Amending the act of June 24, 1939 (P.L.872), entitled "An act to consolidate, amend and revise the penal laws of the Commonwealth," changing the penalty for injuring plants, trees, grains, etc.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 932, act of June 24, 1939 (P.L.872), known as "The Penal Code," is amended to read:

Section 932. Injuring Plants, Trees, Grains, etc.—Whoever wilfully enters or breaks down, through or over any land, orchard, garden or yard, fence, hotbed or greenhouse, or who wrongfully clubs, stones, cuts, breaks, barks, or otherwise mutilates or damages any nut, fruit, shade, timber or other trees, shrub, bush, plant or vine, trellis, arbor, hotbed, hot or greenhouse, or who wilfully trespasses upon, walks over, beats down, tramples or in any way injures any grain, grass, vines, vegetables or other growing crops, [is guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be sentenced to pay a fine not exceeding three hundred dollars (\$300), or undergo imprisonment not exceeding six (6) months, or both.] shall, upon summary conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500), or to undergo imprisonment for not more than three (3) months, or both.
