## AN ACT

SB 1208

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177), entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative officers, and of the several administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and commissions shall be determined," providing for health clinics in unused portions of tuberculosis sanatoria in cities of the first class.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 2107, act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177), known as "The Administrative Code of 1929," amended April 4, 1956 (P.L.1394), is amended by adding a subsection to read:

Section 2107. Tuberculosis Sanatoria.—The Department of Health shall have the power, and its duty shall be:

\* \* \*

(c) To utilize any unused portion of tuberculosis sanatoria in cities of the first class as health care clinics.
