sion shall thereupon be terminated.

(c) The word "pension" as used in this section shall be construed to mean the sum of the pension plus the amount of service increments, if any, to which the deceased member of the police pension or retirement fund would have been entitled had he retired upon the date of his death.

(d) When any surviving spouse receives payments under the provisions of this section, such surviving spouse shall not be entitled to any withdrawal of contributions made into the police pension or retirement fund by the deceased employes, nor shall the estate of the deceased be entitled to a refund of said contributions.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

HB 428

Amending the act of May 2, 1889 (P. L. 66), entitled "An act defining and regulating escheats in cases where property is without a lawful owner, and providing for more convenient proceedings relative to the same," further providing for the escheat and disposition of bicycles.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Subsection (f) of section 3, act of May 2, 1889 (P. L. 66), entitled "An act defining and regulating escheats in cases where property is without a lawful owner, and providing for more convenient proceedings relative to the same," added December 8, 1965 (P. L. 1055), is amended to read:

Section 3. * *

(f) This section shall not apply to bicycles. Where the rightful owner thereof is unknown for a period of [two years] six months the

bicycle shall be turned over to the governing body of the municipality or township which has possession. Disposition shall be made in accordance with the provisions relating to the disposition of surplus personal property, or the governing body may, by resolution, donate the

bicycles to a charitable organization.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
