## AN ACT

## HB 1445

Amending the act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.103), entitled "An act concerning townships of the second class; and amending, revising, consolidating, and changing the law relating thereto," changing the penalty for destroying, removing, injuring or defacing signs.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 1161, act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.103), known as "The Second Class Township Code," reenacted and amended July 10, 1947 (P.L.1481), is amended to read:

Section 1161. Penalty for Destroying, Et Cetera.—It shall be unlawful for any person to wilfully destroy, remove, injure, or deface any guidepost or sign or index board erected upon or near any public street, road, or bridge by the supervisors, or by any club, association, or other organized body for the direction, guidance, or safety of travelers. Any person violating this section shall, upon conviction in a summary proceeding, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than [twenty-five dollars] fifty dollars, with costs of prosecution, together with the value of such sign so destroyed, removed or defaced, and in default of such payment, shall be sentenced to imprisonment of not more than ten days. All fines and money so imposed and collected shall be paid to the township treasurer.
