HB 2731

Authorizing the Department of Property and Supplies to contract and incur debt for payment of the Commonwealth's share of projects expanding and extending municipal sewage systems to the State institutions at Cresson.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The Department of Property and Supplies is hereby authorized to enter into contracts in an amount not exceeding two hundred sixty-one thousand two hundred two dollars (\$261,202), payable during the fiscal years beginning July 1, 1968 and ending June 30, 1971, for the payment to the Borough of Cresson to cover the Commonwealth's share of projects expanding and extending municipal sewage systems to the State institutions at Cresson. In no event shall the Commonwealth's share be more than thirty-five percent of the projects' costs, such projects' costs to be exclusive of Federal contributions.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1968.

Designating a certain bridge in Allegheny County as the Robert D. Fleming Bridge.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The bridge crossing the Allegheny River at Sixtysecond Street in Allegheny County, which connects the Borough of Sharpsburg to the City of Pittsburgh, presently known as the Sixty-second Street Bridge, is hereby officially designated and shall be known as the "Robert D. Fleming Bridge."

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

Amending the act of August 9, 1955 (P. L. 323), entitled "An act relating to counties of the third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth classes; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," increasing the sum of money county commissioners may pay to the county historical society.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 1929, act of August 9, 1955 (P. L. 323), known as "The County Code," amended May 31, 1957 (P. L. 242), is amended to read:

Section 1929. Payment to Historical Societies.—The board of commissioners may pay, out of the county funds not otherwise appropriated, a sum of money not exceeding [three thousand dollars (\$3,000)] six thousand dollars (\$6,000) annually to the county his-

torical society, to assist in paying the running expenses thereof. If there is more than one such society in the county, such payment may be made only to the oldest society. Where any such society is comprised of residents of more than one county, the commissioners of said respective counties may jointly pay said sum in such proportion as they shall agree.

No such appropriation shall be renewed until vouchers have been filed with the commissioners showing that the appropriation for any prior year has been expended for the purpose herein designated.
