## AN ACT

HB 1263

Amending the act of May 25, 1935 (P.L.1050), entitled "An act creating and establishing a fund for the care, maintenance, and relief of aged, retired and disabled employes of the bureau of fire in cities of the second class; creating a board for the management thereof; providing the mode and manner of payment to beneficiaries, and for the care and disposition of its funds; and providing for the transfer and payment of all moneys and securities in existing funds in similar boards superseded by the fund and board herein created," providing for supplemental benefits.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 12, act of May 25, 1933 (P.L.1050), entitled "An act creating and establishing a fund for the care, maintenance, and relief of aged, retired and disabled employes of the bureau of fire in cities of the second class; creating a board for the management thereof; providing the mode and manner of payment to beneficiaries, and for the care and disposition of its funds; and providing for the transfer and payment of all moneys and securities in existing funds in similar boards superseded by the fund and board herein created," is amended by adding a subsection to read:

Section 12. \* \* \*

- (c) Beneficiaries under the fund who have retired prior to December 31, 1965, shall be paid an additional sum of fifteen dollars (\$15) per month.
  - Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- Section 12.5. In addition to the other benefits provided by this act the city council is authorized by ordinance to adopt a plan of paying to widows of deceased firemen, not otherwise covered under this act, a monthly award of such amount as the council may from time to time determine and may further appropriate from the city's general fund sufficient amounts to make such further awards.
  - Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
