AN ACT

HB 1662

Amending the act of June 24, 1931 (P.L.1206), entitled "An act concerning townships of the first class; amending, revising, consolidating, and changing the law relating thereto," reducing certain age requirements.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 639, act of June 24, 1931 (P.L.1206), known as "The First Class Township Code," reenacted and amended May 27, 1949 (P.L.1955) and amended March 28, 1968 (P.L.74), is amended to read:

Section 639. Age; Applicant's Residence.—No person shall be eligible to apply for examination unless he is more than [twenty-one] eighteen years of age at the date of application. The commissioners may, at their option, accept applications from non-residents of the township and may, by ordinance, require non-resident policemen and firemen to become residents of the township after appointment to such positions.
