## AN ACT

HB 538

Amending the act of February 1, 1966 (P. L. 1656), entitled "An act concerning boroughs, and revising, amending and consolidating the law relating to boroughs," further regulating the salaries of mayors.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 1025, act of February 1, 1966 (P. L. 1656), known as "The Borough Code," is amended to read:

Section 1025. Salary of Mayor Limited.—The salary of the mayor shall not exceed, per annum, [one hundred dollars (\$100) per thousand] three hundred dollars (\$300) for the first [ten] one thousand

population or fraction thereof, the population to be determined by the latest official census figures. [In any borough with population in excess of ten thousand, the borough council may, by ordinance, fix the salary of the mayor at any sum not exceeding two thousand dollars (\$2000), and in any borough with population in excess of twenty thousand, the borough council may by ordinance fix the salary of the mayor at any sum not exceeding three thousand dollars (\$3000).] In any borough with population in excess of one thousand the salary of the mayor shall not exceed two hundred dollars (\$200)

the salary of the mayor shall not exceed two hundred dollars (\$200)

per annum per thousand population or fraction thereof, the population to be determined by the latest official census figures.

## HB 843

Amending the act of May 2, 1929 (P. L. 1237), entitled "An act affecting marital relations; prescribing grounds and regulating proceedings for divorce and the annulment of bigamous marriages; and amending, revising, and consolidating the law relating thereto," further providing for the entry of judgment for arrearages on an award for alimony pendente lite, counsel fees and expenses.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:
