All amounts paid by the State Treasurer in accordance with this act shall be charged against the appropriations made for the salaries and wages of the officers and employes and other ordinary and general expenses of the State government in the General Appropriation Act and other appropriation acts of 1971.

Section 4. The funds appropriated in section 1 of this act shall be used solely for providing for the programs in existence during the fiscal year 1970-1971, which programs shall not be expanded beyond the 1970-1971 level, and expenditures shall be maintained at the same level as during the fiscal year 1970-1971.

Section 5. In addition to the amount appropriated by this act, all moneys received from the Federal Government or from any other source as contributions to or payments for the programs provided herein-shall be paid into the General Fund to the appropriation for the purposes and programs intended.

The following sums are hereby appropriated for the periods and purposes specified from moneys in the Land and Water Development Fund derived from the issuance and sale of bonds and notes pursuant to the act of January 19, 1968 (P.L.996), known as "The Land and Water Conservation and Reclamation Act":
- (1) The sum of forty million dollars (\$40,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for two fiscal years beginning July 1, 1971, to the Department of Environmental Resources for the purposes specified in clause (1) of subsection (a) of section 16 of the act.
- (2) The sum of twenty million dollars (\$20,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for two fiscal years beginning July 1, 1971 to the Department of Environmental Resources for the purposes specified in clause (2) of subsection (a) of section 16 of the act including related planning.
- (3) The sum of twenty-five million dollars (\$25,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for two fiscal years beginning July 1, 1971, to the Department of Environmental Resources, Fish and Game Commissions and Historical and Museum Commission for the purposes specified in clause (3) of subsection (a) of section 16 of the act.
- (4) The sum of fifteen million dollars (\$15,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for two fiscal years beginning July 1, 1971, to the Department of Community Affairs for the purposes specified in clause (4) of subsection (a) of section 16 of the act.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1971.

The sum of [one hundred twenty-one thousand dollars (\$121,000)] two hundred forty-two thousand dollars (\$242,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Downingtown Industrial and Agricultural School at Downingtown, Pennsylvania, for [the first eight months of] the fiscal year July 1, 1970 to June 30, 1971 for the purpose of maintenance of the school.

The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or appointed officers and employes of the Commonwealth, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1971 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1971.

To the Department of Transportation

For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the proper administration of the Department of Transportation. including planning and research, engineering, right-of-way, highway construction, special construction, maintenance, service functions and transportation safety\$327,000,000

Section 1. Section 1, act of June 30, 1971 (Appropriation Act No. 7-A), entitled "An act making appropriations to the Department of Public Welfare and providing for certain allocations therefrom for the purpose of carrying out the Public Assistance Law for the year beginning July 1, 1971 and for the payment of assistance and expenses accrued or incurred prior to and remaining unpaid on June 30, 1971," is amended to read:

The sum of [fifty-six million six hundred thousand dollars (\$56,600,000)] one hundred million dollars (\$100,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Public Welfare for the payment of assistance and administrative expenses for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1971 and for the payment of assistance and administrative expenses incurred prior to and remaining unpaid June 30, 1971, as provided in the act of June 24, 1937 (P.L.2017), the act of June 24, 1937 (P.L.2045) and the act of May 10. 1951 (P.L.279), July 13, 1953 (P.L.431), August 9, 1955 (P.L.323), the Public Welfare Code, The Fiscal Code, The Penal Code and the Public School Code of 1949. AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the State Treasurer for the purpose of paying salaries and wages of State officers and employes and other ordinary and general expenses in the interim between June 30, 1971 and [August] September 1, 1971, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1971 and for a further temporary period.

Section 1. The sum of [one hundred sixty million dollars (\$160,000,000)] two hundred million dollars (\$200,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the State Treasurer of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for the purpose of paying the salaries and wages of the officers and employes and other ordinary and general expenses of the State government in the interim between June 30, 1971 and [August] September 1, 1971, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1971. The funds provided by this act may be used for all preferred appropriations of 1970-1971 but shall not be used for payment of public assistance, for payment of grants under the Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency, for payment of basic instruction subsidy or for payment of appropriations to charitable or educational institutions not under the absolute control of the Commonwealth.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
