Section 2. Payments out of the appropriation of this act shall be made by the State Treasurer upon requisitions by the several departments, boards, commissions or officers in the same manner as payments are ordinarily made.

Section 3. All amounts paid by the State Treasurer in accordance with this act shall be charged against the appropriations made for the salaries and wages of the officers and employes and other ordinary and general expenses of the State government in the General Appropriation Act and other appropriation acts of 1969.

Making appropriations to the Department of Public Welfare and providing for certain allocations therefrom for the purpose of carrying out the Public Assistance Law for the year beginning July 1, 1969 and for the payment of assistance and expenses accrued or incurred prior to and remaining unpaid on June 30, 1969 and further providing for medical assistance.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

The sum of seventy-five million dollars (\$75,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Public Welfare for the payment of assistance and administrative expenses for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1969 and for the payment of assistance and administrative expenses incurred prior to and remaining unpaid June 30, 1969, as provided in the acts of June 24. 1937 (P. L. 2017, 2045 and 2051), April 23, 1941 (P. L. 20), May 10, 1951 (P. L. 279), July 13, 1953 (P. L. 431), August 9, 1955 (P. L. 323), the Public Welfare Code, The Fiscal Code, The Penal Code and the Public School Code of 1949. In addition to this amount, all moneys received from the Federal Government, or from any other source as contributions for this program, shall be paid into the General Fund and credited to this appropriation. The Department of Public Welfare shall allocate funds from time to time for administrative expenses of the several county boards of assistance, for such administrative expenses incurred by the department which are chargeable to such boards and for the payment of attorney's fees and court costs necessary for the proper conduct of the public assistance programs: Provided, That any rule or regulation adopted by the Secretary of Public Welfare during the fiscal year 1969-70 which adds to the cost of any public assistance program shall only be effective from and after the date upon which it is approved as to availability of funds by the Governor.

Section 2. The amounts paid for medical assistance payments, shall be based on the same income limits established and employed by the department in determining eligibility for medical assistance payments or services during the fiscal year 1968-69.

Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

The term "employes" as used in this act shall include all directors, superintendents, bureau or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists, engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries, auditors, inspectors, examiners, statisticians, marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers, and other assistants in any department, board or commission.

The term "expenses" and "maintenance" shall include all printing, binding and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies, traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage, telephone and telegraph rentals and toll charges, newspaper advertising and notices, fuel, light, heat, power and water, repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on workmen's compensation, insurance premiums on policies of liability insurance, premiums on medical payment insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on employe group life insurance, and employe and retired emplove group hospital and medical insurance, payment Commonwealth share of social security taxes for State employes, the purchase of replacement or additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of Property and Supplies of mileage charges for the use of automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside hospital: Provided, That in no case shall the State institution pay more for patient care than that provided under the State medical assistance program.

Section 7. Purchase of supplies, materials and equipment shall not be deemed to be committed or encumbered until contracts covering said purchase have been entered into with the vendors.

Section 8. In addition to the amounts appropriated by this act, moneys received in payment for food and household supplies furnished to employes and other persons, except inmates by an institution, and moneys received from the proceeds from the sale of any products of the soil, meats, livestock, timber or other materials sold by the department shall be paid into the General Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund to the several respective institutions for the operation and maintenance of said institutions.

Further in addition to the amounts appropriated by this act, all moneys received from the Federal Government, or from any other source as contributions for the programs provided herein, or as payment for services or materials furnished by one institution to another, except those collections designated as revenues, shall be paid into the General Fund

and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund for the purposes of the respective appropriations.

Section 9. That part of all appropriations in this act unexpended, uncommitted and unencumbered as of June 30, 1970 shall automatically lapse as of that date.

Section 10. The provisions of this act shall be severable. If any provision of this act is found by a court of record to be unconstitutional and void, the remaining provisions of the act shall, nevertheless, remain valid unless the court finds the valid provisions of the law are so essentially inseparably connected with and depend upon the void provision that it cannot be presumed the General Assembly would have enacted the remaining valid provisions without the void one, or unless the court finds the remaining valid provisions standing alone are incompleted and are incapable of being executed in accordance with the legislative intent.

Section 11. This act shall take effect July 1, 1969.

- Section 1. The following sums are hereby appropriated for the periods and the purposes specified from moneys in the Land and Water Development Fund derived from the issuance and sale of bonds and notes pursuant to the act of January 19, 1968 (1967 P. L. 996), known as "The Land and Water Conservation and Reclamation Act":
- (1) The sum of forty million dollars (\$40,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for two fiscal years beginning July 1, 1969, to the Department of Mines and Mineral Industries for the purposes specified in clause (1) of section 16 of the act.
- (2) The sum of forty million dollars (\$40,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for two fiscal years beginning July 1, 1969, to the Department of Health for the purposes specified in clause (2) of section 16 of the act: Provided, That expenditures during these two fiscal years shall not exceed twenty million dollars (\$20,000,000) in accordance with subsection (c) of section 16 of the act.
- (3) The sum of twenty-five million dollars (\$25,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for two fiscal years beginning July 1, 1969, to the Department of Forests and Waters, Fish and Game Commissions and Historical and Museum Commissions for the purposes specified in clause (3) of section 16 of the act.
- (4) The sum of fifteen million dollars (\$15,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for two fiscal years beginning July 1, 1969, to the Department of Community Affairs for the purposes specified in clause (4) of section 16 of the act.

The sum of seven thousand nine hundred dollars (\$7,900), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated out of the Korean Conflict Veterans' Compensation Fund to the Board of Finance and Revenue for the fiscal year July 1, 1969 to June 30, 1970, for the payment of the compensation to the Commonwealth's Loan and Transfer Agent for services rendered in connection with the registration transfer and payment of interest on Korean Conflict Veterans' Compensation Fund bonds and for other services required to be performed by the said Loan and Transfer Agent. Payments from such appropriation shall be made at such time and in such amounts and upon such basis as may be provided by law or agreed upon between the Board of Finance and Revenue and said Loan and Transfer Agent.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1969.

AN ACT

HB 1720

Making an appropriation to the Secretary of the Senate and the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives for the purchase of Pennsylvania flags to be sent to residents of Pennsylvania serving in the armed forces of the United States, overseas.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for the fiscal year July 1, 1969 to June 30, 1970 to the Secretary of the Senate and the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives, for the purchase of Pennsylvania flags to be sent to residents of Pennsylvania serving in the armed forces of the United States, overseas, who request such flags. The appropriation made by this act shall be in addition to any other appropriation made to such persons and for such purposes during the same fiscal year.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

SB 864

Making an appropriation to the Department of Military Affairs from restricted revenue in the Motor License Fund to be used by the Pennsylvania Aeronautics Commission for the encouragement and development of aeronautics.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

The sum of one million nine hundred ninety-four thousand Section 1. dollars (\$1.994.000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated from the restricted revenue account for aviation fuel taxes in the Motor License Fund to the Department of Military Affairs for the fiscal period July 1, 1969 to June 30, 1970, to be used by the Pennsylvania Aeronautics Commission for the encouragement and development of aeronautics, for the development and maintenance of State airports, for assistance to political subdivisions and municipal authorities of the Commonwealth in the construction and improvement of airports and other aeronautical facilities, including the making of surveys and plans and the necessary construction work and equipment: Provided, however, That no more shall be expended from this item for such purposes or any of them than may be required to match an equal sum contributed by any political subdivision or municipal authority of the Commonwealth or by the Federal Government, or by a political subdivision or municipal authority and the Federal Government as provided in the act of May 2, 1947 (P. L. 136), entitled "An act relating to Federal aid to political subdivision or municipality authority for the development of public airports."

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1969.
