Section 2. The first paragraph of clause (5) of section 492 of the act, amended August 1, 1963 (P. L. 456), is amended to read:

Section 492. Unlawful Acts Relative to Malt or Brewed Beverages and Licensees.—

It shall be unlawful—

* * *

(5) Sales of Malt or Brewed Beverages by Hotels, Eating Places or Public Service Licensees During Prohibited Hours.—For any hotel or eating place holding a retail dispenser's license, or the servants, agents or employes of such licensees, to sell, trade or barter in malt or brewed beverages between the hours of two o'clock antemeridian Sunday and seven o'clock in the forenoon of the following Monday, or between the hours of two o'clock antemeridian and seven o'clock antemeridian of any week day: Provided, That notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, whenever the thirty-first day of December falls on a Sunday such sales of malt or brewed beverages may be made on such day after one o'clock postmeridian and until two o'clock antemeridian of the following day. For any public service licensee authorized to sell malt or brewed beverages or the servants, agents or employes of such licensees to sell, trade or barter in malt or brewed beverages between the hours of two o'clock antemeridian and seven o'clock antemeridian on any day.

Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

SB 1146

Authorizing the Department of Property and Supplies with the approval of the Governor and the Department of Revenue, to sell and convey certain lots or tracts of ground with improvements thereon in the City of Sharon, Mercer County.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The Department of Property and Supplies, with the

approval of the Governor and the Department of Revenue, is hereby authorized on behalf of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to sell, at public sale to the highest bidder, the following described tract of land with any improvements thereon in the City of Sharon, County of Mercer and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Beginning on the east side of Fifth Street at the southwest corner of land sold by Harry B. Cook to Bert O. Rankin and wife, September 30, 1918; thence south along the east line of Fifth Street, a distance of 30 feet to a point 30 feet north of Silver Street; thence east a distance of 70 feet to lands formerly owned by Charles C. Irvine; thence north along said Irvine lands and lands of William Foxall a distance of 30 feet to the southeast corner of lands of Bert O. Rankin and his wife; thence west along the south line of said Rankin lands a distance of 70 feet to the east line of Fifth Street and place of beginning. Being a part of Lot numbered 82 in C. G. Carver's Addition to Sharon. Being the same premises conveyed to B. M. Cleary by deed of Charles I. Gibson and Anna M. Gibson, his wife; Arthur I. Gibson and Helen M. Gibson, his wife, dated August 12, 1930 and recorded August 19, 1930 in Deed Book O, Volume 14, page 448, Mercer County records.

The conveyance shall be made under and subject nevertheless, to all easements, servitudes and rights of others, including but not confined to streets, roadways, and rights of any telephone, telegraph, water, electric, gas or pipe line companies as well as under and subject, nevertheless, to any estate or tenancies vested in third persons, whether or not appearing of record, for any portion of the said land or improvements erected thereon.

Section 2. The deed of conveyance shall be approved by the Department of Justice and shall be executed by the Secretary of Property and Supplies in the name of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Section 3. All moneys received from the sale of the land herein authorized to be conveyed shall be deposited in the General Fund.

Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
