HB 491

Amending the act of June 10, 1947 (Appropriation Act 19-A), entitled “An act making an appropriation to the Department of Commerce out of the Motor License Fund for the use of the Pennsylvania Aeronautics Commission,” requiring the Pennsylvania Aeronautics Commission to follow regular budgetary procedures in accordance with The Administrative Code of 1929.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 1, act of June 10, 1947 (Appropriation Act 19-A), entitled “An act making an appropriation to the Department of Commerce out of the Motor License Fund for the use of the Pennsylvania Aeronautics Commission,” amended August 26, 1953 (Appropriation Act 93-A), is amended to read:

Section 1. So much of the moneys, as shall be determined by the Department of Revenue, in the Motor License Fund as are derived after May thirty-first, one thousand nine hundred forty-seven from the tax on liquid fuels sold for use in aircraft is hereby [specifically appropriated] made available for appropriation to the Department of

Military Affairs for the following purposes—(a) for the proper conduct of the work of the Pennsylvania Aeronautics Commission, including payment of expenses of the commission and the salaries, wages or other compensation of an executive director and other employes; for the payment of general expenses, supplies, printing, equipment and maintenance and repairs of landing fields, intermediate landing fields, landing field equipment, beacon sites, other air navigation facilities, and for the encouragement and development of civil

aeronautics, and (b) for the development and maintenance of State airports; for assistance to political subdivisions and municipal authorities of the Commonwealth in the construction and improvement of airports and other aeronautical facilities, including the making of surveys and plans and the necessary construction work and equipment: Provided, That such appropriations shall be made after the Pennsylvania Aeronautics Commission through the Department of Military Affairs submits to the Budget Secretary specific budget requests to be presented by the Governor to the General Assembly for approval in conformance with and observance of the provisions of sections 601 and 602 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P. L. 177), known as "The Administrative Code of 1929."

SB 830

Making an appropriation to pay the expenses of the Governor's Transportation Study Committee.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated as a subsidy for the fiscal year July 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968 to the Governor's Transportation Study Committee for payment of all expenses of the Governor's Transportation Study Committee to develop a master plan for transportation in the Commonwealth, to make recommendations as to changes in State government required therewith, and to present a plan for the creation of a Department of Transportation.

Section 2. Any portion of this amount not needed for development of the master plan shall be returned to the General Fund.

Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

Making appropriations to the Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency to provide scholarships and educational assistance grants, to provide a reserve to guarantee loans, to provide funds for lender participation incentives, to provide funds for the purpose of assisting approved institutions of higher learning in securing Federal funds for financial aid to students, and to administer the agency and otherwise carry out the provisions of the act of August 7, 1963 (P. L. 549), as amended, and the act of January 25, 1966 (P. L. 1546).

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums are hereby specifically appropriated to the Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency for the fiscal year July 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968 to be deposited in the General Fund for the following uses and purposes:

(a) For payment of scholarships and educational assistance grants under the provisions of the act of January 25, 1966

(P. L. 1546) ..... \$31,500,000

(b) For the purpose of assisting institutions of higher learning in securing Federal student aid funds, to be used as financial aid to students in meeting their costs of attendance at such institutions under the provisions of the act of January 25, 1966

(P. L. 1546) ..... \$2,100,000

(c) For the purpose of administering the programs of the agency authorized under the act of August 7, 1963 (P. L. 549), as amended and the act of January 25, 1966 (P. L. 1546) ..... \$1,088,206

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

Section 1. The sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for the fiscal year July 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968 to the Secretary of the Senate and the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives, for the purchase of Pennsylvania flags to be sent to residents of Pennsylvania serving in the armed forces of the United States, overseas, who request such flags.

Making an appropriation to the Preparatory Committee authorized by the act of March 15, 1967 (P. L. 2).

L. 2), entitled "An act providing for a constitutional convention with limited powers; providing for a referendum on the question; providing for the selection, nomination and election of delegates; defining the powers and duties of the convention; providing for its operation; conferring powers and imposing duties on the Governor, the Secretary of the Commonwealth, officers of the General Assembly and County Election Boards; providing for a referendum on the convention's report and making an appropriation," for the purposes set forth in section 5 of said act.

Making an appropriation to the Department of Mines and Mineral Industries for payment into the Anthracite Coal Open Pit Mining Reclamation Fund as additional funds to administer and enforce the act of August 13, 1963 (P. L. 781).

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of sixty seven thousand five hundred twenty seven dollars (\$67,527), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Mines and Mineral Industries for the fiscal year July 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968, for payment into the Anthracite Coal Open Pit Mining Reclamation Fund, to provide additional funds to administer and enforce the Anthracite Coal Open Pit Mining Conservation Act, the Act of August 13, 1963 (P. L. 781), as amended.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1967.

SB 1198

Making an appropriation to the Department of Military Affairs from restricted revenue in the Motor License Fund to be used by the Pennsylvania Aeronautics Commission for the encouragement and development of aeronautics.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of one million two hundred seventy-seven thousand four hundred thirty-eight dollars (\$1,277,438), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated from the restricted revenue account for aviation fuel taxes in the Motor License Fund to the Department of Military Affairs for the fiscal period November 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968, to be used by the Pennsylvania Aeronautics Commission for the encouragement and develop-

ment of aeronautics, for the development and maintenance of State airports, for assistance to political subdivisions and municipal authorities of the Commonwealth in the construction and improvement of airports and other aeronautical facilities, including the making of surveys and plans and the necessary construction work and equipment: Provided, however, That no more shall be expended from this item for such purposes or any of them than may be required to match an equal sum contributed by any political subdivision or municipal authority of the Commonwealth or by the Federal government, or by a political subdivision or municipal authority and the Federal government as provided in the act of May 2, 1947 (P. L. 136).

Section 2. This act shall take effect November 1, 1967.

SB 1199

Making an appropriation to the Department of Military Affairs from restricted revenue in the Motor License Fund for the use of the Pennsylvania Aeronautics Commission.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of one million four hundred fourteen thousand five hundred sixty-eight dollars (\$1,414,568), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated from the restricted revenue account for aviation fuel taxes in the Motor License Fund to the Department of Military Affairs for the fiscal period November 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968, for the proper conduct of the work of the Pennsylvania Aeronautics Commission, including payment of expenses of the commission and salaries, wages or other compensation of an executive director and other employes; for the payment of general expenses, supplies, printing, and equipment; for the development and maintenance of State airports, and the maintenance and repair of landing fields, intermediate landing fields, landing field equipment, beacon sites, other navigation facilities, and the encouragement and development of civil aeronautics.

Section 2. In addition to this amount, all moneys received from the operations at the State airports, including but not limited to

rentals, concessions, and landing fees, shall be paid into the Motor License Fund and credited to this appropriation.

Section 3. This act shall take effect November 1, 1967.

The sum of nineteen thousand two hundred forty-six dollars (\$19,246), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Commerce to pay the Commonwealth's share of expenses for participation in an operation of the office of Appalachian States' Regional Representative for the fiscal year July 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1967.

Section 2. Whatsoever of the amount herein appropriated unexpended or unencumbered as of June 30, 1969 shall lapse.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1967.

L. 426).

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1967.

Section 2. Whatsoever of the amount herein appropriated is unexpended or unencumbered as of June 30, 1969, shall lapse.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1967.

The sum of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Department of Agriculture for the fiscal year July 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968 for the State Soil and Water Conservation Commission for employment of executive assistants for local soil and water conservation districts, the assistance to be available on a fifty per cent cost sharing basis, not to exceed five thousand dollars (\$5,000) per district per year for the State's share.

The sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Department of Agriculture for the fiscal year July 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968 for use by the State Soil and Water Conservation Commission for making cost-sharing payments to local sponsors for support of small watershed projects. The cost-sharing basis shall be twenty-five per cent Commonwealth and seventy-five per cent by the local sponsor.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1967.

Making an appropriation to the Department of Commerce for the Pennsylvania Industrial Development Authority.

The sum of twenty-five million dollars (\$25,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Commerce for the Pennsylvania Industrial Development Authority for the fiscal year July 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968, for the purposes set forth in the act of May 17, 1956 (P. L. 1609), known as the "Pennsylvania Industrial Development Authority Act," and its amendments.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

Section 1. The sum of five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Commerce for the fiscal year July 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968 for payment of grants to recognized industrial development agencies to assist such agencies in the financing of their operational costs for the purposes of making studies, surveys and investigations, the compilation of data and statistics and in the carrying out of planning and promotional programs.

Section 2. Expenditures of the funds appropriated in section 1, shall be made by the Department of Commerce in accordance with the provisions of the Industrial Development Assistance Law, act of May 31, 1956 (P. L. 1911), and its amendments.

The sum of eight hundred thousand dollars (\$800,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Department of Commerce for the fiscal year July 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968, for the purpose of making grants and providing assistance to tourist promotion agencies pursuant to the act of April 28, 1961 (P. L. 111), known as the "Tourist Promotion Law."

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

The sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Commerce for the fiscal year July 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968 for the payment of grants to Appalachian Local Development Districts as authorized by the Administrative Code of 1929 as amended. In addition to this amount, all moneys received from the Federal Government or from any other source as contributions for this program shall be paid into the General Fund and credited to this appropriation.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1967.

The sum of one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Forests and Waters for the fiscal year July 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968 for the payment of the cost of manpower, equipment and materials used in the control and extinction of forest fires. In addition to this amount, all moneys received from the Federal government as contributions for this program shall be paid into the General Fund and credited to this appropriation.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1967.

Making an appropriation to the Water and Power Resources Board of the

Department of Forests and Waters for transfer into the Flood Control Fund for flood control purposes.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of one million four hundred forty-nine thousand six dollars (\$1,449,006), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated out of the General Fund to the Water and Power Resources Board of the Department of Forests and Waters for the fiscal year July 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968 for transfer into the Flood Control Fund in the State Treasury for the purpose of making the same available for the purpose for which such Flood Control Fund is appropriated by law.

Section 2. In the event that the Flood Control Fund is abolished by legislation prior to the approval of this act, no appropriation shall be made to the Flood Control Fund but the following amounts are specifically appropriated.

Making an appropriation to the Department of Health for payments to municipalities and municipality authorities under the provisions of the act of August 20, 1953 (P. L. 1217), entitled "An act providing for payments by the Commonwealth to municipalities which have expended money to acquire and construct sewage treatment plants in accordance with the Clean Streams Program and the act, approved the twenty-second day of June, one thousand nine hundred thirty-seven (Pamphlet Laws 1987), and making an appropriation," and its amendments and for the repair, improvements or additions of certain sewage treatment plants.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of seven million eight hundred thousand dollars (\$7,800,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Health for the fiscal year July 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968 for payments to municipalities and municipality authorities toward the cost of maintaining, repairing, replacing and other expenses relating to, sewage treatment plants an amount not to exceed two per cent of the cost (1) for the acquisition and construction of the sewage treatment plants by the municipalities and municipality authorities to control stream pollution expended by the municipalities and municipality authorities from the effective date of the act of June 22, 1937 (P. L. 1987), up to and including the thirty-first day of December of the year preceding the year in which the payment is made, as ascertained by the Secretary of Health and approved by the Governor, as provided by the act of August 20, 1953 (P. L. 1217), entitled "An act providing for payments by the Commonwealth to municipalities which have expended money to acquire and construct sewage treatment plants in accordance with the Clean Streams Program and the act, approved the twenty-second day of June, one thousand nine hundred thirty-seven (Pamphlet Laws 1987), and making an appropriation," and its amendments and (2) for the repair, improvements or additions since 1937 of plants constructed prior to that date.

Section 2. Within the meaning of this act, the word "construction" shall include, in addition to the construction of new treatment works, pumping stations and intercepting sewers which are an integral part of the treatment facilities (including those intercepting sewers of municipalities which collect at least fifty per cent of the sewage of the municipality which enters a public sewage system in the municipality and discharge same into the collection system of the municipality which has constructed the main sewage plant), the altering, improving or adding to of existing treatment works, pumping stations and intercepting sewers which are essential to the sewage treatment plant system.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1967.

The sum of one hundred fifteen thousand three hundred fifty-seven dollars (\$115,357), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Health for capital improvement projects for the Health Rehabilitation Services program, including movable equipment and furnishings for new projects and various types of general improvements and alterations and construction at State hospitals.

Section 2. Whatsoever of the amount herein appropriated is unexpended or unencumbered as of June 30, 1969, shall lapse.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1967.

HB 1704

Making an appropriation to the Department of Health to carry out its powers and duties pursuant to the provisions of the act of January 24, 1966 (P. L. 1535), known as the "Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act."

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of one hundred sixty thousand dollars (\$160,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Health for reimbursement to municipalities toward the costs incurred by them in the enforcement of the act of January 24, 1966 (P. L. 1535), known as the "Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act," in accordance with section 9 thereof.

Section 2. Section 1. The sum of seven million seven hundred seventy-five thousand two hundred forty-five dollars (\$7,775,245), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pennsylvania for the fiscal year July 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968, for the general maintenance of the university and the purchase of such apparatus and equipment as the trustees may deem necessary for the best interest of the university.

Section 2. The sum of two million four thousand eight hundred eighty dollars (\$2,004,880), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pennsylvania for the fiscal year July 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968 for the general maintenance of and for research in the School of Medicine of the university and the purchase of such apparatus and equipment as the trustees may deem necessary for the best interest of the School of Medicine.

Section 3. The sum of one million three hundred fifty-two thousand eight hundred dollars (\$1,352,800), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pennsylvania for the fiscal year July 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968 for the general maintenance of and for research in the School of Veterinary Medicine of the university and the purchase of such apparatus and equipment as the trustees may deem necessary for the best interest of the School of Veterinary Medicine.

Section 4. The sum of ninety-five thousand dollars (\$95,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pennsylvania for the fiscal year July 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968 for the general maintenance of the University of Pennsylvania Museum and the purchase of such apparatus and equipment as the trustees may deem necessary for the best interest of the University of Pennsylvania Museum.

Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 1967.

The sum of three million nine hundred seventy-four thousand three hundred twenty-five dollars (\$3,974,325), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Department of Public Instruction for the fiscal year July 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968 for payment to community colleges and technical institutes on account of capital expenses as provided by the act of August 24, 1963 (P. L. 1132).

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1967.

A SUPPLEMENT

HB 2119

To the act of April 1, 1863 (P. L. 213), entitled "An act to accept the grant of Public Lands, by the United States, to the several states, for the endowment of Agricultural Colleges," making an appropriation for carrying the same into effect, providing for a tuition supplement to all full-time Penn-

sylvania resident students, providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated, and requiring reports to the members of the General Assembly.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. In order to carry into effect the act of Congress, approved July 2, 1862, granting public land to the several states for educational purposes, and subsequent acts of Congress related thereto, and the act of the General Assembly of Pennsylvania accepting the provisions and conditions of said acts of Congress and pledging the faith of the State to carry the same into effect, the sum of forty-eight million four hundred sixty-eight thousand seven hundred sixty-six dollars (\$48,468,766), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the trustees of The Pennsylvania State University for the fiscal year July 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968, for the following purposes and in the amounts as shown:

(1) For the general maintenance of instruction, research, and extension in the College of Agriculture, the College of Arts and Architecture, the College of Business Administration, the College of Engineering, the College of the Liberal Arts, the College of Human Development, the College of Earth and Mineral Sciences, the College of Science, the College of Education, the Graduate School, the College of Health and Physical Education, the Commonwealth Campuses, the Continuing Education Services and for the general maintenance of other schools, departments, offices and services, including repairs and improvements to the grounds and buildings, service of light, heat, power, water and sewage disposal, salaries and wages, materials, supplies, equipment, books and periodicals, insurance and interest and such other expenditures as the trustees may deem necessary and practicable; but the total sum of such expenditures shall not exceed forty-four million three hundred thirty-two thousand nine hundred sixty-six dollars (\$44,332,966).

(2) For the purpose of carrying on research and investigation to discover by-products of anthracite and bituminous coal and uses therefor, of developing new scientific, chemical, industrial, domestic and other uses and new and extended markets for anthracite coal and its products and for employing engineers, chemists, technical experts, assistants, clerks, stenographers, and other employes and purchasing such machinery, supplies, equipment, apparatus, and other things necessary in the furtherance of the aforesaid research and investigation, to be used by the College of Earth and Mineral Sciences under the supervision of the State Department of Mines and Mineral Industries. Moneys shall be expended for this purpose only to the extent that a sum equal to fifty per cent of thirty-seven thousand eight hundred dollars (\$37,800), the amount to be expended by the Common-

wealth, is contributed to The Pennsylvania State University by the members of the anthracite and bituminous coal industry. Affidavits evidencing such contributions shall be submitted by the university to the Auditor General.

(3) For the purpose of carrying on research and investigation of long-range problems affecting the mineral industries. No more shall be expended for this purpose than may be required to match an equal sum contributed to the university by one or more industries for such research and investigation. The total contribution by the Commonwealth shall not exceed thirty-one thousand fifty dollars (\$31,050). Affidavits evidencing such contribution shall be submitted by the university to the Auditor General.

(4) The support of research and investigation of basic problems affecting the slate and other nonmetallic mineral industries, eighteen thousand nine hundred dollars (\$18,900).

(5) For research in the diseases of maple trees, ten thousand dollars (\$10,000).

(6) For the support of research and investigation of long-range basic problems affecting the mineral industries, seventeen thousand five hundred fifty dollars (\$17,550).

(7) For the use of the College of Agriculture for expenditures by the Agricultural Experiment Station for the support of research and investigation directed toward the development and production of superior strains of crops and livestock and to develop more efficient methods of producing and marketing such products, eighty-one thousand dollars (\$81,000).

(8) For the maintenance and the support of research and experimental investigation or problems relating to the petroleum industry of the State, seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000).

(9) For the use of the College of Agriculture for expenditure by the Agricultural Experiment Station for research in the communicable diseases of mushrooms, marketing, engineering and other phases of the mushroom industry, ninety-seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$97,500).

(10) For the use of the College of Agriculture for expenditure by the Agricultural Experiment Station for research and investigation of mastitis in the dairy cattle, twenty-seven thousand dollars (\$27,000).

(11) (i) For a tuition supplement the sum of two million five hundred seventy thousand dollars (\$2,570,000). The moneys so appropriated by this clause shall be applied by The Pennsylvania State University solely for the purpose of establishing for full-time Pennsylvania resident students in all schools and colleges of the university, a tuition and fee rate of one hundred fifty dollars (\$150) per term at University Park and one hundred thirty dollars (\$130) per term at the Commonwealth Campuses. The funds appropriated under this

clause may be used by The Pennsylvania State University for the same purposes as tuition and fees received from students.

(ii) For a tuition supplement the sum of one million one hundred seventy-five thousand dollars (\$1,175,000). The moneys so appropriated by this clause shall be applied by The Pennsylvania State University solely for the purpose of establishing the credit hour rate as follows: Fees for part-time students who are residents of Pennsylvania shall be sixteen dollars (\$16) per credit for all students at University Park Campus; fourteen dollars (\$14) per credit for all students at Commonwealth Campuses Continuing Education Credit Centers; and twelve dollars (\$12) per unit for certificate students; and the fee charged per credit for nonresidents of Pennsylvania in these three categories shall be at least two and one-half times the fee per credit charged for residents of Pennsylvania. The funds appropriated under this clause may be used by The Pennsylvania State University for the same purposes as tuition and fees received from students.

Section 2. It shall be a condition of this appropriation that the quarter term tuition and fee rate charged to full-time nonresidents of Pennsylvania in all schools and colleges of the university shall be three hundred fifty dollars (\$350) per term.

Section 3. The Pennsylvania State University shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than one hundred twenty days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, The Pennsylvania State University shall file with the General Assembly and with the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year. Such statement of expenditures shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the money appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by The Pennsylvania State University to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right of review only and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning said expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require. As to the moneys appropriated for the purposes specified in section 1, clause (11), the Auditor General shall determine that the required number of full-time Pennsylvania resident students have been charged the specified tuition rate, that the ratio of resident rates to nonresident rates prescribed by section 2 hereof have been

maintained, and the bona fides of the residence of those claiming to be Pennsylvania residents.

Section 4. The colleges carrying out the research projects hereby authorized shall submit a complete report on each project to each member of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania by June 30, 1968.

Section 5. It is the intent of the Legislature to provide funds to The Pennsylvania State University to have the normal annual tuition and fee rate for three terms to be four hundred fifty dollars (\$450) for full-time Pennsylvania resident students at University Park, and three hundred ninety dollars (\$390) for full-time Pennsylvania resident students at the Commonwealth Campuses.

Section 6. This act shall take effect immediately.

To the act of July 28, 1966 (Act No. 3, Third Special Session), entitled "An act providing for the establishment and operation of the University of Pittsburgh as an instrumentality of the Commonwealth to serve as a State-related university in the higher education system of the Commonwealth; providing for change of name; providing for the composition of the board of trustees; terms of trustees, and the power and duties of such trustees; authorizing appropriations in amounts to be fixed annually by the General Assembly; providing for the auditing of accounts of expenditures from said appropriations; providing for public support and capital improvements; authorizing the issuance of bonds exempt from taxation within the Commonwealth; requiring the chancellor to make an annual report of the operations of the University of Pittsburgh," making appropriations to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the general maintenance and operation of the University, for the School of Medicine, for the Library School, for staffing programs in nursing, for the Jonas E. Salk Professorship, the Allegheny Observatory, and the Computing Center, for a tuition supplement to all Pennsylvania resident students of the University; and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of twenty-seven million six hundred thirty-four thousand four hundred twenty-seven dollars (\$27,634,427), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal

year July 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968, for the following purposes and in the amounts as shown:

(1) For the general maintenance of all schools, departments, divisions, offices, and services of the University, with the exception of the School of Medicine, the Library School, the Allegheny Observatory, and the Computing Center; including repairs and improvements to the grounds and buildings, service of light, heat, power, water and sewage disposal, salaries and wages, materials, supplies, equipment, books and periodicals, insurance and interest, and such other expenditures as the trustees may deem necessary and practicable; but the total sum of such expenditures shall not exceed eight million four hundred forty-five thousand three hundred twenty-seven dollars (\$8,445,327).

(2) For a tuition supplement the sum of sixteen million two hundred thousand dollars (\$16,200,000). The moneys so appropriated by this clause shall be applied by the University of Pittsburgh solely for the purpose of establishing for full-time and part-time Pennsylvania resident students in all schools and divisions of the University, a uniform tuition and fee rate of two hundred twenty-five dollars (\$225) per trimester for full-time Pennsylvania resident students and establishing an undergraduate credit-hour rate of fourteen dollars (\$14) and a graduate credit-hour rate of sixteen dollars (\$16) for part-time Pennsylvania resident students and for the purpose of establishing at the regional campuses including Johnstown, Greensburg, Titusville and Bradford, a uniform tuition of one hundred ninety-five dollars (\$195) per trimester for full-time Pennsylvania resident students and establishing an undergraduate credit-hour rate of fourteen dollars (\$14) and a graduate credit-hour rate of sixteen dollars (\$16) for part-time Pennsylvania resident students. The funds appropriated under this clause may be used by the University of Pittsburgh for the same purposes as tuition and fees received from students.

(3) For the general maintenance of the School of Medicine, including repairs and improvements to the grounds and buildings, service of light, heat, power, water, and sewage disposal, salaries and wages, materials, supplies, equipment, books and periodicals, insurance and interest, and such other expenditures as the trustees may deem necessary and practicable, but the total sum of such expenditures shall not exceed one million seven hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$1,750,000).

(4) For the general maintenance of the Library School, including repairs and improvements to the grounds and buildings, service of light, heat, power, water and sewage disposal, salaries and wages, materials, supplies, equipment, books and periodicals, insurance and interest, and such other expenditures as the trustees may deem necessary and practicable, but the total sum of such expenditures shall



not exceed one hundred ninety-nine thousand one hundred dollars (\$199,100).

(5) For the staffing of a baccalaureate and graduate professional program in nursing, the sum of two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000).

(6) For a Professorship in Experimental Medicine in the School of Medicine of the University to be known as the Commonwealth Jonas E. Salk Professorship of Experimental Medicine to be filled with that member of the medical profession who, in the opinion of the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh, has made an outstanding contribution in the field of experimental medicine, the sum of thirty-two thousand dollars (\$32,000).

(7) For the general maintenance of the Allegheny Observatory, including repairs and improvements to the grounds and buildings, service of light, heat, power, water, and sewage disposal, salaries and wages, materials, supplies, equipment, books and periodicals, insurance and interest, and such other expenditures as the trustees may deem necessary and practicable, but the total sum of such expenditures shall not exceed eighty thousand dollars (\$80,000).

(8) For the general maintenance of the Computing Center, including repairs and improvements to the grounds and buildings, service of light, heat, power, water, and sewage disposal, salaries and wages, materials, supplies, equipment, books and periodicals, insurance and interest, and such other expenditures as the trustees may deem necessary and practicable, but the total sum of such expenditures shall not exceed six hundred seventy-eight thousand dollars (\$678,000).

Section 2. The University of Pittsburgh shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than ninety days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, the University of Pittsburgh shall file with the General Assembly and with the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year. Such statement of expenditures shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by the University of Pittsburgh to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning such expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require. As to the moneys appropriated for

the purposes specified in section 1, clause (2), the Auditor General shall determine that the required number of Pennsylvania residents have been charged the specified tuition rate, and the bona fides of the residence of those claiming to be Pennsylvania residents.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1967.

L. 843), entitled "An act providing for the establishment and operation of Temple University as an instrumentality of the Commonwealth to serve as a State-related university in the higher education system of the Commonwealth; providing for change of name; providing for the composition of the board of trustees; terms of trustees, and the power and duties of such trustees; providing for preference to Pennsylvania residents in tuition; providing for public support and capital improvements; authorizing appropriations in amounts to be fixed annually by the General Assembly; providing for the auditing of accounts of expenditures from said appropriations; authorizing the issuance of bonds exempt from taxation within the Commonwealth; requiring the President to make an annual report of the operations of Temple University," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect, providing for a tuition supplement to all full-time and part-time Pennsylvania resident students, and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of twenty-eight million sixty-one thousand one hundred forty-six dollars (\$28,061,146) or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the trustees of Temple University at Philadelphia for the fiscal year of July 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968, for the following purposes and in the amounts as shown:

(1) For the general maintenance of all schools, departments, divisions, offices, and services of the university, with the exception of the School of Medicine, including repairs and improvements to the grounds and buildings, service of light, heat, power, water, and sewage disposal, salaries and wages, materials, supplies equipment, books and periodicals, insurance and interest, and such other expenditures as may be necessary and practicable, but the total sum of such expenditures shall not exceed fifteen million five hundred forty-eight thousand seven hundred sixty dollars (\$15,548,760).

(2) For a tuition supplement the sum of eight million seven hundred sixty-four thousand three hundred eighty-six dollars (\$8,764,386). The moneys so appropriated by this clause shall be applied by Temple University solely for the purpose of establishing for full-time Pennsylvania resident students in all schools and divisions of the university, with the exception of the School of Medicine, a uniform tuition and fee rate of four hundred fifty dollars (\$450), and establishing an undergraduate credit-hour rate of fourteen dollars (\$14) and a graduate credit-hour rate of sixteen dollars (\$16) for part-time Pennsylvania resident students, and for the purpose of establishing at the Ambler Campus and at all other extension campuses or centers of the university a uniform tuition and fee rate of three hundred ninety dollars (\$390) for full-time Pennsylvania resident students. The funds appropriated under this clause may be used by Temple University for the same purposes as tuition and fees received from students.

(3) For the general maintenance of the School of Medicine, including repairs and improvements to the grounds and buildings, service of light, heat, power, water, and sewage disposal, salaries and wages, materials, supplies, equipment, books and periodicals, insurance and interest, and such other expenditures as may be necessary and practicable, but the total sum of such expenditures shall not exceed three million three hundred ten thousand dollars (\$3,310,000).

(4) For a tuition supplement the sum of four hundred thirty-eight thousand dollars (\$438,000). The moneys so appropriated by this clause shall be applied by Temple University solely for the purpose of establishing for full-time Pennsylvania resident students in the School of Medicine a tuition and fee rate of four hundred fifty dollars (\$450). The moneys appropriated under this clause may be used by Temple University for the same purposes as tuition and fees received from students.

Section 2. It shall be a condition of this appropriation act that the tuition and fee rate charged to full-time students who are non-residents of Pennsylvania, in all schools and divisions of the university, shall be at least two and one-half the rate charged to full-time Pennsylvania resident students, during the academic year July 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968.

Section 3. Temple University shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than sixty days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, Temple University shall file with the General Assembly and with the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year. Such statement of expenditures shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Common-

wealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by Temple University to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth. In respect to expenditures made by the University from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning said expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require. As to the moneys appropriated for the purposes specified in section 1, clauses (2) and (4), the Auditor General shall determine that the required number of full-time Pennsylvania resident students have been charged the specified tuition rate, that the ratio of resident rates to nonresident rates prescribed by section 2 hereof have been maintained, and the bona fides of the residence of those claiming to be Pennsylvania residents.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 1967.

Making an appropriation to the Elwyn Institute at Elwyn in the County of Delaware, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and prescribing certain conditions upon which the appropriation will be available to the school.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of one million nine hundred eighty thousand dollars (\$1,980,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Elwyn Institute at Elwyn, Delaware County, Pennsylvania, for the maintenance of six hundred wards of the Commonwealth, at three thousand three hundred dollars (\$3,300), per capita for the fiscal year July 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968. This appropriation shall be available to pay the actual expense of maintenance of the wards of the Commonwealth at the institution, computed in accordance with generally recognized accounting standards approved by the Auditor General, but not in excess of the maximum amount per capita hereinabove provided. Absences or vacations of three weeks or less in any fiscal year shall not be deducted, but

any absences or vacations in excess of three weeks in any fiscal year shall be deducted.

Section 2. The appropriation made by this act is made on the condition that every mental defective admitted to the Elwyn Institute, after the effective date of this act, and who is a ward of the Commonwealth (1) shall be selected by the Department of Public Welfare from a list submitted from time to time to the department by the board of directors of the institution, and (2) shall have been previously investigated by the Department of Revenue for the purpose of determining the extent, if any, such mental defective, or those legally liable for his or her support, may be financially able to pay the cost of the maintenance of the person in the institute.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1967.

Making a deficiency appropriation to the Judicial Department for salaries of judges.

The sum of one thousand fifty dollars (\$1050), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Judicial Department for payment of the deficiency in the appropriation to the Judicial Department for the fiscal year July 1, 1966 to June 30, 1967, for the salaries of judges as provided in the act of June 1, 1956 (P. L. 1959), as amended.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

SB 1231

Making an appropriation to the Department of Justice for the payment of a claim of the United States against the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Findings of Fact.—On January 26, 1956, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania entered into a contract with the United States Department of Agriculture whereby the Department of Agriculture agreed to donate and the Commonwealth agreed to receive and distribute surplus food commodities, or cause their distribution to eligible, needy recipients.

On February 13, 1959 and March 25, 1960, the County Commissioners of Cambria County agreed with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to accept for distribution the surplus foods referred to above.

An audit was performed in June of 1960 by the United States Department of Agriculture on records of Cambria County's surplus food and as a result of said audit the Commonwealth was charged as liable for surplus foods wrongfully distributed to, or by, Cambria County recipients of the value of over two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) and the United States Department of Justice averred that over ninety thousand dollars (\$90,000) of said amount of unauthorized distribution was supported by the records of the Department of Public Welfare, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Monthly reports, as given by the County of Cambria to the Commonwealth, and in turn given by the Commonwealth to the United States Department of Agriculture, listed the number of persons receiving public assistance who were receiving surplus foods under the distribution program then in existence. The certification from the county to the Commonwealth, and in turn by the Commonwealth to the United States Department of Agriculture, indicated that over a thirty-one month period, on a monthly basis, approximately ninety six hundred persons received surplus foods. Said certification was erroneously and negligently given to the United States Department of Agriculture. In fact, during this period, approximately seventy-six hundred persons were receiving public assistance each month in said county, from the Pennsylvania Department of Public Welfare. Thus, surplus food was negligently distributed to approximately two thousand people who were not legally entitled thereto.

In May of 1964, the United States Government instituted suit at 8501 Civil Term of the Middle District of Pennsylvania, claiming damages in the sum of ninety thousand two hundred twenty-eight dollars and fifty seven cents (\$90,228.57) being the declared value of the surplus food distributed as a result of the said erroneous and negligent certification. On July 12, 1966, the Commonwealth caused the County of Cambria to be joined as an additional defendant in the said suit.

The United States Government has agreed to accept twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) in settlement of its suit and the County

of Cambria agreed to and has paid twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) of said settlement amount and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania has agreed to pay the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) in full settlement of all of the said claim against it.

Section 2. Appropriation.—The sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000), or as much thereof as is necessary, is appropriated to the Department of Justice for the purpose of making full settlement of the claim of the United States against the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania described in section 1 of this act.

Section 3. Effective Date.—This act shall take effect immediately.
