Section 1. Section 1202 of the act of March 10, 1949 (P. L. 30), known as the "Public School Code of 1949," is amended to read:

Section 1202. State Certificates.—State certificates shall be issued as herein provided. Each such certificate shall set forth the branches which its holder is entitled to teach. No teacher shall teach, in any public school, any branch which he has not been properly certificated to teach.

A certificate to teach shall not be granted or issued to any person not a citizen of the United States, except in the case of exchange teachers not permanently employed and teachers employed for the purpose of teaching foreign languages.

In the case of a resident foreign national holding an immigrant visa

who has declared, in writing, to the Department of Public Instruc-

tion the intention of becoming a citizen of the United States, such

person shall be eligible for a provisional college certificate.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

HB 1562

Amending the act of July 28, 1953 (P. L. 723), entitled "An act relating to counties of the second class; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," providing for the issuance of non-debt revenue bonds for aeronauțical facilities.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Article XXIV, act of July 28, 1953 (P. L. 723), known as the "Second Class County Code," is amended by adding after section 2408, a new section to read:

Section 2409. Issuance of Non-Debt Revenue Bonds for Aeronautical Facilities.—In addition to present methods of financing the same, the county commissioners are empowered to issue non-debt revenue bonds pursuant to provisions of the act of June 25, 1941 (P. L. 159), known as the "Municipal Borrowing Law," and its amendments, to provide sufficient moneys for and toward the acquisition, construction, reconstruction, extension or improvement of aeronautical facilities, including but not limited to airports, terminals, hangars, parking areas and all other facilities either necessary thereto or appropriate therefor, said bonds to be secured solely by the pledge of the whole or part of the fees, rents, tolls or charges derived from the ownership or operation of such facilities or for the use or service of the same.

Said aeronautical facilities financed by the issuance of non-debt revenue bonds as in this section provided may be leased by the county, in whole or in part, to a lessee or lessees for a period of years equal in time to the period of maturity of the bonds so issued.

<u>Included in the cost of the issue may be any costs and expenses in-</u> <u>cident to constructing and financing the facilities and selling and</u> distributing the bonds.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

Amending the act of May 28, 1931 (P. L. 202), entitled, as amended, "An act providing for the registration and regulation of motor boats operated or navigated upon any public stream, artificial or natural body of water, or any river within the Commonwealth; conferring powers and imposing duties on certain police officers, the Pennsylvania Fish Commission and the Navigation Commission for the Delaware River and its navigable tributaries, including the enforcement of certain existing laws; granting powers and imposing duties upon the Department of Revenue; and prescribing penalties," making the Executive Director of the Pennsylvania Fish Commission a member of the Advisory Board for Boating.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Subsection (c) of section 1.2, act of May 28, 1931 (P. L. 202), known as the "Motor Boat Law," added August 14, 1963 (P. L. 808), is amended to read:
