HB 2343

Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90), entitled "An act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession, consumption, importation, transportation; furnishing, holding in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores, for the payment of certain license fees to the respective municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures; providing for local option, and repealing existing laws," increasing the maximum amount of wine which may be produced and sold by limited wineries.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The definition of "Limited Winery" in section 102 and section 505.2, act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90), known as the "Liquor Code," added July 31, 1968 (Act No. 272), are amended to read:

Section 102. Definitions.—The following words or phrases, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section:

"Limited Winery" shall mean a winery with a maximum output of **[fifty thousand (50,000)] one hundred thousand (100,000)** gallons per year.

* * *

Section 505.2. Limited Wineries.—Holders of a limited winery license may:

(1) Produce table wines only from grapes grown in Pennsylvania in an amount not to exceed **[fifty thousand (50,000)] one hundred thousand (100,000)** gallons per year.

(2) Sell wine produced by the limited winery on the licensed premises, under such conditions and regulations as the board may enforce, to the Liquor Control Board, to individuals and to hotel, restaurant, club and public-service liquor licensees.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
