Amending the act of April 29, 1959 (P.L.58), entitled "An act consolidating and revising the Vehicle Code, the Tractor Code, the Motor Vehicle Financial Responsibility Act and other acts relating to the ownership, possession and use of vehicles and tractors," further providing for signals and investigations by officers.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Subsection (a) of section 1221, act of April 29, 1959 (P.L.58), known as "The Vehicle Code," is amended to read:

Section 1221. Signals and Investigations by Officers.—

(a) The operator of any vehicle or [, except in any city of the first class,] any pedestrian charged with a violation of any summary provisions of this act, shall stop upon request or signal of any peace officer, who shall be in uniform, and shall exhibit his badge or other sign of authority, and shall, upon request, exhibit his registration card, or operator's license card, or learner's permit, or other means of identification if a pedestrian, and shall write his name in the presence of such peace officer, if so required for the purpose of establishing his identity.

* * *

Penalty.—Any person failing to comply with the signals or requests of peace officers or department employes, as provided in this section, shall, upon summary conviction before a magistrate, be sentenced to pay a fine of ten dollars (\$10.00) and costs of prosecution, and, in default of the payment thereof, shall undergo imprisonment for not more than five (5) days.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
