of Pittsburgh shall apply the moneys in the Commonwealth Appropriation Account only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than ninety days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, the Uni-

versity of Pittsburgh shall file with the General Assembly and with the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from both the Commonwealth Appropriation Account and other University accounts during said fiscal year. Such statement of expenditures shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the Commonwealth Appropriation Account, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by the University of Pittsburgh to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth. In respect to expenditures made by the University from accounts other than the Commonwealth Appropriation Account, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning such expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require. As to the moneys appropriated for the purposes specified in section 1, clauses (2), (3), and (5), the Auditor General shall determine that the required number of Pennsylvania residents have been charged the specified tuition rate, and the bona fides of the residence of those claiming to be Pennsylvania residents.

HB 314

Making an appropriation to the Department of Public Instruction for payment of operating grants to community colleges and technical institutes established in accordance with the act of August 24, 1963 (P. L. 1132).

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of three million four hundred thousand dollars (\$3,400,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Department of Public Instruction for payment of approved operating expenses of community colleges and technical institutes as provided by the act of August 24, 1963 (P. L. 1132).

Section 2. If a community college or technical institute receives a Federal grant for operating expenses, the obligation of the Commonwealth as herein provided shall be reduced by fifty percent of the amount of said Federal grant.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

HB 315

Making an appropriation to the Department of Public Instruction for payment to community colleges and technical institutes for capital expenses.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of two million nine hundred thousand dollars (\$2,900,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Department of Public Instruction for payment to community colleges and technical institutes on account of capital expenses an amount equal to one-half of any college's approved annual capital expenses as provided by the act of August 24, 1963 (P. L. 1132).

Section 2. If a community college or technical institute receives a Federal grant for capital expenses, the obligation of the Commonwealth as herein provided shall be reduced by fifty percent of the amount of said Federal grant.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

A SUPPLEMENT

HB 23

To the act of November 30, 1965 (Act No. 355, P. L. 843), entitled "An act providing for the establishment and operation of Temple University as an instrumentality of the Commonwealth to serve as a State-related university in the higher education system of the Commonwealth; providing for change of name; providing for the composition of the board of trustees; terms of trustees, and the power and duties of such trustees; providing for preference to Pennsylvania residents in tuition; providing for public support and capital improvements; authorizing appropriations in amounts to be fixed annually by the General Assembly; providing for the auditing of accounts of expenditures from said appropriations; authorizing the issuance of bonds exempt from taxation within the Commonwealth; requiring the President

to make an annual report of the operations of Temple University," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect, providing for a tuition supplement to all full-time and part-time Pennsylvania resident students, and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of twenty million one hundred six thousand nine hundred ninety-eight dollars (\$20,106,998), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the trustees of Temple University at Philadelphia for the fiscal year of July 1, 1966, to June 30, 1967, for the following purposes and in the amounts as shown:

(1) For the general maintenance of all schools, departments, divisions, offices, and services of the university, with the exception of the School of Medicine, including repairs and improvements to the grounds and buildings, service of light, heat, power, water, and sewage disposal, salaries and wages, materials, supplies, equipment, books and periodicals, insurance and interest, and such other expenditures as may be necessary and practicable, but the total sum of such expenditures shall not exceed nine million three hundred twenty-nine thousand two hundred ninety-eight dollars (\$9,329,298).

(2) For a tuition supplement the sum of seven million eight hundred eighty-seven thousand four hundred fifty dollars (\$7,887,450). The moneys so appropriated by this clause shall be applied by Temple University solely for the purpose of establishing for full-time Pennsylvania resident students in all schools and divisions of the university, with the exception of the School of Medicine, a uniform tuition and fee rate of four hundred fifty dollars (\$450), and establishing an undergraduate credit-hour rate of fourteen dollars (\$14) and a graduate credit-hour rate of sixteen dollars (\$16) for part-time Pennsylvania resident students, effective during the academic year beginning September 1, 1966. The funds appropriated under this clause may be used by Temple University for the same purposes as tuition and fees received by students.

(3) For a tuition supplement the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000). The moneys so appropriated by this clause shall be applied by Temple University solely for the purpose of reducing from four hundred ¹fifty dollars (\$450) to three hundred ninety dollars (\$390), the tuition and fee rate for full-time Pennsylvania resident students, during the academic year July 1, 1966, to June 30, 1967, at the Ambler Campus and at all other extension campuses or centers of the university. The funds appropriated under this clause may be used by Temple University for the same purposes as tuition and fees received from students.

(4) For the general maintenance of the School of Medicine, including repairs and improvements to the grounds and buildings, service of light, heat, power, water, and sewage disposal, salaries and wages, materials, supplies, equipment, books and periodicals, insurance and interest, and such other expenditures as may be necessary and practicable, but the total sum of such expenditures shall not exceed two million two hundred seven thousand two hundred fifty dollars (\$2,207,250).

(5) For the planning, establishment, and initial staffing of a baccalaureate professional program in nursing and of an associate degree technical program in nursing, the sum of two hundred fifteen thousand dollars (\$215,000).

(6) For a tuition supplement the sum of four hundred eighteen thousand dollars (\$418,000). The moneys so appropriated by this clause shall be applied by Temple University solely for the purpose of establishing for full-time Pennsylvania resident students in the School of Medicine during the academic year July 1, 1966, to June 30, 1967, a tuition and fee rate of four hundred fifty dollars (\$450). The moneys appropriated under this clause may be used by Temple University for the same purposes as tuition and fees received from students.

Section 2. It shall be a condition of this appropriation act that the tuition and fee rate charged to full-time students who are non-residents of Pennsylvania, in all schools and divisions of the university, shall be at least two and one-half the rate charged to full-time Pennsylvania resident students, during the academic year July 1, 1966, to June 30, 1967.

Section 3. For the purpose of assuring the proper accountability on the part of Temple University for the expenditure of the amounts appropriated by this act, Temple University shall establish a Commonwealth Appropriation Account into which only the amounts appropriated by this act shall be credited when received. Temple University shall apply the moneys in the Commonwealth Appropriation Account only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than sixty days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, Temple University shall file with the General Assembly and with the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from both the Commonwealth Appropriation Account and other university accounts during said fiscal year. Such statement of expenditures shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the Commonwealth Appropriation Account, to audit and disallow expenditures made for

purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by Temple University to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth. In respect to expenditures made by the university from accounts other than the Commonwealth Appropriation Account, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning said expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require. As to the moneys appropriated for the purposes specified in section 1, clauses (2) and (4), the Auditor General shall determine that the required number of full-time Pennsylvania resident students have been charged the specified tuition rate, that the ratio of resident rates to non-resident rates prescribed by section 2 hereof have been maintained, and the bona fides of the residence of those claiming to be Pennsylvania residents.

Section 4. In accordance with the provisions of section 8 of the act known as the "Temple University—Commonwealth Act," act of November 30, 1965 (Act No. 355, P. L. 843), the Treasurer of the Commonwealth shall make payments of the sums appropriated under this act.

Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

AN ACT

HB 203

To provide for the ordinary expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, interest on the public debt and for the public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 1966, to June 30, 1967, for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1966, and for payments for the support of public schools for the fiscal period from July 1, 1966, to June 30, 1968.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as "The General Appropriation Act of 1966."

Section 2. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the General Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of the salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expense
