## AN ACT

SB 157

Amending the act of June 24, 1939 (P.L.872), entitled "An act to consolidate, amend and revise the penal laws of the Commonwealth," applying penalties for wilful false information concerning bombs to private homes, residences, offices or buildings and making such offense a felony.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 329, act of June 24, 1939 (P.L.872), known as "The Penal Code," amended May 5, 1965 (P.L.41), is amended to read:

Section 329. False Information Concerning Bombs.—Any person who furnishes any false information to a police officer or to any appointed or elected official or to any employe of any political subdivision of this Commonwealth or to any official or employe of any public, private or parochial school, railroad or railroad depot or station, theatre or other place of assembly, or to any person residing in, occupying, or employed in any private home, residence, office or building, concerning the placement or setting of a bomb or other explosive, knowing the same to be false, is guilty of a [misdemeanor] felony, and shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine not to exceed five thousand dollars (\$5000) or undergo imprisonment not to exceed five years, or both.
