so that the project will conform to standards established by these departments.

The Department of Property and Supplies shall communicate its approval or disapproval of such plans and specifications to the Authority within ninety days after its receipt thereof. In the event of the disapproval of such plans and specifications within said ninety day period the Authority may submit other plans and specifications to the Department of Property and Supplies in which case the provisions hereof with respect to approval or disapproval shall apply thereto. The failure of the Department of Property and Supplies to communicate its approval or disapproval of such plans and specifications to the Authority within said ninety day period shall constitute its automatic approval thereof.

* * *

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

No. 156 AN ACT

HB 2071

Amending the act of March 17, 1899 (P. L. 10), entitled "An act authorizing the Department of Public Works, in cities of the second class, to appoint park patrolmen, making them subject to the control of such Department, and prescribing the powers of such patrolmen," changing the title of said appointees from park patrolmen to park police officers and granting to said appointees city-wide jurisdiction.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The title and sections 1, 2 and 3, act of March 17, 1899 (P. L. 10), entitled "An act authorizing the Department of Public Works, in cities of the second class, to appoint park patrolmen, making them subject to the control of such Department, and prescribing the powers of such patrolmen," are amended to read:

AN ACT

Authorizing the Department of [Public Works] <u>Parks and Recreation</u>, in cities of the second class, to appoint park [patrolmen] <u>policemen</u>, making them subject to the control of such Department and the Director of the Department of Public Safety, and prescribing the powers of such [patrolmen] park policemen.

SESSION OF 1968.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the Department of [Public Works] <u>Parks and Recreation</u>, in cities of the second class, shall have authority to employ [patrolmen for the performance of service] <u>park</u> <u>policemen whose primary duty shall be police service</u> in the public parks.

Section 2. The employment, care, management, administration and supervision of the ¹ affairs of such [patrolmen] <u>park police officers</u> shall be confided to the Department of [Public Works] <u>Parks and</u> <u>Recreation and such park policemen, while performing their duties in</u> <u>the public parks, shall be under the authority of the Director of the</u> <u>Department of Parks and Recreation and while performing duties out-</u> <u>side the confines of the public parks shall be under the authority of</u> the Director of the Department of Public Safety.

Section 3. Such [patrolmen] <u>park police officers</u> shall have [in the parks,] the same power in preserving the peace, maintaining order and making arrests, as [policemen] <u>regular police officers of the</u> Bureau of Police have in cities of the second class.

AN ACT

SB 1568

Amending the act of April 18, 1949 (P. L. 604), entitled "An act to promote the welfare of the people of the Commonwealth; creating a State Highway and Bridge Authority as a body corporate and politic with power to construct, reconstruct, improve, maintain, equip, furnish, and operate highway and bridge projects, and roadside rests, and to lease the same, and to fix and collect fees, rentals, and charges for the use thereof; authorizing and regulating the issuance of bonds by said Authority, and providing for the payment of such bonds, and the rights of the holders thereof; and to enter into agreements with the Government of the United States or any Federal agency; and authorizing the Department of Highways to grant, assign, convey, or lease to the Authority lands, easements, or rights of way of the Commonwealth and interests therein, and to acquire lands therefor; authorizing said Authority and the Department of Highways to enter into agreements providing for mutual cooperation in furtherance of the construction of any project hereby authorized; granting the right of eminent domain; empowering said Authority to sell and convey projects and property to the Com-
