## AN ACT

HB 1666

Amending the act of April 6, 1956 (P.L.1429), entitled "An act providing for and regulating the licensing of poultry technicians by the Secretary of Agriculture for the drawing of blood from poultry to be used in pullorum testing programs," reducing certain age requirements.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 2, act of April 6, 1956 (P.L.1429), entitled "An act providing for and regulating the licensing of poultry technicians by the Secretary of Agriculture for the drawing of blood from poultry to be used in pullorum testing programs," is amended to read:

Section 2. Every applicant for licensure as a poultry technician shall furnish evidence that he is at least [twenty-one] eighteen years of age, a citizen of the United States, or has legally declared his intention to become such, is of good moral character, has completed at least eight years of education in a public, parochial or private school, or its equivalent, as evaluated by the Department of Public Instruction, and has satisfactorily completed a course of training in poultry blood-testing as prescribed by the Department of Agriculture.
