Amending the act of January 8, 1952 (P.L.1844), entitled "An act to designate the several judicial districts of the Commonwealth, as required by the Constitution, and to provide for the election and commissioning of judges learned in the law for the said districts," conforming the same to existing law and further providing for the composition of the thirty-ninth and fifty-first judicial districts.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. As much as pertains to the thirty-ninth and fifty-first judicial districts in section 1, act of January 8, 1952 (P.L.1844), entitled "An act to designate the several judicial districts of the Commonwealth, as required by the Constitution, and to provide for the election and commissioning of judges learned in the law for the said districts," as affected by the act of July 31, 1968 (Act No. 251), entitled "An act to provide for an additional law judge of the court of common pleas in the thirty-ninth judicial district," is amended to read:

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the judicial districts of the Commonwealth shall be numbered, composed, designated, and shall each have the number of judges, respectively, as follows:

* * *

The thirty-ninth district, of the [county] counties of Franklin and Fulton, and shall have [one judge] two judges learned in the law.

* * *

The fifty-first district, of the [counties] county of Adams [and Fulton], and shall have one judge learned in the law.

* * *

And in all cases where a county is or shall be attached to a contiguous district, the qualified voters of said county shall be entitled to vote for the judge or judges.

Section 2. This act shall take effect thirty days after the advice and consent

Section 2. This act shall take effect thirty days after the advice and consent of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania is given by order of the court.
